Welcome to the latest edition of our Community Newsletter, as we fast approach the end of year festive season. Yet another year flies by! For the members of the Macedonian Community, the year has recently accelerated in pace, with significant events held, and some others shortly to follow! Macedonians in Adelaide & SA celebrate the Community's 75th anniversary in gala style!

On Saturday evening, 29th October 2022, a good crowd of patrons attended at the Macedonian Community Centre at Findon to celebrate, in fine style, the 75th anniversary of the formation of the Macedonian Community organization here in Adelaide. In 1947, the world was a



vastly different place, recovering from the acute tragedy of a world war which had visited ruination on many countries, peoples and economies. As Australia subsequently opened its borders to many non-British Europeans, including Macedonians, in order to deliver much needed labour to the growing Australian economy, our hard-working pioneers, almost exclusively in those days from a small collection of villages in the north-western region of Aegean Macedonia, banded together in the western suburbs of Adelaide to build homes, start families, and to found a community organization, then known as the "Macedonian Society 'Alexander the Great'". Incorporated in 1958 as the "Macedonian Community of South Australia", our Community organization has witnessed many generations, numerous high points and some low ones, as it endured evolutionary growth characterized by rapid changes in socioeconomic and political circumstances, relative to other comparable groups in the broader community, and relative to the global family of nations.



There was therefore much to celebrate on 29th October, when we gathered for a fully-catered event in the Macedonian Hall to enjoy good company, food and drink, traditional music and dancing, and a wonderful cultural program, amongst special and very eminent guests from South Australia's mainstream political life, as well

as delegates from sibling Macedonian organizations from Melbourne and Sydney.

"Makedonski Merak", from Perth, kept patrons happily dancing traditional "ora" for much of the evening, and the program featured wonderful performances from our own dance ensemble "Sloboda", as well as a guest performance from the popular ensemble from Melbourne, "Tose". A rolling pictorial display



highlighted important moments from our Community's past, and there were numerous other activities such

as an auction, raffle and the offering of souvenirs to make the event truly unforgettable. To round things out, guest speeches briefly pointed to the important contribution made by the Macedonian Community to South Australian society, and to our evolving brand of cultural diversity here, as well as the reading of heartfelt messages of support from Macedonian organizations across the entire country!

In reality, 75 years of rich history is an extraordinary achievement for an organization which, despite the comparatively small size of the Macedonian-origin population in this city and state, is one of the oldest and most respected organizations in the Commonwealth, something to be very, very proud about!



"Cultured" Festival II – Sunday 30 October 2022

The second annual "Cultured" Festival, again hosted by our organization in our Community Hall, and once again kindly supported by a grant from the SA government, proved to be another outstanding success. Well over 300 patrons attended from diverse backgrounds to witness and enjoy performances of traditional music, song and dance by young performers from Ukraine,



Macedonia, Mexico, Bangladesh, Cambodia, Africa, India and Latin America. The Macedonian Community Centre was a wonderfully intimate venue for the Festival, with all participants happily engaging with each other, while enjoying traditional Macedonian foods, and lots of activities for the entire family, including children.

Video and pictorial highlights, professionally edited, from both October weekend functions, will soon be featured on our website, social media platforms and YouTube channel, so please keep an eye out for our fantastic 75th anniversary event selection!

A final word about the many <u>volunteers</u> who worked tirelessly over the weekend (and not to mention during the organizational lead-up over several months), without whose efforts the successes of these events would not have been possible. A Word about the 2021 Census in Australia and Macedonia

Results of the 2021 Census of the domestic Australian population have gradually been published over recent weeks. Again, as in previous Census, persons of Macedonian origin have been understated. A total of 111,352 people of Macedonian "ancestry" were counted,



while of that number, 66,173 speak the Macedonian language at home. Full figures for country of birth and religion are not yet available, but no doubt will again prove unreliable. While it is difficult to accurately reconcile "ancestry" with language spoken at home, there is considerable force behind the proposition that persons of Macedonian origin who live permanently in Australia number, in reality, closer to double the published figure, and this is verified not only by scholarly works undertaken and published in the area of historical and demographical analysis, but also from reliable Community statistics themselves.

