

[Jesus said:] ²⁵ "There will be signs in the sun, the moon, and the stars, and on the earth distress among nations confused by the roaring of the sea and the waves. ²⁶ People will faint from fear and foreboding of what is coming upon the world, for the powers of the heavens will be shaken. ²⁷ Then they will see 'the Son of Man coming in a cloud' with power and great glory. ²⁸ Now when these things begin to take place, stand up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near." ²⁹ Then he told them a parable: "Look at the fig tree and all the trees; ³⁰ as soon as they sprout leaves you can see for yourselves and know that summer is already near. ³¹ So also, when you see these things taking place, you know that the kingdom of God is near. ³² Truly I tell you, this generation will not pass away until all things have taken place. ³³ Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away. ³⁴ "Be on guard so that your hearts are not weighed down with dissipation and drunkenness and the worries of this life, and that day does not catch you unexpectedly, ³⁵ like a trap.

A Baptismal Celebration for Logan Randall LaGrange

God, who is rich in mercy and love, gives us new birth into a living hope through the sacrament of baptism.

The power of sin is put to death in this holy flood, and we are raised with Jesus Christ to new life.

We are united with all the baptized in the one body of Christ.

We are anointed with the gift of the Holy Spirit and sent out in mission for the life of the world.

A member of the Baptismal party presents the child by saying:

We present Logan Randall LaGrange to receive the sacrament of Holy Baptism.

As you present this child for baptism you are entrusted with gifts and responsibilities: to live with him among God's faithful people, to bring him to the word of God and the holy supper and nurture him in faith and prayer that he may learn to trust God, proclaim Christ through word and deed, care for others and the world God made, and work for justice and peace among all people. Parents and sponsors, I ask you, do you promise to help this child grow in the Christian life and faith?

R/ I do.

I ask you to reject sin, profess your trust in Christ and confess the faith of the church. Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God, the powers of this world that rebel against God and the ways of sin that draw you from God?

R/ I renounce them.

Do you trust in Christ as your Lord and Savior?

R/ In faith I turn to Christ.

With the whole church, let us confess our faith:

I believe in God the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into hell. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

Let us give thanks to God.

It is right to give God thanks and praise.

Blessed are you, O God, creator of all things. Your voice thundered over the waters at creation. You water the mountains and send springs into the valleys to refresh and satisfy all living things. In the time of Noah you washed the earth with the waters of the flood, and your ark of salvation bore a new beginning. In the time of Moses your people passed through the Red Sea from slavery into freedom. In the fullness of time you sent Jesus the Christ, nurtured in the waters of Mary's womb, so that through the baptism of his death and resurrection, your children may be set free from bondage to sin and death and sent to proclaim the good news throughout the earth.

The Child is Baptized

We give you thanks, O God, that through water and the Holy Spirit you give your daughters and sons new birth. Sustain Logan with the gift of your Holy Spirit: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in your presence.

The pastor makes sign of the cross on the child's forehead:

Logan Randall LaGrange, child of God, you have been sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever.

As baptismal candle is lit:

As Lutherans, we consider baptism our initial call to discipleship. As we present this candle to Logan we say:

Let your light so shine that others may see your good works and give glory to God.

As baptized children of God and disciples of the living Christ, let us proclaim:

May our lights shine in the world with God's grace!

God of grace, look with kindness upon the parents and sponsors of this child. Give them joy in the gift of this child, and help them to be examples of faith and teachers of discipleship. Strengthen them in their own baptism as they share with this child a life of trust in you.



Christmas Giving Tree - City Mission Toy Store




