Pastor's Message

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

People joke that the only sure things are

"death and taxes." While that may be true, here are a few (and there are only a very few) other guarantees:

- 1. You are good. You were made in the image of God and God doesn't make bad stuff. By virtue of being born a human, you are fundamentally, to the core, bottom line good. Jesus, the head of the church, lived, died, and was resurrected to tell us this.
- 2. You are given a body. It is the instrument we use that reveals our faith. Through it we have the choice to mirror God to one another. It is up to you to treat your body well.
- 3. You suffer. Bodies get sick, break and die. Our hearts, even if beating perfectly, break. Our spirits, even those housed in finelytuned bodies, break. Grief happens when something ends before we wanted it to.
- 4. You are given opportunity to experience love. The kind of love that helps you become your best self. Some have to go outside the family of birth to find this type of love. Love is not guaranteed; opportunity to find and be found by it, is. Some experience the love of God, some don't. Either way, see #1.
- 5. You will, at times, forget all this.

It's when we forget that the community we call church can step in. Through a chance encounter in town or a regular meeting in the same well-grooved seat, someone from church can hold up a mirror to remind you that you are good, your physical self matters, your suffering can be shared, and you can choose to receive and give love.

The Gospel stories are filled with moments of people seeing themselves as God sees them: good, embodied, suffering & loved. Thus seen, the circle of people increases who are not defined by human limits but freed to stretch with divine calling.

Death and taxes? Inevitable, but not determinate. Recall these words from the apostle Paul, who wrote so long ago to the church in Rome: *"What then are we to say about these things? If God is for us, who is against us? For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord."* (Romans 8:31, 38-39) With love, Rev. SUNDAY LECTIONARY* READINGS

Sunday liturgy often reflects the lectionary readings, and the sermon focuses typically on one selection.

During the month of October in worship we will focus on the gospel of Mark, chapter 10. Mark is the shortest gospel and will take about an hour to read in one sitting.

For Old Testament (Hebrew Bible) readings, there are a string of selections from the book of Job.

10/7: Job 1:1; 2:1-10; Psalm 26; Heb 1:1-4; 2:5-12 and Mark 10:2-16

10/14: Job 23:1-9; 16-17; Psalm 22:1-15, Heb. 4:12-16 and Mark 10:17-31

10/21: Job 38:1-7 (34-41); Psalm 104:1-9, 24, 35c; Heb 5:1-10 and Mark 10:35-45

10/28: Job 42:1-6, 10-17; Psalm 34:1-8 (19-22); Heb. 7:23-28 and Mark 10:46-52

* The "Lectionary" refers to The Revised Common Lectionary (RCL). It is a three-year cycle of weekly Bible readings used to varying degrees by the vast majority of mainline Protestant churches in Canada and the United States. The RCL is built around the seasons of the Church Year, and includes four readings for each Sunday.. During most of the year, the selections are: a reading from the Hebrew Bible, a Psalm, a reading from the Epistles, and a Gospel reading. During the season of Easter, the Hebrew Bible lection is usually replaced with one from the Acts of the Apostles.

After attendance was taken, we offered an opening prayer to God once again to give us the guidance to do the work He asks us to do with our church in our community. We also prayed for the people around the world who are suffering from wars and who are refugees. In my opinion, this is what we are supposed to be doing; trying to help ALL people as Jesus commanded.

Barbara Geary gave the Devotion based on Psalm 119. This passage sends us the message that God's Word is "Good for You". There is a peace in reading the Bible; a terrific message. Thank You, Barb!



This month we were honored by 2 more members of our Confirmation Class, Maggie Brennan and Grace Erb. We are so grateful to have them there; they are the future of our church.

Another guest at our meeting was Becky Comer. It has been brought to the attention of the Music and Worship Committee that there are some people registered as members of our church whom we have not heard from in several years. As a result, we are sending out a "Contact Letter" to these folks simply asking them if they still want to be members of Falkner Swamp. We are not setting any conditions; we just would like some sort of reply as to their intentions regarding church membership. She brought this idea to Consistory for their approval, and Consistory agreed that this would be a good plan. Barb Geary and Robin Zerr, along with Sharon Sgriccia are going to help with this task. Our thanks goes out to them.

Back to our regular business: Minutes from the last meeting were read and accepted. There was no treasurer's report as our financial secretary is in the midst of late filings in her accounting business. She is preparing for our budget meeting Thursday September 20. She does a wonderful job for us and I am sure if there were any financial problems facing the church she would bring them to our immediate attention.

We then had an extensive report from Reverend Frances about her month. She speaks to this elsewhere in The Voice, but some of the highlights in her report were that she will be in her office Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and certain Fridays. She will be preparing for her sermons at this time, but of course she will be available to anyone in the congregation who wants to see her. She is also doing visitations to members who, for whatever reason, have been unable to attend regular church services. Finally, she encouraged all of us to visit our web site, "falknerswamp.org". If anyone in the congregation sees anything on the site that is confusing or misleading, please see her, that we may make the site as friendly as possible.

Moving on to the Committee reports, the first report was filed by Robin Zerr as head of the property committee. She reported that new toilets have been installed in the upstairs level ladies room of the Sunday School wing. Also, many fluorescent lightbulbs have been replaced, and at least two light-fixtures in the downstairs Sunday School wing have been replaced with LED lights. The next projects for the Property Committee are air-conditioning in the fellowship room, and new fiber-glass doors at the lower end of the Sunday School wing. On behalf of the Consistory I would once again like to thank all the members of the Property committee for their hard work on the numerous projects throughout the church.


Consistory wishes you to know that in case of inclement weather...
