Mission Statement of Falkner Swamp United Church of Christ

(from the Constitution and By-Laws, adopted at Congregational meeting 11/13/22)

We, the Congregation of Falkner Swamp United Church of Christ, offer this mission to all members, friends, and neighbors near and far:

- 1. To be a place of welcome and peaceful spiritual retreat for all God's children.
- 2. To strengthen and share our relationship with God through the Holy Word, prayer, music, worship, and service to others.
- 3. To spread God's love by modeling our daily lives as examples set before us by Jesus Christ.

Dear Falkner Swamp "angels":

Angels Among Us is our Advent focus. In our book study, Susan Robb's <u>The Angels of Christmas</u>, and in worship, we look at messages from angels regarding the birth of Jesus.

We're invited to wonder, first, how we might respond if we were in a similar circumstance. We are asked to believe and open our eyes to see that angels of Christmas still bring "good news of great joy for all the people" – for you & me. When we hear such news the question for us today is, how will we respond?

The awkward truth of Advent is that it is still a season set apart to wait, to prepare *for the second coming of Jesus*, not his first as a baby born in a manger.

We'd prefer to feature the baby's birth, of course. Ask the many grandparents in our midst – some being welcomed into that club for the first time in recent months – how wonderful it is to hold a newborn again! A baby over Jesus' Second Coming? It's not even a contest.

At the start of Advent our lectionary readings bring us Jesus' words, jarring to our modern minds: "Therefore you also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an unexpected hour." (Matt 24:44) Anthony B. Robinson asks, "Can we really believe in a Second Coming? What does it mean if we do?" He helps us with our incomprehension:

Jesus is saying "two things. One, there will be an ending to life as we know it.... For Christians history is not an eternally repeating cycle. There is a beginning in God, and an ending in God. I am, said Jesus, the Alpha and the Omega, the First and the Last. ...Second, no one knows — or can know — when that will be. Life is uncertain. There's a randomness to it. A flood, a break-in are other images Jesus uses to suggest life's uncertainty, and to break through our natural and normal human tendency to assume we are somehow exempt from life's crises and contingencies. It's not exactly cheery stuff, but maybe the point is the same as in a verse from Psalm 90, "So teach us to number our days, that we may gain a heart of wisdom."

Robinson leads us to the mercy & grace of God. He asks:

"What would it mean to live prepared for (God's gracious mercy) as the true end of things? By "end" as I use it there I don't mean in a chronological sense, but "end" as in the purpose of all things? We ask for signs. Here's one. One of the delights ... are late in life marriages. After loss, finding — being found by love, again and anew. What grace! Or perhaps it was the grace of experiencing God's one-way love mediated through another human being at a time when you had really messed up, when you had done something that makes you shudder now to think of it . . . and yet that person did not condemn you or abandon you, but loved you and stood by you. Can you think of a time in your life when you experienced grace? "

Recall the words of benediction I often offer at the end of our worship? "Go with the love of God, *the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ,* and the power of the Holy Spirit." Gospel readiness, which is where the angels' messages point us to in Advent, asks for our response to both receive and offer up the grace that is the character of God. It shows up as forgiveness, compassion, and love.

We are called to be walking "grace" magnets – rippling from one end to the other, receiving the gift of grace in the process. Robinson concludes, "Here's the meaning of the Second Coming, we can know the future now We make ready by living today the light of God's promised future."* Welcome to Advent.

Consistory News

- In review of the budget this past month, the Consistory has decided to close the Heater fund, Sponsor a Family, and Youth Room funds. Since these funds will be closed, we will no longer need donations that are earmarked for these projects. The Heater project and the Youth Room project have both been completed. Sponsor a Family was a program run by Boyertown Area Multi-Service and was completed last year. Thank you all for your support of these programs, without your generous donations and support these projects and programs wouldn't be possible. There are small balances in these restricted funds, the church office contacted the donors who make up the balance and received permission to move these balances into the Beautification Fund. The goal of the Beautification Fund is to "beautify" the church after the heating system is complete. Thank you again for making it possible to complete these three projects and any future donations can be earmarked for the Beautification fund.

Rev. Frances and Consistory recently received a request for help from The Boyertown Salvation Army. They are currently providing 650 meals per week and serving 440 community members through their weekly food pantry. They are running out of food and supplies and are asking community churches for assistance.

They are asking us to contribute \$1 per person per Sunday for the remainder of 2022. In the spirit of the Salvation Army's "red kettle" campaign each Christmas, we have a "red pail" which will be on the organ for you to drop in your donations before or after worship.

Just \$3 will cover food and containers for one person for the daily lunch. You are welcome to donate any amount you can—it can be less than \$1, or greater than \$1—when we help feed our community, every penny counts! In addition, the church will match the total gifts up to \$500! Please help us fight hunger in our community.

We want to thank everyone for the generous response on the first Sunday of Advent—we raised \$245!!

Helping Our Unhoused Neighbors

1. Needed: a person from our congregation to attend monthly Zoom meetings for the Boyertown Homeless Task Force to help fulfill its mission that homelessness is a RARE, BRIEF AND NON-RECURRING EXPERIENCE. Ken Hunt, head of the Boyertown United Way, began these meetings last year after people without homes sought help from him, Boyertown Area Multi-Service, and the Salvation Army. The meetings include representatives from these organizations and others, such as local police, our church, Church of the Good Shepherd, Shepherd of the Hills, St. Luke's Lutheran, and others. Most of these are lay people seeking ways to further the mission.

One of the churches is beginning a mentorship team– people who simply walk alongside an unhoused person as they work with other agencies who are helping them, to encourage them. This is one area of growth that has come out of these meetings.

Can you be that person to attend on behalf of Falkner Swamp, and help our church continue its mission as set forth in our newly voted on Constitution & By-Laws (see front page)? Please talk with Rev. Frances if this is speaking to your heart and calendar!
