

Card Tricks Chapter Minutes

June 9, 2022

The June meeting began at 2:00 p.m. with education by Sandy Wagner on sewing machine maintenance.

After the presentation, President Elaine Mahaffey brought the meeting to order at 2:50.

Business:

1. The first agenda item was the reveal of the round robin quilts. Five members participated and the resulting quilts were beautiful!
2. Prayer requests for members:
 - Barbara Yetter's husband has been ill
 - Nancy Stein and her husband have both had covid. Nancy's husband has been in and out of the hospital.
3. The next Chapter project was presented by Cathy Clark. It will be a quilt called "Jenny Lane" by Missouri Star Quilt Company. The schedule for this project is as follows:
 - June: follow pattern step 1 for background fabric
 - July: Follow pattern step 2 for small and medium roofs
 - August: Follow pattern step 3 for large roofs and step 6 for large houses
 - September: Follow pattern step 7 for trees
 - October: Follow pattern step 4 for small house blocks
 - November: Follow pattern step 5 for medium house blocks
 - December: Follow pattern steps 8, 9, 10, & 11 for assembly, borders, quilt, and bind
4. Guests were introduced:
 - Rhonda Skeie, guest of Kathy Bowers
 - Denise Locke, guest of Trish Staffnik
 - Jeanne Glover
5. A motion to approve the minutes with one correction (first paragraph should read "May" instead of February") was made by Cheryl H and seconded by Jody M. The motion was passed.
6. Treasurer's report: We currently have a balance of \$3490.01, of which \$633.34 is for Patriotic Piecers. Income and expenses were reviewed, and members were reminded that AQQ and chapter membership renewals/ dues are due by June 30. A motion to approve the treasurer's report was made by Jeannette W and seconded by Trish S. The motion was approved.
7. Patriotic Piecers report:
 - Maggie S was able to obtain a pop-up canopy as a donation from Walmart. A thank you card for the Walmart manager is being passed around for signatures.
 - Both quilts will be shown at Pioneer Days in Snowflake. The Chamber of Commerce is giving the guild a free booth to display the quilts.
 - The PP Raffle quilt will on display to sell raffle tickets at the Round Valley Quilt Show June 24 and 25
 - Sign-up sheets to sell raffle tickets are being sent around.
8. Quilt Show:
 - Permit and certificate of insurance have both been obtained.
 - There are 9 vendors so far. Paule-Marie added Unique Fashions (double booth)
 - Kathy Hamilton is responsible for coordinating volunteers. Sign up with her. Blocks will be for 2 hours to decrease so much shifting around
 - Heber-Overgaard will be displaying their raffle quilt.

- Need volunteers for 2 jobs: manning a booth for membership and monitors to ensure nobody is bringing food or drinks onto the show floor and to be sure nobody is handling the quilts (“Quilt Police”)
 - Ledah is coordinating food for vendors and volunteers
 - Advertising: flyers have been sent to 62 quilt shops and non-AQG guilds. Additional flyers are available, and members today are urged to take flyers and distribute them in shops/ bulletin boards around town.
 - The 2023 opportunity quilt is almost finished
 - There will be a table for a silent auction to raise funds to subsidize education. The program committee will be assembling baskets to raffle at the July meeting. If you have anything that would be good to go in a basket or if you have a quilt to donate, please bring it to the next meeting. The baskets do not have to be quilting related. For example, one basket has baking supplies. Another has a blanket, cup, and hot cocoa/ tea. Other suggestion could include movie night (popcorn/ snacks, a DVD or two), a “pamper yourself” basket with lotions, bath supplies, etc, a gardening basket with seeds and other gardening things. Anything you can think of is welcome – remember that the funds raised from this will benefit YOU in decreased costs for retreats.
 - Jodi’s neighbor who sharpens scissors is interested in the Quilt show, but can’t move his machine. He is having new cards made, and Jodi will investigate him being able to pick up scissors for sharpening at the show and doing the work off-site.
9. Sandy reported Round Valley’s quilt show is June 24/25. Quilt entries have been low, and the deadline to enter has been extended to June 18. She has applications available. It only costs \$2 to enter a quilt, and an additional \$10 to have the quilt judged.
 10. Diana will add upcoming quilt shows to our website as a convenience to members.
 11. Maggie announced birthdays this month: Donna D.

 14. Diana is running for AQG board, so please vote. Voting is done through an email sent on or about May 22, not on the website
