Reflection on 2024 from Rev. Frances

Dear Beloved of Falkner Swamp,

The discipline of gratitude is the explicit effort to acknowledge that all I am and have is given to me as a gift of love, a gift to be celebrated with joy. – Henri Nouwen

As I reflect on the past year at Falkner Swamp, I am filled with gratitude for the blessings and growth we have experienced. The introduction of three new ministries brings fresh energy and opportunities for fellowship and service. The Stewardship and FUNdraising Committees have worked diligently to support our community. The upcoming celebration of our 300th Anniversary reminds us of our rich heritage and enduring faith.

Please see the reports for Stewardship and FUNraising in this Yearbook. Note especially the need for volunteers for the April 26 Bazaar that the FUNdraisers are planning. Can you give a few hours of your time that Saturday? All will be set up for you; you just need to show up with a smile! The 300th Anniversary Committee meets in early February and will soon put out a list of dates to honor our church's first Communion on October 15, 1725.

One of my goals for 2024 was to train as a Field Education Supervisor so our church could receive a seminary student interested in interning with us. Kelly Johannsen, in her second year at Lancaster Theological Seminary (now affiliated with Moravian University), began with us in September and will continue through April. Her leadership in worship has and will continue to bless us. Another goal was to continue with the Confirmation of Lucas Krause, who, thanks to the clever, wise, and devoted teaching of Becky Comer and Susan Mercer, was confirmed in May.

Gratitude abounded for me in worship on September 29, when this congregation gave me a generous gift in honor of my 20th anniversary of my ordination, my "ordiversary," on October 3, 2004. I remain deeply touched by everyone's expressions of love for me that day. The close of 2024 included the memorial service on December 7 of Arlene Borneman Butts Umstead, our organist for 60 years and lifelong member, who died at the age of 92 in September. Her legacy of perseverance and deep faith in God and in people remain with us today, and we are stronger for it.

Looking ahead, I shared with Consistory and received their blessing on my goals for 2025: complete Confirmation with Lydia and Archie in the Spring; help prepare events and worship for our 300th Anniversary celebration; and actively seek a Choir Director.

None of these goals will be completed by me alone. To borrow from Philippians 4:13, *(We) can do all things through Christ who strengthens (us)*. Believe in this, and we will be the church God continues to form us to be: one body of diverse gifts from the Holy Spirit, uniting to follow the way of Jesus.

2024 Report for Consistory

Sometimes you don't realize how much you've accomplished until you make a list! Consistory was very busy again in 2024.

In January 2024, we welcomed Vicki F. and Rob K. as new members to Consistory. I want to thank Kim S. and Lee C. for their faithful service to Falkner Swamp UCC, as both have stepped down from Consistory. For 2025, we welcome Lee H. aboard!

Consistory reviewed and revised the criteria regarding requests to and disbursements from the Samaritan Fund in order to clarify a few items. We were able to financially assist one family in 2024.

Regarding our parsonage, we have hired a management company to deal with both the finances and the day-to-day items. We increased the rent incrementally to bring it closer to market value, and the current lease runs through March 2025. Our tenants worked with us and have remained in the parsonage.

We also renewed our leases with HDI, LLC and Horrocks Fire and Rescue Apparatus for the office spaces they are using on the lower level of our Christian Ed wing.

In 2024, Consistory approved three new committees: the Stewardship Team, the FUNdraising Committee, and the 300th Anniversary Committee. Stewardship and FUNdraising were in direct response to the budget crisis we dealt with at the end of 2023. All three of these new committees have BIG things planned for 2025 – I encourage you to watch for updates from all three groups so you can stay informed!

Consistory encouraged the church to participate in Off-Plastics October to find ways to reduce our use of single-use plastics. We were successful with a few of our ideas and won \$50 from the PSEC Climate Justice Team for the congregation's efforts. Thank you! The money was put into the general fund.

In an effort to be more focused, we have come up with some Consistory goals for 2025:

- Kitchen certification this involves County permitting and will allow us to use our kitchen for additional events attended by the public
- Support the 300th Anniversary Committee
- Monitor giving to be sure we can meet our financial responsibilities and goals

We are also working to create a Safe Church Policy that reflects current practices as well as a Human Resources Manual related to onboarding and offboarding staff.

