# ALA National President Pam Ray Visits Washington State



Newly elected **American Legion Auxiliary National President Pam Ray** traveled to Washington State on **October 9th**, flying into Spokane to begin her visit. She was joined by **ALA Department President Cindy Smith** and **Past National President Mary Davis** as they toured several Posts and Units across the region.

Their first stop was in **Reardan**, where they visited the **Joe Mann Memorial**, a meaningful project still in progress and a testament to the dedication of local Legion Family members.

On **Saturday, October 10th**, the group traveled north to **Metaline Falls Unit 144**, where the Unit President and members hosted an amazing and delicious luncheon. Auxiliary members from across **District 8**, along with **Unit 34 from Kennewick-Pasco**, came together to connect, share updates, and celebrate the work being done in their Units. One particularly inspiring moment came from the members of **Kettle Falls**, who shared the story of opening their new ALA Unit — a true example of determination, teamwork, and heart.

After departing Metaline Falls, the **Presidential Trio** continued on to **Spokane**, where they visited the **VA Medical Center** and met with **CDCE Director James** as well as ALA representatives **Jane Montaney** and **Barb Rutherford**. The day concluded at **Unit 72 in Cheney**, where members hosted a beautiful reception and dinner in President Ray's honor.

During the evening, President Ray delivered a heartfelt and inspiring speech centered around her mission theme, "Mission Driven and Family Focused." She spoke about the deep influence of her parents and shared the touching story of her late father, Clay Lofton, who registered her as an ALA member just days after her birth. As a lifelong member, President Ray reminded everyone of the Auxiliary's founding purpose — to serve veterans, military, and their families — while also emphasizing the importance of strengthening The American Legion Family.

Her visit left a lasting impression on all who attended, inspiring renewed dedication, unity, and pride among Washington's Auxiliary members.
