Pastor's Message

Grace and peace to you, brothers and sisters:

According to our worship on September 17, Falkner Swamp values most dearly it's abiding love and how the church community cares for one another. These prized values can help shape how our church's deep gladness meets the world's greatest need.

On Sept 10 and 17 in worship we talked about the importance of recalling a meaningful story to uncover our shared values. In a whole-congregation exercise on the 17th, we partnered up and shared a story, a time or event when we felt excited and energized to be part of Falkner Swamp. After taking turns with a partner, we gathered back as a whole congregation.

In the larger group we talked about the values underlying those stories, the one we told and the one we listened to. I wrote on easel paper as people kept sharing, and I ended up with a list of about 15 values and could have kept going! I then grouped those values on separate poster boards, ending up with 7. With help from several people, I hung them around the sanctuary.

The final step in this process was to "vote" on the values. With music in the background, everyone was invited to take the 3 sticker dots they'd been given and choose a value on which to place them. Some chose to spread the 3 dots among 3 poster boards, others chose to stick them all on one value.

A number of you noted this was the hardest part. The poster boards listed these values: *Love*, *Caring for One Another* (friendship, support one another), *Service* (outside of church, desire to give, generosity), *Gratitude*, *Passing on of Faith* (dedicated Christian Education, ongoingness), *Faith in Beliefs*, and *Joy and Hope* (Children's participation, sharing, strong family/ church/beliefs).

Jesus said to "let your light shine before others," and I don't think he meant after we had enough training




or were given permission by whomever we think is in control.

Greetings from your Consistory!

Fall is here, folks, and right behind that the end of the year. Your church leadership is getting ready for the end-of-the-year meetings: Endowment, Budget, and of course the Congregational meeting on November 12. Time flies!

Consistory had their monthly meeting on September 18 at 7:00. After attendance was taken, we offered an opening prayer to God to give us guidance and the strength to "step up" for our church and to "step out" of our comfort zones to do the work He asks us to do. I then gave a brief devotional about forgiveness and sharing God's forgiveness with the people we come in contact with daily.

Vicki Fronheiser passed out the minutes from August's meeting, which we all read and approved. Then Vivian Wentzel passed out the treasurer's report. We had a net gain for the month of \$ 2,951.91. Once again the congregation continued to support Falkner Swamp financially as well as spiritually. The church leadership is grateful beyond words!

There were no announcements, so we moved on the Pastor's comments and communiques. Reverend Frances has been very busy this month; more about that elsewhere in this issue of the Voice. Suffice it to say once again that we are truly blessed to have her working alongside of us! I did want to mention what a wonderful job she did at our service of September 17, where she asked us what underlying values made us the church that we are. It was a different and exhilarating exercise, to say the least!

The committees then reported in. Property announced that the new sidewalk work will be starting at the end of the month. We still need another bid for the cover for the furnace room. The Air Conditioning in the sanctuary has to be "re-timed" because we recently had a power outage. And the lamp-post that blew down in the recent wind-storm is being replaced. Music and Worship reported that the Budget meeting this year will be September 26, and all heads of committees will attend. Visitation noted that Mary Etta Mest made 17 visits (an all-time record!) and 2 extra-long telephone calls to folks who have been un-able to make it to our Sunday services. She continues to do a wonderful job for Falkner Swamp!

We spent the balance of the meeting talking about the profile we are putting together for our shared ministry program, and discussing the seminar several of us went to September 15 and 16 concerning how to increase new membership. This was a tremendous, motivating, exciting seminar, pointing out some of the facts surrounding church membership today, and how we at Falkner Swamp can start to increase our membership. I don't want to take away any of this excitement from the folks here in our church who are involved in this, but I do want to say that it is not as hard as it seems. Just using a little common sense, and remembering that we are not in the 1950's anymore. It will take a "2000's" mentality to get "2000's" people involved in the wonderful adventure of spreading the kind, forgiving message of our Lord and Savior Jesus. And now more than ever people need to hear this wonderful message!

We closed with The Lord's Prayer. Once again, I want to thank all the members of Consistory who contribute so much to the church life of all of us. I hope some of those folks who are not presently on Consistory will consider joining us in the coming years. It is a joy to be in a leadership position of such a wonderful congregation!






A Workshop on DISCERNMENT
