

As the year draws to a close, we wanted to reach out to make you aware of a few updates and remind you of needed items for the upcoming tax season to ensure a smooth and easy tax filing experience for you!

Corporate Transparency Act

You should have received info via email from us regarding the new CTA filing requirement in November.

It has been a rollercoaster since then, first it was temporarily on hold because of a new lawsuit brought in Texas. Then on December 23 it was again required to be filed by year-end. Then on December 26, it was back to no requirement, just an optional filing.

SO, as of December 26, there is no requirement to file. Keep posted for any future updates!

Changes on the Horizon

Unless Congress takes action, 2024 and 2025 are the final two years before tax laws roll back to those in place in 2017. We are keeping this on our radar and will communicate changes and updates throughout the year.

2024

Key Documents:

- W-2 for wages
- W-2G for gambling
- 1099-Int for interest
- 1099-DIV for dividends
- 1099-B Brokerage accts
- 1099-K for income:

Many of you will receive one this year for things like eBay or Facebook Marketplace sales, and sometimes for simple cash transfers using a cash between friend's app such as Zelle, Cash-App or Venmo. \$5,000 or more requires reporting.

- SSA-1099 Social Security
- 1098-T for tuition
- 1099-SA for HSA's
- 1099-NEC for income
- 1099-Misc for income
- 1098-Int for mortgages
- 1099-R for retirement
- 1099-G for refunds & unemployment

Watch out!

Tax season is also tax scam season for savvy criminals.

Remember the IRS **DOES NOT** initiate contact by email, or request personal or financial information by email. Typically they initiate contact by mail.
