How do you do with letting others serve you?

The cross would reveal what the foot washing foreshadowed.

Foot washing symbolizes Jesus washing our sin away.

The foot washing ceremony brings up questions about baptism.

Baptism is an outward expression of the internal work of regeneration done by the Holy Spirit. It is an act of God.

John 13:10 Jesus answered, "Those who have had a bath need only to wash their feet; their whole body is clean. And you are clean, though not every one of you." 11 For he knew who was going to betray him, and that was why he said not every one was clean.

Jesus washed His betrayers feet.

How are you growing in loving people hostile to Christianity?
