Reflection on 2021 from Rev. Frances

Dear Falkner Swamp Family,

Welcome to the 2021 Yearbook edition of the newsletter.

We continue in 2021 to adjust to worship and life together in the midst of living in a global pandemic, caused by COVID-19. Although weary, we continue to weather these days with fortitude and trust in the triune God, whom we know through Jesus and whose Spirit breaths words of life.

Our central gathering is Sunday worship. We've held a few events that have brought people together, no small feat in this time. At the start of this year our two longest-lived members, Bob & Margaret Kline, joined with the saints of light, and in November, we celebrated the 90th birthday and appreciation of 65 years of organ playing from our next longest-lived member, Arlene Umstead.

Laura Brown, former volunteer director of Faith Formation, began pursuing her call to ministry. Consistory voted to support her as a Member in Discernment (MID) with the Covenant Association. At the Consistory meeting where Laura presented her candidacy for entering the MID process, I believe I can speak for all that we were deeply moved by her sense of call to explore ordained ministry.

In addition, Laura stepped down as our volunteer coordinator of children's faith formation to accept a paid position at Glenside UCC. Though we miss her presence and her energy, I am grateful she is leaning into the work and mission to which God calls her. You all, as Falkner Swamp, will walk this journey with her in love as she pursues education and experience as a MID. To keep in touch with her church family, Laura continues to organize outdoor walks. Check future newsletters for upcoming dates.

This year we began a Confirmation class. The nature of forming a person in the Christian faith has never happened in just one year from taking a class and going on a few field trips. Yet it is a beginning to deepen the faith parents and grandparents have introduced their children to, so they can make decisions for themselves. In that spirit, our Confirmands are not automatically assumed to be Confirmed into church membership at the conclusion.

It is a choice they each will make. Six of these 8th and 9th graders – see picture elsewhere – gather with me twice a month to explore topics such as understanding how we believe what we believe, looking at Scripture, church history, power dynamics and how they show up in our lives and in Jesus' story. We've taken a field trip to the site of Working Together. Later in February we will serve a meal at Opportunity House in Reading and see a funeral home and crematorium. We will also attempt visits at other houses of worship. Each Confirmand has a Mentor, an adult to walk this part of the faith journey with them. Confirmation Sunday is May 1, so please mark your calendars for this special day.

Take a look elsewhere for news of my upcoming sabbatical and a peak at 2022.

Gestalt Pastoral Care is a form of care rooted in Jesus's ministry of healing. It is a combination of Gestalt growth work, spiritual companioning, and prayer for healing. "Gestalt growth work" refers to a psychological theory that each person's being is constantly stretching for healing and growth. The worker in Gestalt deals with what is present for the person seeking help, not in their past or future, but what is *right now*. This Foundations course is ideal for pastors. It combines theory and strategies for working with people in the course of ministry. I began the course in September 2019 and it was completed in August 2021.

On October 5th, 2021, the Anniversary Committee held its first meeting in over a year. Sadly, all the plans that the committee had come up with for the anniversary we were not able to make come to fruition last year. There were a couple of decisions that were made during this meeting,



and the newsletter is a great way to let all of you know what transpired.

- The committee unanimously decided to disband the committee, there will be no big celebration. Last year, members of our committee and others did recognize our 300th Anniversary during church service. Unfortunately, due to Covid we were unable to prepare the celebration as we all would have liked to have done for this momentous occasion.
- The committee raised \$3,465.61 and the disposition of those funds will be placed into a "Beautification Fund" for the purpose of painting and clean up after the new heater has been installed. By doing this, all members will benefit from those funds raised.

The Committee made the decision to donate the hoagie tickets to our local New Hanover Police and Fire Department; the remaining tickets will be given to Multi-Service. Music and Worship Report for 2021



We were all looking forward to 2021 as the year in which we could return to "normal worship" in our church sanctuary - a normal return to our lives. Alas, COVID has had other ideas and continues to be a dominant and disruptive part of everyone's world. But, we have been able to move forward and keep our church and congregation going despite all the craziness. Thank you Lord!

In January and February 2021 we continued to pre-record our services to be presented "on line" on Facebook. We were not back into our church sanctuary for in-church services. During this time, our Music & Worship committee pretty much met weekly. It was a time of continuous changes with the CDC and COVID regulations, so we met weekly to decide how and when we would be able to get back to worshipping again and opening our church.