We recently implemented some new Consistory meeting procedures. We are tracking "Action Items" to make sure things are getting done outside of our meetings. We are also setting time limits for each topic on the agenda and putting non-agenda items that come up in a "Parking Lot" to be discussed at the end of the meeting or to be added to the next month's agenda. These new procedures have been very helpful so far.

Some of the highlights from 2024 were the following:

- The steeple is an on-going project that will go into 2025
 - \circ $\;$ The steeple permit to make the repairs was approved.
 - Many of the louvers have been hand made and painted by members of the church.
 - A lot of behind-the-scenes work has been completed to move the project forward.
- An on-going project has been to clean out and organize the attic; removal of items such as chairs, flowers, ornaments, etc.
- > The first aid kits have been updated with fresh supplies.
- > The light post outside has been worked on by Michael; Bob and Sharon's son.
- > All the bathroom lights now have motion lights installed.
- The pole outside of the door by the cemetery has been repaired. We had a problem with a woodpecker that was causing damage.
- > The light for the bulletin in the fellowship hall has been fixed.
- We have an exterminator that comes out quarterly for bugs and pests; we also have someone to come out and take care of the bats in the attic as well.
- Casey has been taking the trash out every Thursday for the Friday pickup for this past year.
- We currently have a property management company that oversees the parsonage rental.
- Due to having tenants we are required to have snow removal of the parking lot and sidewalks.
- Some window frames have been painted.
- The heaters that were installed previously which left the walls needing to be repaired have been painted.
- > There are many other repairs that have been completed throughout the year.

Thank you to the members of the property committee for their efforts throughout the year. The members include Bob Erb, Bob Schnaars, Jim Kooser, Lee Hefner, Ron Becker, Rob and Cameron Krause, Kim Shaak and Robin Zerr.

Falkner Swamp Cemetery Committee

Cemetery Yearbook Report for the year 2024



Early in January, the committee was considering an individual for mowing the Falkner Swamp Cemetery. In previous years the cemeteries were mowed by various members of the

Erb family, with Ted Reese voluntarily mowing the Hollowbush Cemetery for 2022, and Corrie Shaak mowing the Falkner Swamp Cemetery for 2022 and the beginning of the season for 2023. Ivy League Landscaping took on the mowing of both cemeteries in 2023, in addition to doing all the trimming of both cemeteries, all of which was done very well, but at a great cost to the church budget. In the hopes of lowering our costs, we tried recruiting individuals to again take over the mowing, but the obstacles were too numerous to overcome, personal insurance being the most onerous.

One of the scariest problems the cemetery encountered this year was to find that our church insurance company [LMK] had somehow omitted the Falkner Swamp Cemetery from the church's policy. This error was found while we were trying to deal with the mowing situation. The last year the cemetery was listed on the church's policy was 2020 and then ... poof it was gone. This was corrected on July 15, 2024, when we received a Package endorsement that added the Cemetery and two buildings (gazebo and shed) to the insurance policy effective June 19, 2024. The re-addition of the cemetery back on the policy generated an additional premium of \$434.00 for the current year. Our thanks to Sharon Schnaars for her timely interception of the omission, and her quick work to affect its correction!

Another issue that has been overcome this year is the lack of personnel to mark the grave sites for burials. With the addition of Kevin and Stacey Brennan to take on the marking of grave sites for the Falkner Swamp Cemetery we are confident that all will run smoothly. A very heartfelt "**thank you**" to Kevin and Stacey for volunteering to do this job. Without someone knowledgeable in charge of marking new grave sites, and identifying the placing of tomb stones, the cemetery would operate in crisis mode.

The Cemetery and Property Committees again joined forces for a workday on April 20 from 9 am to 12 noon, which was followed by a lunch provided by Robin Zerr. Thank you to everyone who helped in any way and for whatever period of time you could donate. Without our church members and friends giving so freely of their valuable time and resources our cemeteries, buildings and grounds would be in terrible shape. In addition to our workday, Bobby Marriott again used his tractor and farm chopper to mow down the weeds and small trees growing on the back field portion of the Falkner Swamp Cemetery. Bobby has graciously done this job each year to keep the field from reverting to "wild" growth.

