As Christians, we know we must spend time in His Word through our daily devotions and through Bible study. And we also know we need to spend time with other Christians in fellowship through weekly worship services. We know we gain many benefits from being in a Share Group with other believers to encourage us and pray with us through life's many challenges, to support us in our individual calls to discipleship and in our various ministry areas at home, at church, at work, and in our community.

My Share Group has always been there for me, for example, in my hospital stay when I had 7 blockages in my arteries around my heart including a 100% blockage in the "widow-maker" artery!

The only reason I am here today is because the Lord needed me to do some important things and He knew I would procrastinate. The Lord generated capillaries that enabled my heart to survive without a heart attack. My cardiologist told me that capillaries are only generated in about 15% of people, so I was very fortunate that the Lord to spare me. Riding to the hospital for my surgery I felt a tremendous calm and peace come over me as I believed that the Lord would not waste capillaries around my blockage only to have me die on the operating table.

My Share Group came to the hospital before my surgery and stayed and prayed with my wife Susan and family throughout my surgery, and brought meals during my stay to my family and 6-month recovery and rehabilitation time.