February 28, 2021 was Arlene Butts Umstead's last service for playing our pipe organ for the hymns. A plaque of our appreciation was presented to her and is now mounted on our church organ. We are so very grateful to Arlene for her many, many years as our organist and all her continued contributions to Falkner Swamp UCC. We were very fortunate to be able to hire a replacement for Arlene (not an easy task) - Erica Creed. Erica has taken up running our church choir and playing the organ for our church services. Erica is no stranger to our church and we are all grateful that she agreed to return to share her time and musical talents with our congregation and choir!

March we decided to try and open the church by having outside services initially. weather permitting. We were able to move indoors the weekend after Easter 2021. Up until now, we were well aware that some of the decisions we were making were unpopular, but...we were doing our best to keep everyone safe and to obey the guidelines put into place by the CDC.

Fortunately, since April 2021 we have been able to continue indoor Sunday worship. Initially, we felt that it was necessary to require masks being worn whenever singing, but when sitting quietly a mask was not required. However, our "dear friend" - COVID - decided to up its' game, so the Music & Worship committee once again had to change our requirements. We now require - while in church - all attendants must wear masks throughout the church service. That requirement continued for the rest of 2021 and into 2022.

In the Spring of 2021, we were able to acquire a PTZ remote control camera and a new computer to help us live stream all church services so folks could "tune in" from home (or wherever they may be) and be a part of our church family. We give a huge thank you to Kevin Brennan and to David Tyson for helping to make this become a reality - very much appreciated. I (Bob Schnaars) devoted many hours of research and learning to create the system and now run it week after week, along with doing the video preparation for the Sunday service. I also edit and post the "Three Minutes on Thursday" videos. The position of "livestream technician" was created and approved by Consistory, at a rate of \$75 per week.

The Summer and the Fall of 2021 went along on a pretty standard basis, with weekly in-church worship. On October 17 we celebrated our Anniversary Sunday, and on November 14 we had our annual congregation meeting after the church service. The Music and Worship committee increased their budget from \$550 to \$800 to help with increasing costs of music and special worship series for church year seasons, such as Lent and Advent.

December brought us to celebrating Christ's birth using the "The Inn", worship series, which was obtained through the Marcia McFee's Worship Design Series. Fortunately, on December 24 - Christmas Eve at 5:00 pm - we were able to have an actual Christmas Eve candlelight service. The committee decided on having only one service this year, but with the hopes of possibly having our usual two Christmas services in 2022. We held one service this year because we were unable to find enough greeters, acolytes and lay readers to cover two services. December 26, 2021, we had a combined Sunday service with Good Shepherd UCC in Boyertown. We met at their church at 35 W Philadelphia Avenue, Boyertown, PA. No service was held on Falkner Swamp UCC that morning.

Once again we are looking forward to a new year...prayerfully asking God to continue to grant us patience and wisdom to help our church grow and be able to reach out to our community. I would like to give a special thank you to my fellow committee members for their hard work, their dedication and friendship through two very difficult years. They stuck it out ... helped to keep our church going ... and I very much appreciate each and every one. Thank you, Rev Frances Chester, Brenda Becker, Fran Berkowitz, Karen Miller, Jim Kooser, Erica Creed, Arlene Butts Umstead and Sharon Schnaars.

Pastor Sabbatical in 2022

From Sept 1 to October 31, I will be on sabbatical. Consistory and I will work with the Conference to find a pastor to fill in while I am away. I plan to further some educational goals to enhance my ministry among you and for others we've yet to meet.

Two areas I plan to study further are Gestalt Pastoral Care (see chart below) and training in DCORT (Disaster Crisis Outreach & Referral teams), so I can be a support in times of disaster. I am influenced in this direction by the following: my experience watching the effects on people of extreme weather events locally and across the country, assisting in September at the Montgomery County Area Resource Center after Hurricane Ida, and witnessing the efforts of teams from local churches to support those affected.

The more I am steeped in the Gospel, the greater the call to me to be equipped, and my blinders removed to see God among those whom Howard Thurman called "the disinherited," those with "their backs against a wall."* I am grateful to be supported by all of you in the ministry we do together, and hope that by following where I sense God calling me, you, too, will be inspired to do the same.
