**Month of January** - Thankfully, the month of January has been fairly non-eventful in the life of the Town business. Our main challenges have been weather occurrences which we try to manage in the safest and most cost-efficient way, January has given us a respite from handling major emergencies in or out of the office.

**Beecher Seegraves Park** - The stone slabs for the nameplates have been purchased and delivered and now await placement. The next step is pouring cement, which will be contingent on weather and temperatures. Jaramy will determine if it is wise to wait until spring.

**Town Sign** - We have a new Town sign! "Pleasant Hill" is engraved in the same Crab Orchard stone as the existing Town and Water Dept signs. We've receive permission to place the sign on the Frontier substation corner of Main Street and Rt.70. Placement will required masonry work, being donated by a local resident. This task is definitely waiting until the spring.



**Announcement** - Typically, as much as an impact the loss of even one of our citizens is to the Town, we normally do not announce the passing of our beloved residents. But this is an exception for two residents lost in these past weeks who have each made significant contribution to our community.

**Mr James Olds** who served as Mayor of Pleasant Hill from 2006-2010. In addition, after a short break after he stepped down from his Mayor post, Jim was elected back to the Town Council in 2012 to serve again as a Councilmember. Pleasant Hill owes a great debt to Mr. Olds. Even after stepping down from his post a second time in 2016, Jim acted as a legal consult to the Town when needed. Thank you to Mayor Olds, he will be greatly missed.

**Mrs. Geneva Brady** was another exceptionally prominent and long-standing citizen who was a well-known resident in our community. She volunteered over decades in a number of areas to better our community ... the Historical Society, food pantries, the Grab, Neighbors Together to just name a few. Geneva had the distinct notoriety to be one of the few remaining babies who was birthed by Doctor May Wharton. There wasn't a person who met Geneva who couldn't call her friend. A huge chunk local history was lost the day Geneva passed.

We sincerely thank both these unique souls for their contributions to our Town and community.
