I am thankful for the support of our Emmaus Community. We have had four Emmaus walks this year and I am thankful for the churches that support us and give us a place to hold our walks -- Normandy UMC and Sulphur Grove UMC.

It is amazing that our Emmaus Community has been around for 30 plus years and is still going strong. We have a great group of people who serve on our Greater Dayton Emmaus Board of Directors to help make decisions for our Emmaus Walks, Gatherings, and ways to help our community continue to grow.

Please keep in mind it takes a lot of folks to make an Emmaus walk weekend happen. It takes the support of the community to volunteer, sponsor pilgrims and serve on live-in teams.

We have set a deadline to have walk applications turned in or mailed in to the PO Box by December 23rd 2023.

We do not want to cancel the men's walk, but we have set this deadline to give our registrar time to get information to the Kitchen and Supply folks so they can order food and supplies for the walk weekend.

On Being Grateful

"...give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus." 1 Thessalonians 5:18

The church is filled with all kinds of ministries. From those who serve as ushers to the choir to deacons, teachers, preachers, and more, there is much to do in the role of ministry.