There were six burials of cremains this year: Ann M. and Edwin L. Hill, Mary E. Baird, and Linda M. Rennard in the Falkner Swamp Cemetery; and Arlene K. Butts Umstead and Charles R. Butts in the Hollowbush Cemetery.

There are lots for sale in the Falkner Swamp UCC Cemetery. All lots in the Cemetery are sold in accordance with the provisions of the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Copies of the Cemetery By-Laws are available at the church office during normal business hours.

Our thanks to Sharon Sgriccia for handling all of the cemetery inquiries and duties in regard to burials, paperwork and questions that come into the church by phone, email or in person. Your help, as always, is very much appreciated.

The Cemetery Committee Members for 2024 were: Kevin Brennan, Sue Dickey, Mary Ann Erb, Bob Erb, Sr., Rob Erb, Jr., Cameron Krause, Sharon Schnaars and Ed Thierolf. We will miss Ed who served faithfully for many years until his death in January 2025. The Cemetery Committee Members going forward in 2025 are the same, with Stacey Brennan joining.

January: Our first meeting of 2024 was held on January 8, 2024. The majority of this meeting was discussion for the upcoming Lent and Easter Seasons. We agreed to have an Ash Wednesday Service (Feb 14, 2024). For the Easter Season, we will again have the prayer vigil beginning Thursday, March 28th until noon on Good Friday, March 29th.

February: Rev Frances took an apostolic Sunday on February 18, 2024 – Susan Mercer led the service.

--Cameron Krause, a young member of our church, has taken over the live streaming of our Sunday church services. Bob Schnaars continues to assist.

--We held our Ash Wednesday service on Feb 14, 2024 in our Fellowship Room. This service was well attended and Communion was served.

--Liz Francisco, who had played for our Christmas Eve service, agreed to take our job offer as choir director/organist. She would officially start March 20, 2024.

March: Palm Sunday (March 24, 2024); Maundy Thursday Service & Begin Prayer Vigil (March 28-29, 2024); Easter Sunday (March 31, 2024). We did not have a Good Friday Service in 2024. We had an Easter sunrise service at 8:00AM and our regular service at 10:00AM.

--Liz Francisco came on board as our choir director as of March 20, 2024 and we set up a "meet & greet" time after church on March 24.

--It was decided at our March meeting that our summer church services would remain at 10:00AM – keeping the same as usual. We opted not to go with earlier time for summer months.

April: April 14, 2024 was an apostolic Sunday for Rev Frances. Lee Comer led the service. --Maundy Thursday and Prayer Vigil was discussed. For the safety of our members and friends – plus the fact that overnight prayer sign-ups are few – we decided that our future prayer vigil will have to change. In 2025, we will start the prayer vigil at noon on Maundy Thursday until 9:00PM that evening. At that time, the sanctuary lights will remain lit and the church will be locked until Good Friday. The prayer vigil will resume at 5:00AM on Good Friday and will end at 2:00PM. It remains our "prayer vigil" – just not a 24 hour continuous prayer vigil.

May: Rev Frances took an education week (May 20 – 26, 2024). Rev Ann Few led the service on May 26, 2024.

--Much discussion regarding the need to set up another search for choir director/organist. Liz Francisco submitted her resignation to be effective June 23, 2024. She took a position as choir director at another church.

June: Rev Frances is taking off two Sunday's in June – apostolic and vacation. June 9, 2024 Bob Schnaars will provide a homily; June 16, 2024 Pastor Paul Jones will provide the sermon.

--June 23, 2024 is Liz Francisco's last Sunday. She agreed to record some hymns on our organ to help us provide organ music for Sunday services. Our organ in the sanctuary has the ability to "record", so we are having Liz play tunes that multiple hymns can be sung to. Bob Schnaars will also provide music with guitar. Bob will also learn the process of playing the recordings on the organ for services. --It was decided the choir would not sing over the summer and will resume in late August. The search for a choir director will begin again.

July: Rev Frances vacation: July 17-23 (vacation) with Pastor Paul Jones providing sermon - July 21. --Jim Kooser met with a friend he knows who plays organs for a living – Vince Ryan. Mr Ryan is not interested in playing for our church as an organist each week, but he did have a student that he felt might be interested. Bob Schnaars contacted and met with Philip Crush (the aforementioned "student"). Philip agreed to come and record music once a month for all Sunday services in that particular month. He will initially be paid \$400. a month. Philip will come the last week of each month to record the hymns for the following month. It was a solution to not having an organist each Sunday. Bob Schnaars sent confirmation to Philip of duties and agreed monthly fee/salary. --Philip Crush came to church Sunday, July 14, 2024, and played the organ for that service. He felt it would give the congregation a chance to meet him so they would know who was recording our hymns.

