A message from the Spiritual Director

"Now you are no longer a slave but God's own child. And since you are his child, God has made you his heir." Galatians 4:7 NLT

Paul says - life before you gave it over to Jesus was like being in slavery.

Look at the definition of slavery:

*The condition in which one person is owned as property by another and is under the owner's control, especially in involuntary servitude.

- *The practice of owning slaves.
- *A mode of production in which slaves constitute the principal workforce.

Have you ever looked at your life before a relationship with Jesus as slavery? People often say I was a sinner saved by grace and that's true! However, I rarely, if ever, have heard someone call themselves a 'slave' before believing in Christ.

Yet, that's what we are without the redeeming love of Christ living inside of our hearts. Christ did for us what we could not do for ourselves - break the chains of sin and slavery!

I and three ladies from my church recently returned from a two-week missionary trip to Bangkok, Thailand. We were there to learn about and minister with Nightlight, a 16-year-old ministry in the 'Red Light District of Bangkok'. This ministry has helped many Thai and African women get free from sex trafficking (slavery) and safely back to their homes.

A woman named Victoria, approximately 30 years old, was one of five women baptized while we were serving there! She was half Thai and half Indian, born into slavery with no identity or birth certificate. She was someone's property.

Thailand is mostly Buddhist and also worships many other gods.

Today, I give thanks to the Lord for working through NightLight Ministries, Victoria is no longer a slave, physically or spiritually! She has a job and an apartment of her own!

Victoria was introduced to Jesus and over time has realized He is the real deal! To witness her baptism was amazing! She is free from the darkness of her past and now knows she's an HEIR to King Jesus!!



How about you and me? Are we done with willful sin which makes us slaves to darkness?

Do we SEEK TO LIVE and obey our Heavenly Father like an HEIR in Christ's Kingdom of Light?

I pray that daily we remember the Cross of Christ, then pick up OUR cross and FOLLOW HIM.

Now is the time to start making table agape for the June and July walks! Here are a few FAQ's:

How much Agape should I make? Make at least 60 pieces—enough for the pilgrims and the team. It is a good idea to make extra in case of breakage.

How should I package my Agape? Label your container/package with the number of pieces. Don't put your name on agape as these gifts are to represent God's love and therefore we should remain anonymous (this does not include letters).

Can I determine where/when Agape will be used?

The Agape Chair will accept your suggestions, but please understand that they have the final say as to where and when your Agape is used. Be sure to label your container/package for the walk, day, or time you have in mind to have this Agape.

What should I make? Make it colorful and keep it light and inexpensive. Useful is nice.

What happens to leftover Agape? Any leftovers are taken to the next Gathering for the makers to pick up.

What about a special Agape for a pilgrim I am sponsoring? Personal letters for Sunday are wonderful, but save books and other gifts for the ride home from the walk.

What about food Agape? If you pilgrim has special dietary needs, your help in meeting those needs is appreciated, but not required.

Where do I leave Agape? You may leave it at Sponsor's Hour, with any Agape team member, or in the Agape room at Sulphur Grove (signs will be posted).

We of GDE are one body in Christ, with many parts and many different talents. Since we are one body; a walk weekend is a community event not just a team event.

Therefore, I would like to share a few reminders as we prepare for the upcoming summer walks and the big move to Sulphur Grove UMC.

Last date for pilgrim applications. We will take pilgrim applications any time, but the cutoff date for Men's Walk 71 is June 6. This is to give proper time for sponsors, supply, kitchen, and housing to prepare.

FROM STEVE HOLMES VICE CHAIR/MEN'S REGISTRAR

Sponsorship training is offered prior to each Gathering at 6:30.

Serving during the weekends. It takes the entire community to put on a weekend. Please see the sign-up sheets at Gathering or online (see next newsletter or Facebook) to sign-up to serve with housing needs, kitchen help, and the agape room.

Prayer Vigil. Our walk weekends are bathed in prayer, before, during, and after. I would encourage everyone who is able, to sign up for a spot on the prayer vigil.

Fees. Beginning with the women's walk in July, fees are being increased. Team fees will increase from \$65 to \$90 and pilgrim fees will increase from \$85 to \$125.

Bedding. GDE no longer provides foam pads for sleeping from housing. We are asking pilgrims and/or their sponsors to provide a twin-size air mattress. If a pilgrim cannot provide one, we have a few to share. Contact the registrars.
