Similarly, healthy, supportive relationships among staff foster a culture of trust and teamwork, creating a school community where everyone can flourish.

- **Fuel** your purpose by reconnecting with the "why" behind your work and the mission you share with your colleagues for the students you teach.
- Be **Intentional** about prioritizing what matters most—your relationships with students and colleagues, using an understanding of attachment science to create secure, trusting bonds.
- Regulate your emotions with techniques and practices to stay balanced through the highs and lows, modeling emotional resilience and stability for those around you.
- **Energize** your body, mind, and spirit every morning, noon, and night, by creating self-care habits and routines so you can bring your best self to school every day.
