- Any size pond or water garden may be judged

Ok, I guess summer is here! After a cold spring I am behind with my ponds.

I put out all of my Odessa Barb fry in my 220 gallon outdoor tank. This tank is perfect for a grow out tank with lots of Baby Brine, a water change with every rainstorm and a few potted plants... see you in September.

Next up, my Rainbow tub – 100 gallon tub tug in the middle of my tomato garden. Rainbows on the top with lots of floating plants and a pair of Wild Kribs on the bottom. Hope for fry from both.

Dan Katz recommended Red & Blue Columbian Tetras for a pond. Hopefully they don't want to eat their fry.

White Clouds for the cold, shady tub – somebody gotta eat them mosquitos!

I don't know if it will get hot enough to spawn any Gourami's. I have a big pair of Pearls. They do best in those "dog days of summer" with high heat and warm humid nights and that's when they spawn. They need the warm nights as the cool air kills fry as they take their first breath of cold air. I cover the tubs if I see fry and it's cooler than 65° at night. The last few years this has been an August problem.

I hope you get inspired to try your fish outside. It's very relaxing to watch them and look for fry or see what plants are growing... maybe even get a frog or two to move inJ I still can't figure out how they get here? I'm a quarter of a mile from any real pond or stream – nature at her best I guess.

Back in April our sister club, Danbury Aquarium Society decide to sponsor a Putnam County 4-H Club, Tropical Fish & Aquatic Plant 4-H Program. I volunteered to help at bi-monthly meetings with the kids. The program was open to youth between the ages of 8-12 and was limited to 10 kids. DAAS supplied 10 gallon tank start-up set-ups, including gravel, lights, filter, etc. and fish & plants for all the kids.

The weeks have flown by and the kid's tanks are all doing well. During the meetings we have covered how to set-up their tanks and care for them, the various fish and plants they were given, fish food including the kids made Repashy to take home with them. The Nitrogen Cycle and filtration was covered and they were able to use mini microscopes to examine filter media. We had Dan Katz give a small talk on Killie fish and then had kllie eggs hatch while the kids were at the meeting & they loved it! Sue Katz had a handout for the kids and talked about how fish breathe since it's different than humans.

Overall this was a great experience at the kids and their parents have been very enthusiastic. All of this is leading up to the 47th Annual Putnam County 4-H Fair at the end of July. THE NAS BAP REPORT

Date: June 15, 2018

Breeder of the Year Competition: Although the Competition has gotten off to a somewhat slow start, it is competitive. After five months, three participants (Ben Chalfin, Don Maloney and Artie Platt) are tied for the lead with 4 entries apiece. And, Basil Holubis trails by only one entry. The updated Breeder of the Year Standings is attached. As delineated therein, seven participants have contributed 21 entries. Clearly, all have the opportunity to claim the year-end award.

<u>New Participants</u>: Two of the participants are first-time participants in the BAP program. **Michael Berluti** brought in the 15-point Neolamprologus multifasciatus. **Ben Chalfin** brought in 4 entries to include the bonus-eligible Otocinclus vittata (Oto catfish). Their participation brought the all-time total of members participating to 125. We welcome and thank **Ben** and **Michael** for their contributions.

<u>20-Point Species:</u> Among this year's entries are two 20-point species - Neolamprologus sexfasciatus by **Don Maloney** and Crenicara punctulata by **Artie Platt.** As one of our three Expert Breeders, **Don's** success is not unexpected. And, as many of us are aware, **Artie** has been targeting 20-pointers for some time with the goal of becoming our fourth Expert Breeder. Congratulations to **Don** and **Artie**!

BAP Breeder Award: It has been some time since someone has earned a BAP award. Congratulations go to **Ben Chalfin** for accumulating the 50 points required for the first-level Breeder Award. I expect that his award odyssey has just begun and, as noted earlier, he certainly is in the running for the 2018 Breeder of the Year Award. Mighty impressive.

<u>BAP Point Standings:</u> The updated BAP Point Standings for current members is attached. There is nothing dramatic to highlight. It was nice to see **Bob McKeand** become active again. And, **Artie Platt** continues to move up in the standings. And, **Ben Chalfin** has definitely made a big splash.

BAP in Perspective: Only a dwindling few of us probably remember BAP in the immediate years before the institution of the Breeder of the Year competition (BOY). There were years with only 3 or 4 participants and maybe 15 to 25 entries. This was totally unacceptable. The BOY program was put in place in 2005 and was designed to restore vitality to the BAP program. It succeeded beyond our wildest hopes. In 2005, there were 7 participants and 43 entries; in 2006, there were 12 participants and 54 entries; in 2007, there 14 participants and 75 entries; in 2008, there were 15 participants and 90 entries. Thereafter, for many years, there were routinely 15 to 20 participants and entry levels in the 100's (topping out in 2009 with 135).

Unfortunately, in the past few years, the number of participants and entries have been trending downwards. There have been a number of reasons for this - some quite valid. Nevertheless, I do not consider this trend to be irreversible. I urge our breeders to set goals, breed some special fish, participate in the program and otherwise contribute to the growth and prosperity of the Norwalk Aquarium Society. NAS can only be what we all make it to be.