<u>August:</u> Rev Frances vacation August 3 – 10. Rev Tyson Frey will provide sermon on Sunday, August 4, 2024. Apostolic Sunday August 11 with Susan Mercer to lead worship and provide sermon. --Erin Ahart provided special music with Bob Erb on August 25, 2024. They sang a duet "The Prayer". Erin was our choir director her senior year of high school and she has continued to visit with us ever since (she is a college graduate and employed in Washington DC now).

--Rev Frances purchased an "Advent Series" for our 2024 Advent season at approx cost of \$84.00. --Choir rehearsals began again – Aug 14, 2024. Bob Schnaars leading with the help of Ann Few on piano. The entire choir is helping and are being so supportive since we don't have an "official" choir director. A GREAT choir!

September: Faith Formation Sunday – September 8, 2024. Service held in Fellowship room along with a potluck breakfast. Breakfast at 9:00AM followed by service at 10:00AM. Ann Few played piano for hymns along with Bob Schnaars on guitar. Choir sang as well. We also started to build our "Wall of Works" where our church family could write on a paper "brick" the many works that we saw or found in one another. Each "brick" helped to build our "wall".

--Rev Frances introduced a Field Education Student on Sept 8 – Kelly Johannsen. Kelly will be doing her internship with Falkner Swamp UCC until Spring of 2025. Welcome Kelly!

--New book study began September 19, 2024 at 7:00PM – lead by Rev Frances and Ann Few – "Stretch Out Your Hand" which explored healing prayer.

--On September 28, 2024 our organist and church member, Arlene Borneman Butts Umstead passed away at age 92. She was our church organist for 65 years and a lifelong member of Falkner Swamp. Her funeral was set for Dec 7, 2024.

October: Apostolic Sunday October 20, 2024 – Pastor Paul Jones leading service/providing sermon. --Rev Frances was ordained October 3, 2004 in Columbus, Ohio. During our church service on Sept 29, 2024 we gave recognition to Rev Frances for her 20 years since her ordination.

--Cassandra Krause questioned at what age would our youth be able to become acolytes. It was decided children in fifth grade would be able to start as acolytes.

November: All Saints Sunday – Nov 3, 2024. Candles were provide on the altar for members to light in memory of loved ones. We specifically honored members who passed in 2024 as of November – Shirley Royer, Linda Rennard and Arlene Butts Umstead. We later lost another member – Veronica "Vin" Rosenberry on Dec 3, 2024.

--November 17, 2024 was our congregational meeting after the morning church service.

December: Rev Frances vacation - December 29, 2024. Kelly Johannsen (Field Education Student) lead the worship service.

--Church decorating will begin Dec 1, 2024 after the morning church service. We provided pizza to those who stayed to help.

---Christmas Eve Service was Dec 24, 2024 at 7:00PM – Candlelight Service. Over 100 folks attended! Bob Erb and Erin Ahart sang "Oh Holy Night" and "Mary Did You Know". Bob Erb sang a solo with Bob Schnaars accompanying on guitar – "Some Children See Him". Four members of our choir (Ann Few, Peg Heffner, Ingrid Weil and Kelly Johannsen) sang the German version of Silent Night (Stille Nacht, Heilige Nacht) while the congregations hand-held candles were being lit. The entire congregation then sang Silent Night to only candlelight in the sanctuary.

--A new digital piano was purchased for the choir room – for the choir to use – because the piano that was in that room for practices never stayed "in tune" and was used and very old. A huge "thank you" to Jim Kooser and his friend, David Duncan. Jim's friend donated \$1200 to Falkner Swamp UCC for the sole purpose of buying a digital piano for our choir!

--The search for a choir director will begin again – hopefully, starting February 2025.

