
## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

### It takes a Village to Launch a Summer Reading

**Program** by Eve Nyren and Tony Carmack

Actually a city, Friends of the Library, Placer County Library facilities and staff, the California Library Association and a consortium in Illinois. Together, we welcomed 2,493 people to programs, at a cost of just 75 cents per person. There were 13 structured programs with performers or library staff and also weekly "choose your favorite" passive programs. 1,515 people of all ages participated by reading for prizes.

Besides encouraging a life-long habit of reading, summer reading programs in the public library help curb the "Summer Slide"--the loss of academic skills after two months of young minds idling during the summer break. Research has revealed that some 22% of instructional time is lost during the summer; teachers spent a month each fall getting students caught up. Reading during the summer not only helps children keep up but improves their reading.

The 2013 Rocklin Library's Summer Reading Program was a great success. Thank you to our wonderful partners, The Rocklin Friends of the Library and the City of Rocklin. The Friends budgeted money in January for performers and prizes. They assisted at events counting attendance, leading craft projects, and helping organize audiences including one of 300 people. Meetings in February resulted in Rocklin City partnering with the library on venues and public relations for performers. Special thanks to Jim Crosthwaite, Rocklin City Recreation Supervisor, and Eve Wise, Publicity Chair of the Rocklin Friends of the Library and volunteer extraordinaire.

Since last October, Placer County Library staff have been working on planning and executing the summer reading program. They prepared system wide resources such as reading logs and brochures. Within the Rocklin library, staff selected prizes and planned events around the theme "reading is so delicious". When the time came, staff executed the programs—at least one for each week the program ran. The theme was chosen by the iread consortium in Illinois. The California Library Association had contracted with iread to provide Summer Reading Resources at competitive prices for libraries all over California.

Staff's last task for the 2013 Summer Reading Program was to compile statistics in August and send those to library administration. There, administration staff combine information from all twelve branches to send to the State Library.

Meanwhile, we have already started work on the 2014 Summer Reading Program, Paws to Read, by ordering resource guides for each branch from iread.
