From the Community Lay Director

Greetings Friends!

Were you in attendance at the September 12th Gathering at Normandy? The Holy Spirit was there big time as we worshipped our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ! He filled all 90 or so of us with excitement, His Spirit, and with a renewed enthusiasm for His Emmaus ministry. There were many who came from our recent Summer Walks -- including many of the pilgrims, now members of the Community, their team, and many short- and long-time members of the Community who share a refreshing love for Jesus Christ. Come join the excitement and bring your Share Group, your friends, and those you are talking to about going on their own Walk to Emmaus.

As we build momentum for the next two walks in January and February 2023, we need your help. Please continue to invite and talk to those 2 or 3 close friends, your church leaders, etc about the benefits you found on your own Emmaus Walk ...how Christ met you right where you were at the time of your Walk, how He further deepened your personal walk and journey with Him, how your Walk helped you to further develop your personal call to discipleship, how you renewed your personal commitment and active support to your various church or your community's ministries, and how you have prioritized your life to the Lord, your family, your church, your work and more.

Ask your pastor to let you give your 2-minute testimony to your congregation on an upcoming Sunday this month or next month and how you would be honored to sponsor someone. We also need your help in expanding the number of Share Groups in the Greater Dayton area so pilgrims of future walks will have a better opportunity to find a group near where they live. If you are also looking for a Share Group, you can contact the Table Leader from your original Walk, or one or two people from your table or from your church or new friends from your Walk to form a new Share Group, or join an existing Share Group. Your Emmaus Community is here to help you and your church to develop leaders for the Church by helping build a community of disciples that can draw others to Christ. Please consider the following:

a. Answer the Call of your local church for renewed involvement in your church's ministries and activities.

b. If you are not already in a Share Group, find or start a group where you can continue to develop your personal relationship with Jesus Christ and your own personal discipleship, support other members in the group with the growth in their discipleship, and receive support from the other members as each shares their closest to Christ moments, their call to discipleship, and where they struggle and sometimes stumble in daily life to be Christ to others.

Harvest Time

I planted the seed, Apollos watered it, but God has been making it grow. So neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but only God, who makes things grow. The one who plants and the one who waters have one purpose, and they will each be rewarded according to their own labor. 1 Corinthians 3:6-8 (NIV)

Fall, that time of year of changing temperatures, where weather gets colder, the leaves of the trees begin changing colors, plants stop making food, animals are getting ready for the long months ahead, and daylight becomes shorter. Fall is also a season of harvest, the time where the dutiful begin to gather all of the edible parts of the seeds that they had planted. It is a time where all of the hard work that was put into fertilizing the soil, providing it with the right amount of water to promote growth, and making sure the climate was right while continually monitoring it to prevent the possibility of disease or pests; it is now the time to reap the harvest. Everything you did during planting season is what provides the best possibility for a good crop. We can learn a lot from fall.

The past two plus years have been tough. But there were some seeds planted well before a pandemic came to threaten our land. Some of those seeds were planted well, in good ground and they were not destroyed by the threat of plague. Somehow, they were able to grow, to resist the disease that sought to threaten their health and destroy them. It was the relentless gardeners, leaders, the shepherds if you will that refused to let die what had been planted. They chose other methods and ways of watering and providing light and the right climate, continually monitoring the sheep to ensure they were getting what was necessary for spiritual growth. They found alternative methods to provide what was needed; the internet, outdoor studies, taping of services, parking lot meetings and more. They refused to let die what had been planted.



Now, we have an opportunity to continually water that seed of faith that was placed in the hearts of believers. As we have started and will continue to ramp up walk weekends, we must do our part to continue to feed and provide nourishment to those who are hungry for more of God. There are so many ways to serve, and God wants and expects us to use the giftings He has given us to do so.

God is still alive and working in the hearts of His people. Let's never forget the love He has given and shown each of us as we continue to serve Him faithfully. Let us continue to water the seeds of faith so that God will reap the harvest; "A man reaps what he sows. The one who sows to please his sinful nature, from that nature will reap destruction; the one who sows to please the Spirit, from the Spirit will reap eternal life. Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up." Galatians 6:8b-9 (NIV)

Emmaus Ministries is hosting a Wellness Walk with all proceeds going toward the Fourth Day Fund (the operations fund) for Emmaus Ministries, which continues to recover from losses incurred during the pandemic.

Get physically and spiritually fit while walking the distance between Jerusalem and Emmaus (approximately 7 miles/11.5 kilometers/14,000 steps) as the first disciples did in Luke 24.

The Wellness Walk takes place October 1-November 12, which gives you six weeks to go the distance.

You can walk as an individual—at your own time and pace—or as a team (either virtually or in person) with your Emmaus community. You can select your Community team at registration from the pulldown menu.

"Footprint" points are earned for steps, spiritual practices, and other activities that lead to physical and spiritual wellness. A leaderboard will track points for individuals and communities. Prizes will be awarded to top communities and top individuals who score the most footprints, so please get your community members involved. See all the details at the Wellness Walk site.
