Pastor's Message

Dear Falkner Swamp Community,

On June 10 I was voted by the gathered membership to be the settled pastor of Falkner Swamp, three-quarter time, a calling which I accepted. I am grateful and honored to continue serving in this new capacity.

Sailing toward the 300-year mark of Falkner Swamp's first gathering as a church community, we live in the present while casting a vision for the future. A few years ago, this church faced closing its doors in the foreseeable future. That tide turned. It may be tempting to think those days are past, and church life here can bump along on the slow currents of maintaining how and what we do. Such a false gospel has run many churches aground. My role as your spiritual leader is to guide Falkner Swamp, with sails up, into the winds of the Holy Spirit, taking us to God's mission fields.

Churches that live out the gospel of Jesus Christ seek to do a new thing. The church moves as Jesus moved. Jesus stayed in relatively familiar territory but crossed seas and rivers to approach the unseen and unheard, and often least desirable people of his culture. Honestly, it doesn't sound like a recipe for success. Which is why we're asked to change our idea of success. Success in church means the lost are found, hungry people are fed, the rich go away empty and the poor receive what they need to live.

If all that sounds strange to you, familiarize yourself once again with the gospel, such as Mary's song when she consents to bear God's son (Luke 1:47-55) and Jesus' Sermon on the Mount (Matthew chapters 5-7). The church succeeds when it takes seriously these uncomfortable truths that our material comfort and emotional well-being rests in that of *every one of God's people* also enjoying the same. This is the in-breaking of God's kingdom, God's *shalom*; the truth in the Lord's Prayer, "on earth as it is in in heaven."

We look together to our future with anticipation, moored in the hope of the One who lived only to God's purpose for his life. Listen to the ancient prayer penned by the apostle Paul for the church in Ephesus, as if it were written anew for the gathered community at 2077 Swamp Pike in Gilbertsville, PA: "I pray that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation as you come to know him, so that, with the eyes of your heart enlightened, you may know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance among the saints, and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power for us who believe, according to the working of his great power." (Ephesians 1:17-19 NRSV)

Hello from your Consistory! It's been a busy summer for us; let's get to our report:

After attendance was taken, we offered an opening prayer to God once again to give us the courage to do the work He asks us to do in our community. This is my opening prayer at every meeting. In my opinion, this is what we are supposed to be doing; trying to help ALL people as Jesus commanded.

This month we changed the order of the meeting to accommodate two guests. Sue Dickey came to remind us all that the 300th

anniversary of the first service at Falkner Swamp will be here in October of 2020. This date will be on us before we know it! She offered several ideas for how we could celebrate this special event. Robin Zerr has graciously volunteered to lead the committee to guide us in this celebration. Brenda Semach will help, and there will be a sign-up sheet posted for anyone who wants to join them in this exciting project!

Our second guest was our church secretary, Sharon Sgriccia. She reported 3 improvements to the church office: a new laptop, occasional advertising "boosts" to our Facebook page to highlight specific events, and another answering machine or service for more personalization of our outgoing message. All of these improvements will help us reach out more to our community.

Another piece of new business: Reverend Frances Chester's name will be added to the board of ministers that is in the sanctuary in the next few weeks. We had a net loss for the month of \$559.42. Symptoms of Inner Peace

Watch for signs of peace. The hearts of a great many have already been exposed to it and it seems likely that we could find our society experiencing it in epidemic proportions. Some signs and symptoms of inner peace:

- 1. Tendency to think and act spontaneously, rather than from fear.
- 2. An unmistakable ability to enjoy each moment.
- 3. Loss of interest in judging other people.
- 4. Loss of interest in judging self.
- 5. Loss of interest in interpreting the actions of others.
- 6. Loss of interest in conflict.
- 7. Loss of ability to worry (a very serious symptom).
- 8. Frequent, overwhelming episodes of appreciation.
- 9. Contented feeling of connectedness with others and nature.
- 10. Frequent attacks of smiling, through the eyes and through the heart.
- 11. Increasing tendency to let things happen rather than make them happen.
- 12. Increasing susceptibility to love extended by others as well as the uncontrollable urge to extend it.

If you have all or even most of the above symptoms, please be advised that your condition may be too far advanced to turn back. If you are exposed to anyone exhibiting several of these symptoms, remain exposed at your own risk. This condition of inner peace is likely well into its infectious stage.

The Property Committee has been busy this summer completing projects around the church. All of the fire extinguishers were hung on the walls (as suggested by the extinguisher company). We bought first aid kits for each floor and they will be hung soon. The stairs leading to the Christian Ed wing are almost completed (we were waiting on more supplies).

We had two work days in June and a variety of projects were tackled. Thank you to everyone who helped!

We are checking on getting the toilets in the ladies' room replaced. We are also in the process of getting quotes for the air conditioner/heat units for fellowship hall. It looks like this project may take place next spring. We have \$12,000 saved toward the purchase of it but we will need more.
