Happy Anniversary

January 2014 will mark the third year of the Rocklin Library at its current location, 4890 Granite Drive. County-city cooperation resulted in the current city owned building's fabulous renovation for use as a library, at a cost estimated to be less than 15 percent what a new building from scratch would have been. Here's what we have to celebrate three years in:

Every month between 10,000 and 13,000 people walk through the door of the Rocklin Library. Some borrow library materials—over 20,000 things go out each month—while others attend library programs or use computers.

The Rocklin Library has an expanded palette of services for children: storytimes three times a week, for under two year olds, twos and preschoolers. Children can hone their reading skills by reading to canine volunteers, and they can participate in a California Young Readers Medal book Club. (Continued on back page)

As well as using the library for their individual entertainment and information, adults participate in the Rocklin Library Book Club which meets the 2nd Thursday of each month 2—3 p.m. The December selection will be *The Thirteenth Tale* by Diane Setterfield. They can also pick up a used book from the Friends of the Library book sale room—the only book shop within Rocklin city limits.

Rocklin has a history as a railroad town. The library reflects this in its design (each floor has two corner railroad car themed areas, for example) and its beautiful diorama showing Rocklin when it had the roundhouse. Recently, The Mom's Club Rocklin South donated a gorgeous custom made train table to the library. It is the starring attraction in the children's area. It was built by Dan Berryman.
