CHAIR & CEO REPORT

2024 was a pivotal year for Worthy Australia- one marked by consolidation, reflection, and laying the groundwork for sustainable future growth. This year, our focus remained on strengthening our foundations to ensure that we can scale our impact while maintaining the quality and integrity of our work.

Our Safe Haven Program continued to serve women and children escaping domestic violence, transforming empty houses into safe, fully functional homes. Over the past year, we created 18 safe havens, providing families with not just a physical shelter but also a sanctuary for healing and rebuilding their lives.

However, the year was not without challenges. Due to funding limitations and capacity constraints, we were forced to turn away some referrals- a sobering reminder of the overwhelming demand for our services. Yet, as we move into 2025, I am proud to say we are in our strongest position yet. With updated strategic plans in place, we are poised to significantly increase the number of families we can support in the year ahead.

Recognising the importance of providing assistance wherever possible, we introduced starter kits- comprehensive sets of small household essentials for families we could not place into a full safe haven. These kits allowed us to extend our reach, ensuring that even when a full Safe Haven service was unavailable, we were able to provide critical support to families in need. This initiative has increased our impact while reinforcing our commitment to helping women and children rebuild their lives.

The housing crisis in Western Australia has presented a significant barrier for women seeking safe and affordable accommodation. While securing properties has become increasingly difficult, referrals to Worthy Australia have continued to rise. This growth reflects the strong reputation and trust we have established among Perth's refuge services and partner organisations.

It is important to note, however, that if more housing becomes available, our capacity to accept and support families must also increase. To meet this demand, we will require additional support- from funding to partnerships-to ensure we can provide homes to those who need them most.







CHAIR & CEO REPORT

The prevalence of domestic violence in Western Australia has reached devastating levels. Recent statistics underscore the urgency of this crisis:

In 2024, there was a record number of domestic violence incidents reported to police across WA. Alarmingly, the vast majority of domestic violence incidents remain unreported, meaning the true scale of the issue is far greater than what is reflected in official data.

Domestic violence is not just a private issue; it is a societal crisis that requires coordinated responses. Worthy Australia is part of this crisis response. Our work ensures that women and children have access to safe, dignified homes, breaking cycles of violence, poverty, and homelessness.

Research from Curtin University highlights the stark reality many women face, which is the inability to leave or the pressure to return to violent relationships due to extreme poverty and homelessness. Women escaping violence are often confronted with the impossible choice of enduring harm or facing life on the streets with their children.

Worthy Australia's Safe Haven Program directly addresses this issue. By providing stable, furnished homes, we create opportunities for families to heal, regain their independence, and rebuild their lives. A safe, calming home environment is vital for mental health and wellbeing- particularly for children who have endured the trauma of domestic violence. Studies have consistently shown that access to safe housing reduces stress, improves mental health outcomes, and supports positive life trajectories.

Our Safe Haven Program is more than just a housing solution- it has a significant ripple effect across the domestic violence support ecosystem. By providing long-term, stable housing to families:

1. We free up refuge beds for women and children in immediate crisis, enabling frontline services to support more survivors.

2. We reduce dependency on government resources by offering community-driven, sustainable solutions.

3. We support women's pathways to employment, education, and independencereducing their vulnerability to future violence.

The importance of our work cannot be overstated. As domestic violence continues to rise and the housing crisis deepens, Worthy Australia remains steadfast in its commitment to providing safe, dignified homes for families in need.

As we prepare for the year ahead, Worthy Australia is stronger than ever both in purpose and in capability. While challenges remain, our commitment to addressing domestic violence and supporting families remains unwavering. OUR IMPACT...

WE DON'T JUST FURNISH HOUSES. THE SAFE HAVEN PROGRAM PROVIDES A VITAL AND LIFE CHANGING SERVICE THAT BEFORE OUR INCEPTION, DID NOT EXIST IN WA.

Addressing Critical Needs:

By providing comprehensive post-crisis support, our program helps to address one of the most significant stressors facing survivors: the daunting task of rebuilding their lives with limited resources. By ensuring that survivors have access to the essential items and support they need, we reduce the likelihood of them returning to abusive situations due to lack of resources or support.

Relieving Pressure on Crisis Refuge Services:

Our program also relieves pressure on crisis refuge services by providing survivors with the means to establish stable homes, thereby freeing up crisis beds for those in immediate need. Many survivors stay in refuge longer than required because they lack the means to provide suitable households for themselves and their children, leading to a shortage of available beds for other vulnerable individuals.

