Nigeria Visa Classes

SHORT STAY VISAS

Short Visit Visas allow travelers to visit Nigeria for a period not exceeding three months (90 days) for the purpose of visit, tourism, business meeting, conference, seminar, contract negotiation, marketing, sales, purchase, distribution of Nigerian goods, Trade Fairs, job interview, sports, entertainment, study tour, academic exchange program, humanitarian services, relief/emergency works, and temporary work permits. However, all short visit visa available on e-Visa Classes are not extendable.

A single-entry, 30-day visa for tourism and sightseeing in Nigeria. Applicants must have a valid passport, return ticket, evidence of accommodation and bank statement to show sufficient funds. It is strictly for leisure and does not allow work or extensions. Minors also need parental consent documents.

TOURIST VISA REQUIREMENTS/APPLICATION GUIDELINES TO NIGERIA

Tourism Visa – F5A

Purpose: A single-entry type of visa granted to persons who wish to visit Nigeria for the purpose of tourism.

Eligibility: Citizens of all countries except ECOWAS member States and other countries which Nigeria has entered into visa abolition/waiver agreements (non-ECOWAS nationals).

Requirements

- Valid Passport (not less than 6 months validity).
- Passport size photo.
- Evidence of return ticket.
- Evidence of Hotel Reservations or host address in Nigeria.
- Evidence of sufficient funds (180 days Bank Statement).
- Minors below 18 years (accompanied by an adult) must provide birth certificate and parental consent letter.

Steps to Obtain

1. Gather Documentation.
2. Apply online (e-Visa).
 - <https://evisa.immigration.gov.ng/>
3. Upload visa requirements and pay visa fees.
4. Obtain Visa.

Validity: 90 days from issuance.

Extendable: No.

Stay duration: 30 days, single entry within visa validity.

Restrictions: No employment. Permitted for tourism only.

Family/Group Applications: Group and family applications for up to 10 persons.

IMMUNIZATION RECOMMENDATIONS FOR MISSION TRIP PREPARATION

Required vaccinations

- Yellow Fever: All travelers aged 9 months or older must show proof of Yellow Fever vaccination to enter Nigeria. It is highly recommended to get this shot at least 10 days before your trip.
- Routine Vaccines: You must be up to date on all routine vaccinations normally received in the USA, including:
 - Measles-Mumps-Rubella (MMR): Rising measles cases globally make this especially important.
 - Diphtheria-Tetanus-Pertussis (Tdap): Recommended
 - Polio: The CDC recommends all adult travelers to Nigeria receive a single, lifetime booster dose of inactivated polio vaccine.

Recommended vaccinations and medicines

For a medical mission, close contact with the local population and longer stays increase the risk of exposure. The CDC recommends the following for most travelers:

- Hepatitis A: Transmitted through contaminated food and water.
- Typhoid: Also transmitted through contaminated food and water.

Vaccinations for higher-risk travelers

Given the nature of a medical mission, you have an increased risk of exposure to various pathogens. The following vaccinations are highly recommended:

- Hepatitis B: Transmitted via infected blood and body fluids. Medical professionals are at a higher risk of exposure.
- Meningococcal Meningitis: This vaccination is recommended, especially for travel during the dry season (December–June).
- Rabies: This is spread through the saliva of infected animals.
- Cholera: This vaccination is recommended for aid workers and others with a high risk of exposure.

Other important health considerations

- Malaria
 - Malaria is present throughout Nigeria. You must speak with a travel health specialist to get a prescription for preventative antimalarial medication.
- COVID-19: The CDC recommends all eligible travelers be up-to-date on their COVID-19 vaccinations.
- Consult with your doctor at least 4–6 weeks before your trip to discuss your health needs and concerns

Proof of immunization: Keep your International Certificate of Vaccination or Prophylaxis (ICVP) and other vaccination records easily accessible, as proof may be required for entry and exit.

How to Obtain your Exit Card

EXIT CARD CAN ONLY BE OBTAINED 72HRS BEFORE FLIGHT

1. Go to <https://lecard.immigration.gov.ng/>

It is mandatory for all passengers travelling out of Nigeria (Non-Nigerians and Nigerians with dual nationality/citizenship). It must be completed by creating a login account before leaving Nigeria.

2. Select your passport type

Select the appropriate passport type (ECOWAS passport holders or other passport holders) to proceed.

3. Enter your passport Number

You would be required to enter your passport number on the field below to enable you proceed.

4. Biodata Form

Fill the form with the appropriate data on the required columns.

(After imputing your passport number on No 3. Your Bio-Data will be pulled up automatically, if your data doesn't come up, please proceed to fill the form manually.)

5. Other details

You will be required to fill in other travels details in this section.

Note: If you have overstayed, you are required to make payment before submitting your exit card.

6. Confirm and Submit

You would be required to confirm that all the information provided are accurate, after that click on submit.

7. Download or save

This will be requested by an immigration officer at the port of exit.

EXIT CARD

What is the Exit Card



- An Exit Card is a mandatory digital travel document required by the Nigeria Immigration Service (NIS) for all passengers departing Nigeria.

It must be completed online prior to departure and presented at immigration checkpoints.
