You can **renew just as easily here**, or you might consider a **Paid Up for Life membership**. If you are not a current member, you can join simply by **clicking here**.


As I said earlier, personal contact matters. Legion Family members who are welcomed by active and engaged posts, units and squadrons in their communities are more likely to stay active.

They help us tell the world who we are, what we do, and why we matter. Each department Committee chair is required to submit via email a narrative report to the division Committee chair, plus copy the national Committee chair by May 15, 2024. Just three simple steps are needed to add your part to our national success story:

1. Department reports are limited to 1,000 words.

Hello Auxiliary,

I hope Spring if finding you all in good health, and enjoying our springtime weather.

As I said before, we do have a winner for the "dollar out of your pocket" contest. The winning unit was able to get each member to take a dollar (or more) out of their pocket.
