Dear Falkner Swamp Beloved,

Advent is a season to slow down and wait in watchful patience. Scriptures for these four weeks leading to Christmas point to the practice:

Besides this, you know what time it is, how it is already the moment for you to wake from sleep. For salvation is nearer to us now than when we became believers; the night is far gone; the day is near. (Romans 13:11-12a)

Keep awake, therefore, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming. (Matthew 24:42)

Be patient, therefore, brothers and sisters, until the coming of the Lord. The farmer waits for the precious crop from the earth, being patient with it until it receives the early and the late rains. (James 5:7)

Waiting and slowness are not rewarded in our culture, especially this time of year. Busy-ness takes on extra meaning in Advent the way a snowball takes on size rolling downhill. But God has a different idea for us this season. How to tap into God's desire for us to pause and soak in the gifts of watchfulness? Cue Fred Rogers, of "Mister Rogers' Neighborhood" fame.

In the 2018 documentary, "Won't You Be My Neighbor," one of his co-workers remarked, "Fred used time differently."

The film shows Rogers playing with a child, then cuts to another scene of him feeding his fish. The camera zooms in on Rogers taking out the fish food container, on the food leaving the can, then on the fish wiggling up to eat. In another close-up scene, Rogers takes apart a small instrument, then puts it back together. All in real time and mostly silent.

The studio worker said, "There's a lot of slow space. But there's not a lot of wasted space."

A newspaper article reported on the following incident. Rogers came to a news station for an interview. Unbeknownst to him, one of the station workers brought her preschool daughter to meet him. But when the girl saw the very tall Mr. Rogers coming toward them, she began to cry and hid behind her mother. Rogers spoke to the station manager, "I need to meet with the little girl right away." As the station manager arranged this, Rogers pulled out of his bag a couple of puppets he used on set. Rogers, seated now at eye level with the girl, took his puppets and spoke quietly to her, taking as much time as she needed to be calm. She was finally able to relax finding that the Mr. Rogers behind the TV was the same person who, at first, was a scary tall man pretending to be her TV friend.

How Mr. Rogers used time to care for all living beings guides us this Advent. While we wait, we care mindfully. In the face of anxiety, fear, indeed all the dark emotions, we change plans to sit with them for a while until we can calm them. A waiting, patient, observant stance delivers peace — within us, for others.

Easy? Probably not much of the time. Worth it? Only if we want to receive God's blessings on earth, which is the only place we'll ever recognize them. For earth is the material we are given, from dirt to fish to cherished loved ones.

God's rich blessings to you and on all the precious material around you this Advent.

Committee Reports/Consistory Minutes

Committee reports that are received by the Church Office, and Consistory Meeting minutes that are approved by Consistory, are refreshed on the board outside the church office <u>after each monthly Consistory meeting</u>, typically the third Monday evening of each month, excepting one summer month.

Financial Update through October 2025

Total funds available for general use at the end of September: \$82,871.39

Total Income received in the month of October: +\$13,105.90

Total Expenses paid in the month of October: (\$12,498.28)

Total funds available for general use at the end of October: \$83,479.01

The net financial results from general church activity for the month of October reflected a loss in the general fund of \$1,293.13 (this amount does not include the parsonage rental income).

❖ Sunday, December 7 after worship – Annual Congregational Meeting

There are 3 votes planned for this meeting.

The Congregation is asked to vote:

- 1. To amend the Constitution and By-Laws, Article 13, Page 9, Property, to include the following language due to the dissolution of the Pennsylvania Southeast Conference:

 Should Falkner Swamp in the future dissolve as a nonprofit organization, the allowable, remaining assets, after meeting any outstanding debts, will be donated in the following ways:

 50% to be donated to the Keystone Pennsylvania Southeast Conference of the UCC and 50% to be donated to registered nonprofit charities to be determined by membership at the time.
- 2. To accept an amendment to the current 25% Benevolence designation from endowment repay to Future of Falkner Swamp. Benevolence giving is currently 75% OCWM (Our Church's Wider Mission) and 25% endowment repay. The Endowment Committee has approved forgiving the loan to the church. Therefore, at their November 2025 meeting, Consistory approved this 25% be designated for the Future of Falkner Swamp fund.
- 3. To approve the 2026 budget.
