A Message of Support for our Ukrainian Friends

The Macedonian Community of Adelaide and South Australia Inc., has always enjoyed an excellent relationship with our fellow South Australians who are of **Ukrainian origin**. This relationship has been strengthened over recent years by the wonderful cooperation between the "Slava" Ukrainian Centre SA, and its peerless dance ensemble, and our own Adelaide Macedonian Folkloric Ensemble "Sloboda". The two dance ensembles have appeared regularly at each other's festivals, and elsewhere together, and highlights of these performances can be seen on our own **YouTube Channel**. "Slava" has again accepted an invitation to perform at our "Cultured" Festival No II function later this year (see below), while "Sloboda" is planning at this stage to appear at a Ukrainian-sponsored festival this year if it proceeds.

"Sloboda" in the Macedonian language means "Freedom". The word of course is readily intelligible to speakers of the Ukrainian language. We offer, given the unimaginable horrors, caused by the present circumstances, for the domestic Ukrainian population, and of course for those who originate from that peaceful and proud nation who do reside amongst us, total moral support, and a readiness to assist where we can (as do almost all South Australians). We earnestly wish that it will not be too long a time before Ukrainians are able to experience that word once again!

Macedonian Orthodox Easter - A time for Reflection and Celebration!

A traditional Easter Sunday service, according to our Orthodox religious calendar, will be held on

Sunday 24 April 2022, commencing at 10.00 am. The service will be held in our Macedonian Orthodox Church "St. Naum of Ohrid" at Findon, and will be conducted by Archimandrite Father Gavril Galev, from the Kinglake Monastery, near Melbourne. Father Galev will remain in Adelaide on that day, and is pleased to meet with Macedonian parishioners after the morning service.

A lunch, with full refreshments, for members and parishioners, will be organized to commence after



the service, either in the Macedonian Cultural Centre behind the Church, or if there are greater numbers, in the Macedonian Community Hall, on the adjacent block.

MCASA Celebrates 75 Years in 2022!

This year, our Community will celebrate the **75**th **anniversary** of its formation in **1947.** This is a remarkable achievement, given that the size of the Macedonian migrant group in Adelaide (pop. 1.4 million) and South Australia, is significantly smaller than our sibling communities elsewhere in Australia, and particularly in the major population centres.



MCASA achievements are many and varied, and a glance at

some of the history pages on our wonderful website will confirm this fact. Our Community has always "punched above its weight" in this regard, and even though it was conceived almost entirely by Macedonians from the Aegean region of our divided country (and indeed mainly from a small cluster of villages from the Lerin-Kostur districts), as it settled and grew over the following 3-4 decades, the Community welcomed Macedonian settlers from all parts of the Macedonian homeland, and particularly from the Republic of Macedonia, so that MCASA remains one of the few examples of a cohesive community environment where Macedonians from ALL parts of our mother country live and work together exceedingly well.

Our major celebratory event is planned at this stage to take place on the weekend of **29/30 October 2022**, with a fully-catered Social function on 29 October at the Community Centre, featuring all manner of special guests from Adelaide and interstate, and a Cultural program. This will be complemented by a second version of the hugely successful "Cultured" Festival, originally held with great success in March 2021, on 30 October 2022, again at the Community premises, and featuring yet again a wonderful array of music, dance and other ensembles from numerous local multicultural communities, as well as cultural, culinary and other offerings, and childrens' activities.




