LARKIN SPIVEY is a decorated veteran of the Vietnam War and a retired Marine Corps officer. He commanded infantry and reconnaissance units in combat and was trained in parachute, submarine, Ranger, and Special Forces operations. He was with the blockade force during the Cuban Missile Crisis and served President Nixon in the White House. As a faculty member at The Citadel, he taught courses in U.S. military history, a subject of lifelong personal and professional interest. Spivey is a South Carolina native and long time resident of Myrtle Beach. Since retiring from the Marine Corps he has been active in local business and community affairs, owning and managing a recreational vehicle resort and real estate development company. He is an active member, lay eucharistic minister, and vestryman of Trinity Church and has been actively involved in the Anglican Cursillo Christian renewal movement and the Luis Palau Evangelistic Association. He is an honor graduate and former Regimental Commander of The Citadel and earned a master's degree at George Washington University and a Doctor of Theology degree from Phoenix University of Theology.
