To Sabbath or Not to Sabbath?

This is a question that many Christians have asked. How do we handle the Sabbath? We studied the Lord's command for the Israelites to observe the Sabbath in our Sunday morning message from Exodus 31:12-18 on May 5th. If the Israelites broke how they were to observe the Sabbath day, they would be put to death. The Lord explained that they were to work for six days, but the seventh day of the work was holy to the Lord. They were to rest and be refreshed through intentionally being in relationship with the Lord.

Through the redemptive work of Jesus Christ, we are no longer required to follow the law. He has fulfilled the requirements of the Law of the Old Testament (Matthew 5:17). We looked at this in detail in last month's newsletter article. Each law was given by the Lord to protect His people from sinning and also to provide a path for relationship with Him.

Even though we, as Christians, no longer live under the authority of the Law, it is still valuable. With this truth in mind we therefore know that the practice of a Sabbath is valuable for the life of Christian. Exodus 31:17 states that the Sabbath is a sign between the Lord and His people declaring in truth that the Lord created the heavens and the earth in six days. Then He rested on the seventh day. This was a model for the need that we have as humans.

We need to rest to be refreshed, refocused, and replenished. If we constantly go without resting we break down; mentally, physically, and spiritually. The last part is the worst one of all. When we become spiritually weak, that means we are failing in the part of us that is eternal. So, we need a Sabbath.

During Jesus' ministry, the Jewish religious leaders attempted multiple times to paint Jesus as a fraud because He and His disciples didn't follow the Sabbath in the way they wanted Him to. One of these incidents is recorded in Mark 2:23-28. They accused the disciples of breaking the Sabbath because they plucked heads of grain and ate them. By plucking the grain they were doing a work on the Sabbath. The Sabbath was no longer what the Lord intended it; about relationship with the Him, but instead was about being "good enough" to check that box of self-righteousness and then to move onto the next box.

Jesus called the religious leaders out and explained what the Sabbath was truly about. He said, "The Sabbath was made for man, not man for the Sabbath" (Mark 2:27). A simple explanation. The Sabbath was never to be a work that man did for God. It was to be a time in which a person rested in the Lord. To actually take time to separate from the stresses, the commitments, the phone calls, the text messages, social media, and everything else that contends for our time; and just be present with the Lord. 
