Reminders - Please bring your finished log cabin blocks to the next meeting.

Hi, everyone! I'm getting excited to show you an easy method to make a stained glass applique!

If you would like a preview of what we are doing (but smaller and simpler) check out the first of two videos on the attached file, posted by Rob "Man Sewing". It doesn't use 1/4" bias binding, so it's much faster and more suitable for the 8 x 10" dragon fly we will be making. Both videos are good to show you color ideas for the background, especially. However the video on the grapevine is closest to what we will be doing.

I will be using the ceramic scalpel I demonstrated for you in a previous class, but you can just use scissors, as Rob does in his video. I will have two scalpels for you to share, also the freezer paper pattern and some small pieces of organza for wings. Be sure to look at the attachment for the links and a full supply list. It also has a pattern similar to the one I will be providing next week.

Those who want to participate should bring the 10 x 12 black cloth for the background "leading" between the stained glass pieces, already stabilized with iron-on stabilizer. Also, fabric for the border strips and colored background pieces, already backed with fusible on the back. The pattern on the second page of the attachment will give you an idea

of the size/shapes needed.

It would be helpful for someone at each table to bring an ironing pad, if possible. I think the guild has several irons. Otherwise, there will be a lot of back and forth to share the one ironing board. This is mostly needed at the beginning to iron the pattern onto the black background, also to construct the borders.

There will be a bonus pattern for those who would like a slightly more complex pattern to do at home.



I can't wait to see you and show you what I learned about this fun technique!