Supporting Support Workers:

Additionally, our program relieves the burden on support workers who may otherwise be tasked with assisting survivors to source, collect, store, and transport goods, tasks that are outside the scope of their practice. By providing survivors with comprehensive support, we enable support workers to focus on their primary roles of providing emotional support and advocacy for survivors.



Worthy Australia Safe Haven program plays a crucial role in addressing the intersecting issues of domestic violence, poverty, and homelessness. By providing survivors with comprehensive support, including fully furnished homes tailored to their needs, the program not only offers immediate relief but also helps break the cycle of violence and poverty.

By addressing the practical challenges survivors face in rebuilding their lives after escaping abuse, such as securing housing and household necessities, the program empowers survivors to regain control over their lives and create a brighter future for themselves and their children.

IT'S ALL IN THE FEEDBACK

WE COULD WRITE A WHOLE REPORT ON THE IMPACT WE HAVE, BUT CLIENT FEEDBACK TELLS THE STORY.

"Dear Jen & Worthy,

I came from having everything to absolutely nothing. We owned our home and had nice furniture. But behind closed doors, me and my kids lived a nightmare. We lived rural, so it wasn't like we had neighbours to hear the screams, the yelling or see at time the bruises. It wasn't just me that endured the many years of abuse, torment and control, the kids endured it too.

I planned so many escapes, but the fear was too great. Isolated. No family. Controlled. Our lives were threatened constantly.

Then 3 years ago myself and the kids got the courage to escape. Early morning. No phones, and only a change of clothes. In such a panic to not get caught, I forgot the baby bottle that I had made for our run. We had absolutely nothing.

There are 2 days in my life that I will never forget, The day that we escaped our nightmare, and the day me and my kids walked through the doors of my brand new home that was fully furnished with the most beautiful things.

To say that I didn't cry when I opened the front door in disbelief, is an understatement. After all these years, being told that no one cared for me or that I wasn't worth a thought, suddenly changed.

How did absolute strangers do all of this, not just for me, but for my kids? We all had a fully furnished bedroom. Each room was like a page from a magazine. The bathroom vanity was stocked with personal care items. The laundry cupboard was full of brand new linen. The food pantry- full!

After so many years of abuse, only having to rely on the person who took my life away, it was given back to me that day, and for that moment I knew we got our lives back, which was made easier thanks to WORTHY Australia.

I feel forever grateful for every single person who helped me and my family on this journey. "

IT'S ALL IN THE FEEDBACK

" I was referred to Worthy Australia by my case worker from Salvation Army after I was had to leave a 20+ yr marriage with basically just the clothes on my back. I was helped to find a house for myself and my 3 youngest boys.

I was living in my new house for almost 6 weeks with nothing but a borrowed air mattress and nothing else. Once Worthy Australia found out they very quickly organised there volunteers to furnish my house. Any so many volunteers turned up.




LETS TALK FINANCES





ACTUAL CASH COST OF SAFE HAVEN OUTCOMES




ALLOCATION OF FUNDS

When it comes to expenditure, Worthy Australia Foundation adheres to a straightforward principle: all community and regular business donations are allocated directly to our Safe Haven program. This transparent approach ensures accountability and transparency, enabling our community to witness firsthand the tangible impact of their contributions. Specifically, these funds are directed towards the procurement of Safe Haven goods, as well as the transportation and storage of furniture, and the acquisition of insurance coverage to safeguard our operations.


Conversely, back-of-house expenditures such as marketing, events, and wages are sourced through strategic partnerships, grants, and sponsorships. By leveraging these avenues, we ensure that essential operational costs are met while maximising the impact of donated funds on frontline services. This disciplined approach to financial management underscores our commitment to stewarding resources responsibly and maximising our capacity to support survivors of domestic violence and their families.

In 2024 we:

- Reduced event expenditure by focusing on external fundraisers
- Used targeted funding for wages and marketing
- · Received targeted funding to support warehouse costs
- Utilised discounted accounting services & had our accounts audited
- Continued to work to reduce the costs of Safe Havens, despite ongoing economic challenges
- We had to increase our insurance due to our new warehouse however we removed all of our smaller storage facilities
- We continued to spend a significant amount on furniture transport, which we look to source specific funding for in 2025.



BREAK DOWN OF COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH RUNNING OUR CHARITY.















































































MOVING FORWARD...
