Dept President's Message

Now is the time to begin closing out your "Tracking Worksheets for Members and Units," so those numbers are given to your Unit President before the 31st of March. The Unit president, secretary and unit treasurer will add all your individual numbers together then place them on the Unit Report. Compiled data should them be sent to the District President, No Later Than 15 April. A team of 3 can easily process 40 to 75 reports in several hours. Larger Units will need several teams who will repeat the process: calculating all the units in the district to the district form which is sent to the Department Secretary to be placed onto a spreadsheet that consolidates all 12 sets of district numbers to create the Department of Washington's Report to National. That gives the Department ample time to complete their report to National by prior to the 15 May deadline.

Our committee hopes you will work with us this year; we need you to be part of our Evergreen Girls State (EGS) team in order to accomplish making this program successful. Your participation is so vital. The citizens who attend on behalf of your Unit will be effective in other people's lives and are our future in Government, we may be the only program that teaches this now.

At Evergreen Girls State, the citizens will run for County and State Offices. Two citizens will be elected as Senators and will attend Girls Nation in WA DC from July 20th through July 27th. The citizens are taught how to write a bill and debate it in the EGS House and Senate prior to going the EGS Governor's desk to sign or veto. They will run for the EGS Supreme Court Justices and wearing their robes, preside in a mock trial with the elected EGS Prosecuting and Defense attorneys with citizens acting as witnesses. The Citizens will be given a County Problem which they will need to build a county project and then present their problem and solution in front of the staff and all citizens in an assembly. They will hear from distinguished guest speakers and experience dorm life in the Kamola Hall at CWU.

This year we plan to have a wonderful graduation on Friday at 1PM where we are encouraging the parents and family to attend along with any members of the American Legion Auxiliary. We want those who join us to see what the ALA is about so we thought this was the best time to share something we do and are a part of. These are the following ceremonies: • Candlelight (50 States honored and displayed by 50 individual citizens) • Blue Star Banner presentation • POW/MIA table presentation • Placing a poppy in the wreath (everyone participates). • Graduation
