Easter Greetings!

We did it again. Had an Easter celebration, sang "Alleluia," gathered with family or friends (or both) to eat and maybe participate in an Easter egg hunt or two. We move on though it is a 50-day season of Eastertide, but little else remains that will remind us of this. That chocolate Easter bunny *for sure* is eaten by now, and the lilies, daffodils and hydrangeas are dropping petals like a kids' ice cream slithers off the cone on a high noon in June.

The wonder and awe of the "high holy days" of Christianity – Christmas and Easter – are often lost to all the hype of sameness. At Christmas if we're lucky we'll spend some time with wonder - wonder at the incredible odds that God decided to become human in the form of a vulnerable baby.



At Easter let's stop and just be in awe for a moment. Like Mary Magdalene, who so poignantly holds this word for us (see especially in John 20:1-18), can we just *stop* for a moment and go, "oh wow, what is happening here?" She approaches Jesus' tomb to anoint his body for burial but the *body is gone*.

Men (or angels?) appear to remind her of Jesus' words that he would suffer and die, then rise on the third day. And it's the third day! Oh yes, she remembers! Like a preferred buyer she is given the right of first refusal, and she is the first to see the resurrected Jesus!

Fully bought in, Mary is astonished. I don't know that Mary Magdalene was the muse, but I think of this moment when I read Mary Oliver's verse from her poem "Sometimes":

Instructions for living a life:

Pay attention.

Be astonished.

Tell about it.

In awe, Mary *runs* to tell the 11 apostles... and most refuse to believe her (see Luke 24:1-12). We might do the same. For resurrection, being raised from the dead by God, is a fanciful story. It sounds too good to be true, that there is something that lasts beyond our fickle nature, greed, addictions and perseverations on what we think is right and good and true. That resurrection happens amidst war and hatred, poverty and disease, and endless cycles of humans reaching for the lowest common denominators.

My God, my God, if you had not given us resurrection in Jesus, we would have needed to invent it ourselves. Thank you, God, that you did, so that we did not have to. Thank you, wow.

What is one thing you feel God is inviting you to right now?



PRC COMMITTEE


Colossians 3:12

12 Since you are all set apart by God, made holy and dearly loved, clothe yourselves with a holy way of life: compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience.