It is vitally important not only for our broader Community itself, but also for government service-delivery, that a more accurate collation of data relevant to Australian-Macedonians is finally achieved. In this regard, the federal body, the <u>Macedonian Communities Council of Australia Inc.</u>, will focus over the next year on an important project based upon the preparation of a comprehensive submission to the ABS,



and an active engagement with that federal body around this issue, well before the next Census is due in 2026.



A national Census was also held in 2021 in the Republic of (North) Macedonia, for the first time in twenty years! Published results show a shrinkage of the overall population in Macedonia, somewhat akin to the data from other Balkan states. Younger persons continue to leave the Balkans, including Macedonia, permanently in search of better working conditions and greater opportunities.

Although the domestic population is now numbered at under 1.9 million, over 2.1 million "citizens" of the Republic, including those based permanently overseas, participated in the Census, which is a ridiculously cynical proposition, given the inherent nature and purpose of a Census based upon a permanent domestic population in the places where it lives. Of course, given its ongoing rejection of the policies and practices of contemporary Macedonian governments, almost the entire Macedonian population in the diaspora refused to participate, notwithstanding the ludicrous inclusion of 'non-resident' citizens in the Census in this regard. Of course, the great bulk of participants residing overseas, who were strongly encouraged to and did participate, were of Albanian ethnic origin, thus leading to a "total" Albanian figure for the Republic of over 30% of the population, whereas, with this figure appropriately adjusted for domestic residents only, the true figure is under 23%.

Interestingly, given the hotly contentious issues about history, ethnicity and language being debated between Macedonia and Bulgaria in recent times, and the escalatingly threatening postures of the Bulgarian state and its governments, it is not surprising to note the sudden emergence of 3,504 self-declared "Bulgarians" in Macedonia, who no doubt understood clearly the utility of taking up Bulgarian citizenship and EU passports to enable them to move around more freely in Europe to pursue business activities and so forth. Many more have applied. A reciprocal encouragement of Macedonians living permanently in Bulgaria to declare themselves ethnically as such, and to be accorded minority rights, remains curiously absent from the official Bulgarian state agenda.

Should the Republic ultimately secure membership of the EU, it seems self-evident that the potential drain of young persons from Macedonia seeking better opportunities in the West will dramatically accelerate, resulting in a potentially drastic reduction of the domestic population there. Food for thought, and concern!

The Orthodox Church – All Equal Under God !!??!!

In May 2022, the Ecumenical Patriarch of Constantinople (Istanbul) (EPC), Bartholomew, the contemporary but largely ceremonial-only "Pope" of Eastern Orthodoxy, welcomed the untilnow unrecognized and "schismatic" Macedonian Orthodox Church – Ohrid Archbishopric (MOC-

OA) into "eucharistic communion" (recognition). Bartholomew referred to our Church only as the "Church of Ohrid". He referred the issue of recognition of the autocephaly (independence) of the MOC-OA back to the Serbian Orthodox Church (SOC), from which the MOC-OA had unilaterally separated in 1967. Surpisingly, the SOC immediately recognized the MOC-OA as autocephalous, and explicitly recognized our Church's right to use and control its properties across the world, with unfettered justisdiction internationally.



The EPC however has limited recognition and jurisdiction to date only within the boundaries of (North) Macedonia. This has been followed by the Greek Orthodox Church (GOC), which refers also to our Church as the (North Macedonian) "Church of Ohrid", while welcoming the Church into the "Family" of Orthodox Churches. As has happened with the newly independent Ukrainian Orthodox Church (UOC), recognized by the EPC and other Orthodox Churches (except for the powerful Russian Orthodox Church (ROC)), the GOC would prefer the "Ohrid Church" to be placed under the administrative control of the GOC Dioceses in Australia!!! For its part, the Bulgarian Orthodox Church (BOC) has stated that it has no issue with recognizing the autocephaly and global jurisdiction of the MOC-OA, except that it will not do so unless the MOC removes the "OA" suffix in its name, because the ""Ohrid Archdiocese" was/is an inseparable part of Bulgarian national and religious history"!!!

To preciously top matters off, the ROC unexpectedly also recognized the autocephaly of the MOC-OA, and its jurisdiction, without condition, presumably as payback for the EPC and the GOC instigating the recognition of the independence of the UOC!!!

As yet, there is no further, definitive word from the largely ineffectual EPC, nor indeed from other national Orthodox Churches !! All equal under God ???
