PETITION TO THE

House of Commons in Parliament Assembled

WHEREAS:

The WHO (World Health Organization) / UN / UNESCO Comprehensive Sexuality Education Curriculum (CSEC) violates Canadian law and community standards;

CSEC intentionally hyper-sexualizes and traumatizes infants and children, thereby perverting their view of normal relationships and sexuality with lifelong potential adverse consequences;

CSEC is currently used in schools and day care centres across Canada without parental knowledge, participation or consent;

CSEC normalizes aberrant, traumatizing, and exploitive hyper-sexualization and sexual activity of infants and children with each other and with adults, resulting in significant permanent harm to the psychosexual development of children;

CSEC promotes dangerous, unproven and discredited theories of human sexuality requiring "the development of lust" and "sexual activity as early as possible" with no regard for the emotional impact on the victims of these harmful and illegal activities;

Implementation of CSEC results in multiple violations of Canadian law, including Criminal Code sec. 153(1);

CSEC violates articles 18, 19, 32, 34, 36, 37, 39, and 41 of the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child, which became law when ratified by Canada on 12 December 1991;

Both the Canadian Criminal Code and the UN Convention on the Rights of

the Child impose the obligation of protection of children on the State and its agents; and

Canada must not continue to participate in international organizations so clearly committed to the destruction of Canada's children - the very future of Canada.
