Dear Beloved Community of Falkner Swamp,

A hymn fragment keeps rumbling in my head. "Grant us wisdom, grant us courage for the living of these days," from *God of Grace and God of Glory* written by Harry Fosdick in 1930.



A glance at American history tells me faithful people living when Fosdick penned the hymn needed these words. Much like we need them today.

We live in the heightened arena of bewildering violence, cruelty from our highest government officials, raging disparity between those who have much and those with too little, changes in our climate bringing devastation, all the while the institutions upon which we've built our society – family, capitalism, church, government – continue their shape-shifting, leaving us scrambling for a foothold.

For the living of these days requires people of Christian faith to dig deeper into the Gospel truths. Jesus points to the truth that the joy we seek in life is bound up in the security and well-being of others.

I still have the image of a middle-aged, clean-shaven man with a prosthetic leg, sitting in downtown Philadelphia not long ago and holding this sign: "Help Army Vet." I feel shame that I did not. His well-being is tied to my own. Until he and so many others receive dignity deserving of their humanity, my joy is limited.

Jean Vanier was a leader in the development of L'Arche communities, which is a global initiative begun in France that provides a loving home for people with intellectual differences (https://www.larche.org/en/what-we-do). A philosopher and Catholic theologian, Vanier developed these 10 rules for living:

Accept the reality of your body. Talk about your emotions and difficulties. Don't be afraid of not being successful. In a relationship, take the time to ask, "How are you?" Stop looking at your phone; be present. Ask people, "What is your story?" Be aware of your own story. Stop prejudice; meet people. Listen to your deepest desire. Remember that you'll die one day.

For the living of these days, these are good words spilling over with gospel truths of love for God, self and neighbor.

The Consistory met on Monday August 19 @ 7 pm.

That is why we are taught to earnestly seek to be filled with the Spirit each day (Eph. 5:18) and to be led by him in all our ways (Gal. 5:16–25). When we do, we will find that we can live in newness of life. Not perfectly and not immediately. But day by day, as we walk in faith and obedience, the Spirit will produce in us the character of Jesus: "love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control" (Gal. 5:22–23).




