SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION PROCESS ~ updated January 12, 2021

Eligibility:

The Hot Springs Village Board of REALTORS® will present a minimum of one college scholarship every year. The amount is \$500 for the first year, and if the recipient returns to school, \$500 for the second year. Applicants are solicited via local high school counselors and a press release in the Village Voice. The scholarship is for traditional, non-traditional and home-schooled students who are college bound and reside in the Jessierville, Fountain Lake, or Mountain Pine School Districts.

The criteria are as follows:

1. GPA will be considered.
2. The student must have a realistic educational plan. The college that the student will attend must be, at a minimum, a two-year community or junior college or an accredited trade school.
3. Written recommendations from a school counselor and from one of the student's teachers are required. (Non-traditional students also must complete this requirement in order to be considered.)
4. The student should submit an essay about himself/herself and his/her goals for the future.
5. HSVBOR members and affiliates, and their immediate family members, are not eligible.

The HSVBOR Association Executive will send the scholarship payment to the recipient's college when the recipient provides sufficient information for the Association Executive to verify enrollment.

Submit the following application package to the HSVBOR office (address above). The application package must be delivered by 1:00 p.m. on Thursday, March 25, 2021, or postmarked on or before March 25, 2021.

- 1. Cover resume including the following information:**
Education ~ Activities ~ Volunteerism
Work experience ~ Leadership
- 2. Two written recommendations, as follows:**
One letter of recommendation from a school counselor
One letter of recommendation from one of the student's teachers
- 3. An essay covering the following questions:**
What is your greatest strength and weakness?
What are your career goals?
Who has been a role model for you – and why?
Tell us about yourself?
- 4. Proof of high school graduation:**
Transcript documents
GPA must be noted for a minimum of two years.

The HSVBOR Scholarship Committee will choose the scholarship recipient(s). We will invite the recipient(s) to attend a future board meeting.