--It was noted that Philip Crush who records our hymns on our organ each month, is working out really well. Bob Schnaars usually plays the hymns that were recorded each Sunday morning. However, Bob also gave instructions to Peg Heffner, Jim Kooser and Sharon Schnaars on how this process works. These are folks that can work the organ as back-up for Bob Schnaars.

--Just wanted to make note of this in M&W notes for information purposes. Bob Schnaars is back-up for weekly Sunday service streaming in the event Cameron Krause is not available. Back-up for the back-up is Kevin Brennan.

<u>The Children</u>: In August, we met with the children for a Backpack Blessing. We sat beneath a tree out near our cemetery for a story, had a picnic lunch and fellowship before their school year begins. Starting in September, the children's lessons were those that that mirrored the topics presented by the pastor. Many times, the topics need more discussion and explanation time. Other lessons focus on New Testament Jesus stories of miracles and parables.

Many thanks to the parents who act as aides each Sunday, escorting the kids downstairs after the Children's Message. They engage in free-playtime and craft activities in fellowship with others. Then the instructors come down and we enter into Bible lesson time and singing.

We continue to host our annual Easter Egg Hunt. The date will be set for April. The hunt is well attended, with 10-14 children searching high and low for treasured eggs out on the side lawn and in the cemetery. Easter cookies and juice round out the event.

<u>Joyful Noise</u> continues to be a great success. The children enjoy walking out into the congregation collecting coins. It is so appreciated how many of the adults are sure to give coins to each of the children's collection cans. The monies are split 50/50 between <u>The Mustard Seed</u> and <u>Operation 143</u>. The 2024 total : \$847.49 Thank you all!

<u>Confirmation Class</u> In 2024, Lucas Krause was a class of one. He completed all requirements, as well as putting together a very successful Capstone project: a lasagna luncheon. The proceeds went to support a local family and the costs of their son's ongoing medical condition. \$800 was raised. Lucas was confirmed in May and continues to be an active member at Falkner Swamp.

<u>The Adults</u> have been strengthening and sharing our relationship and understanding of God's plan through weekly Scripture Studies meetings. We meet on Tuesdays 1:00-2:00pm. Our topics range from looking at the many religions amongst the many cultures, as well as dissecting and discussing the scriptures that will be used in the upcoming Sunday Service. Falkner Swamp Green Team and Pollinator Garden 2024

Pollinator Garden

In 2022, Falkner Swamp UCC committed to the UCC 50-50 challenge to celebrate the 50th anniversary of Earth Day. Our project was to create a pollinator-friendly garden, which we did in 2023.



The past year was challenging due to the drought. Stacey and Debbie watered the garden as often as possible, and Jim built a rain barrel and PVC sprinkling system to capture rainwater from the roof to water the garden. In addition, Jim installed an outdoor faucet close to the garden to make watering easier.

Although we only spotted one or two butterfly chrysalis this year, we provided food and shelter for goldfinches and other birds. In addition, we planted the bulbs of the commemorative lilies for Reverend Gary Hauze and they bloomed this summer.

The garden is currently wintering over. Bees sometimes spend the winter in the dead stalks of perennials, so we will not cut back the stalks until spring.

Off Plastics

In October 2024, we committed to PSEC Environmental Justice Mission Team's Off Plastics October. Karen Miller submitted our commitment application, and we were the only church in the PSEC to submit an entry. We received the \$50 award from the EJ team, but, more importantly, we planted seeds for faithful actions. Although we have not followed all the suggested actions, we have begun some of them and hope that more church members and friends will join as time goes on. The actions include, but are not limited to:

Bring our own coffee mugs for church social events to reduce/eliminate Styrofoam cups (Styrofoam takes 500 years or more to biodegrade in landfills).

Recycle plastic bags and commit to using reusable shopping bags whenever possible.

Use real or paper plates.

Use the water coolers (and paper cups) instead of individual bottles of water.

Use large hand soap refills instead of buying new small bottles.

Use cloth table covers.

Use tulle to wrap raffle baskets.

There is a bin in the narthex to collect plastic shopping bags. By recycling them, we keep plastics out of the landfills and help them be recycled into sustainable products. Our 2024 donations helped the Ringing Hill Fire Company meet their goal of 1,000 pounds of plastics and qualified them to receive a Trex bench through the Nextrex plastic recycling program. Future collections will benefit other organizations including the Pottstown Stowe Lions Club.


