

Yorkton **SPORTS** Hall of Fame & Museum

The Yorkton Sports Hall of Fame & Museum is a non-profit organization in Yorkton which honours exceptional contributions to local sports and maintains related artifacts.

The organization has received a grant from SaskLotteries Trust Fund to employ a person to undertake duties related to research and promotion.

This is a contract position for 160 hours, which will commence as soon as possible and be completed no later than 15 December 2022. The successful applicant will work at home or a location of their choice under the guidance of the Chair of the board of directors. Work hours shall be flexible and subject to mutual agreement. The successful applicant must have access to computer equipment and required software, and a secure and reliable Internet connection.

Preference will be given to a person who has an extensive familiarity with Yorkton and local sports. This position will be of interest to a person able to work from home with minimal supervision, including mature students.

The following objectives are expected to be attained within the time allowed:

1. Research potential inductees, with particular emphasis on female and Indigenous athletes and produce information for potential future nominations by members of the community;
2. Prepare information (illustrations and text) about Yorkton sports history for inclusion on the historic storyboard hosted by the Yorkton Brick Mill Heritage Society.

Depending on applicant skill sets and interests, the objectives outlined above may be assigned to more than one applicant. Please indicate which objectives interest you and match your abilities, if not all.

Remuneration shall be \$15 per hour for up to 160 hours, with payment schedule subject to mutual agreement.
