She was one of the ladies who worked to get the library built on 5th Street. She loved the location overlooking the park.

According to Carol Peterson, another founding member and past President of Rocklin FOL, Jean was involved with every fundraising event from bake sales to used book sales that were at Safeway, before there was even a library on Fifth Street, to the annual homemade pie social at the community center. Jean volunteered her time sorting books, working at book sales along with scheduling and hanging the art work in the Community Room. Jeen Maitland, member and past President of Rocklin FOL, remembers Jean always had a kind word and big smile for everyone and was willing to help make the library a special place for her community. Mary George, Director of Library Services, Placer County, recalls Jean as a supporter of the Rocklin Library through her generous spirit and feisty personality along with being brave and bold she never let a government official out of her sight before approaching them to support the library.

Jean's memory will live on in the children's section of the library with an inscription engraved on one of the children's table - *In loving memory of Jean Greene, dedicated volunteer.*

Tony Carmack

Library Hero

As people wait for the swallows to come back to San Juan Capistrano in the spring creating a festive atmosphere, so do the people in Hinckley, Ohio. Only the people in this small town wait for the buzzards. This interesting fact comes from our own Tony Carmack, Youth Services Librarian. He knows this so well because he grew up in the town of Hinckley, Ohio.

While growing up, his parents and grandmother seemed to have either the newspaper or a pile of books to read. At that time, he was a reluctant reader. At this stage of his life, when he did read, he loved the Homer Price character. Tony got really interested in reading while in

high school, as with a lot of readers, when he got hooked on a short story titled "The Cask of Amontillado" by E.A. Poe. He became part of a reading community with his friends, which he feels is a "good" kind of peer pressure.

In 1994, Tony came to the library world as a library paraprofessional. He worked in a library providing information and referral services to the library patrons. Before Tony received his Master of Library Sciences degree in 2004, he taught writing composition at two colleges. Afterwards, he shared his love for children's books by working with children and at senior centers. Tony came to Rocklin in February 2013 from Washington DC.

Children's literature is Tony's favorite books to read. Surprised? He likes story lines based on what it means to be human. Also, he feels kids don't like authors who ramble on as some adult authors. He especially enjoys chapter books that are realistic. He likes tween books with a female main character. Beverly Clearly is his favorite author. He has read and reread her books.

As for the future of libraries, he feels libraries are changing in that libraries are not just brick and mortar anymore. It is a place for the people in the community to come together in a physical space. There are different challenges too. In the past, patrons would come to ask reference questions on where to find information. Now, patrons use the internet and find their own answers and come to ask questions about using technology.

Tony's love of children's literature and providing novel ideas for children programing has made him a great addition to the Rocklin Library staff.

Save Our Libraries Movement

Over the past several months, possible closures of the Meadow Vista and Loomis Library have been in the news. Deficit spending of the County Library's reserves, staffing issues along with underfunding of the library system made the closure of these two libraries look inevitable.

The Loomis Friends of the Library rallied together to support the library. The Loomis Friends, Loomis Town Council and 2700 members of the community signed a petition and persuaded the Board of Supervisors to delay the closing of both libraries.

At the April 14th Loomis Town Council meeting, the Mayor called for an ad hoc committee to be formed to help suspend the closures for a year and to formulate a plan to save the libraries.

Writer's Workshop with Patricia Newman

Can you believe 20 kids participated during their spring break in a writer's workshop sponsored by Rocklin FOL? Author, Patricia Newman was very excited to see so many kids in the program! Patricia stated, "You should congratulate yourselves for drawing 20 kids to a writing class during spring break. That's quite an achievement!"

Although the class was a mix of third to fifth grade writers, there was a second grader too. Patricia focused on getting



the students to look at writing in a different way. She wanted the students to not feel like it was a writing class in school. She definitely did!

A few comments from the students: 1) I learned to splash my ideas on paper, just the way I picture it in my mind. 2) Today at Writer's Workshop, I learned that a great story

must include an antagonist, three problems, a black moment, and a showdown. I had fun too! 3) Today I learned how you can come up with a character and get ideas.

Books and Bytes @ the Rocklin Library By Eve Nyren, Librarian

As the adult fiction selector for the Placer County Library this past year, I have been working to get more copies of popular titles to shorten the wait time on holds. If you are an avid fiction reader, I hope you have noticed some improvement on that front. In accordance with the Placer County Library Strategic Plan, selectors are working to reverse erosion in service by having more of what people want, faster.

There are some great new things on our website you can access at home or anywhere with an internet connection, no wait at all. PCL has just added the World Book Info finder to our website. This has over 40,000 articles and 10,000 biographies. Each article includes citation information for MLA, APA and Harvard styles. There is even a special collection of science projects and experiments. There are timelines on arts, literature, notable people, sports and more. The Spanish version, Hallazgos, is great both for Spanish speakers and students of Spanish language.

Another new fun thing is Zinio. This is a collection of magazines. You can download whole magazines and keep them forever. Click the ebooks link to find Zinio.

Our Library catalog has major improvements too. Now it does a "fuzzy" search. Even if you make spelling mistake it will try to pull up results, the same as internet search engines do. Now you can put a whole list of items on hold at once. You can make lists and save to your account-no more lost paper lists of books to read, or books you have read. Also, when you search, you can check the option to find only available items, and refine your search many other useful ways.

We have some other wonderful resources on our website that you might not think about until you need them. For example, the online Legal Information Center lets you browse Nolo legal books, find all kinds of legal information and find and print many legal forms.

Special Thanks to Union Pacific

After the RFOL was successfully awarded a Union Pacific Railroad's Community Grant, the Library acquired an AfterSchool Edge computer workstation. We'd already had an AWE computer (the manufacturer) for early literacy with games and activities to help build emergent readers' skills, but the AfterSchool Edge is the next step for our young library patrons' educational growth with age-appropriate math, geography, art, science, and vocabulary activities pre-loaded onto the computer.

You can find the newest AWE station on the first floor by the tween area. As Bill Cosby used to say, "If the kids aren't too careful, they just might learn something!"
