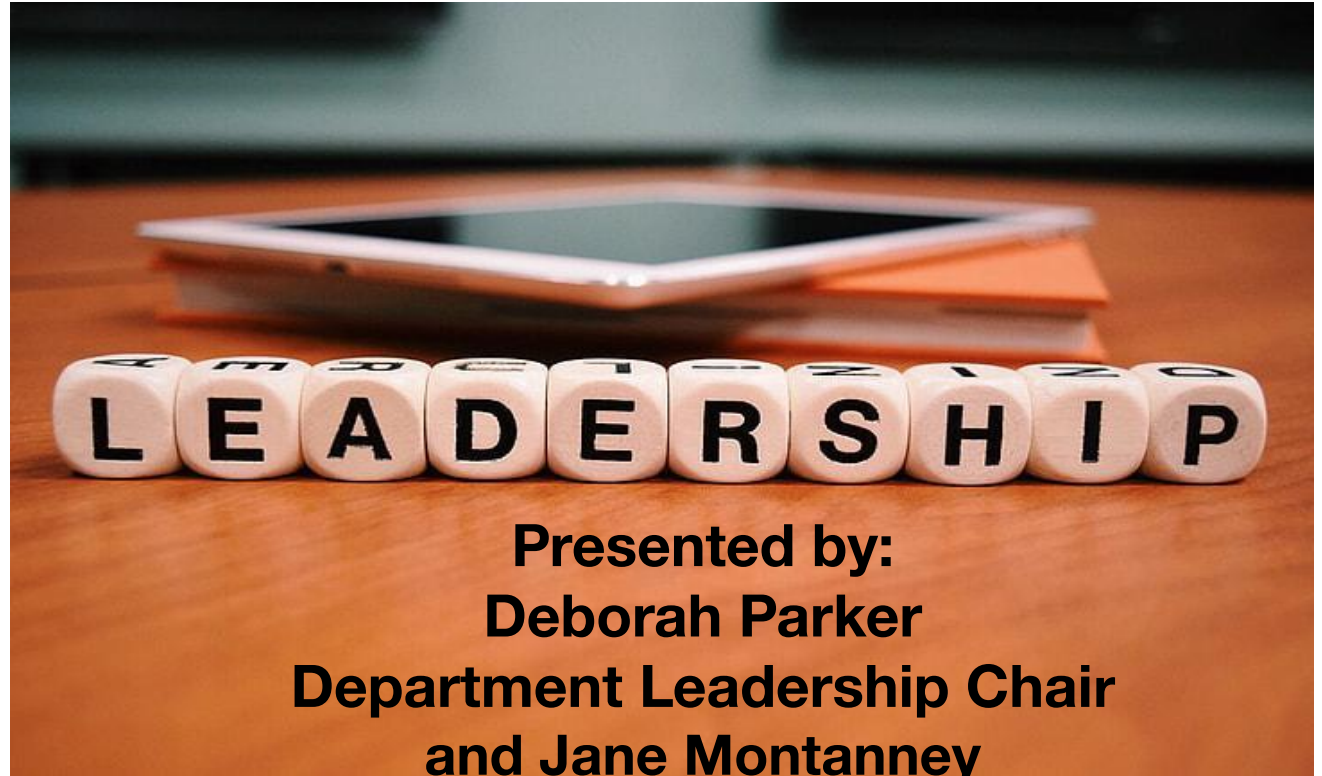

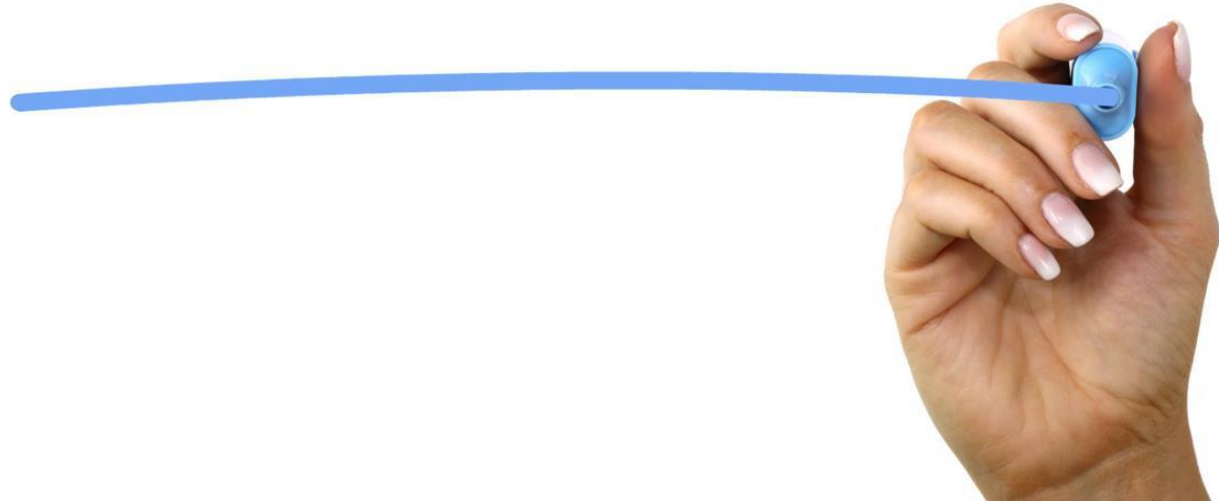

2. Chair recognizes member
3. Member states his/her motion
4. Second
5. Chair states the motion
6. Members debate the motion (Discussion)
7. Results

1. Unanimous consent
2. Voice vote
3. Rising Vote
4. Show of hands
5. Counted vote
6. Ballot or roll call
