LEAF REMINDER

Each homeowner is responsible for the culvert water flow on your property and to assure the culvert is operating properly. However, if there is a problem in the ditch, the Town Maintenance Crew will be glad to help by arranged appointment. Often, the culprit is the result of a clogged culvert due to packed leaves and fall debris. In the autumn, as you clean your property of leaves and yard waste, please bag it all and if you have contracted for trash pickup, place at the curb to be picked up by our Town Crew on brush day. The alternative is to discard it appropriately if you do not have service. Most importantly, it is critical not to blow leaves into the ditch as this is the major cause of your culvert clogging and backing up water.

BURNING UPDATE - STATE SAYS PERMITS NOW REQUIRED as of 9/23/19

October 15th is normally the official date set by the State where you must obtain a burn permit. This year, because of dry conditions in Cumberland County, the date has been advanced to September 23rd. However, please check with the Forestry Dept as to the current restrictions on burning <u>at the time you wish a permit</u>. Because of excessively dry conditions, the Forestry Dept is prohibiting burning on specific days. If you are uncertain of the burning guidelines, Town Hall has state literature to educate you, and we have a copy of our town ordinance for your perusal,

Many of our side offstreets and neighborhoods do not attract a great number of trick-or-treaters and this will give you the opportunity to see the children in their costumes and celebrate as a community. Let's give the kids a full experience in one place, and hopefully this will give them an alternative to running in the streets. Members of the Town Hall Staff will be coordinating the event so traffic will flow easily down Church Drive and allow the children easy access to a multitude of goodies. Reflectors on Main Street - As most are aware, the reflectors up and down Main Street were placed as a temporary safety measure until we could work out an affordable permanent solution. Our Maintenance Team was persistent, and was able to obtain a reasonable bid that striped the center yellow lines and side white lines with reflective paint. Your Town Council approved the bid, and steps to prepare for painting started right away. The reflectors were removed from both sides of Main, a street sweeper machine came through to remove stones, debris, and dirt to ready the road for painting. Finally, the painting was completed on September 24th and we have a newly marked path to guide your way!

2020 Census Update – Census workers are out and canvassing our neighborhoods. There are reports of multiple visits to the same property. As long as the census worker has their census id, they are legitimate. We just need to be patient till all the kinks are worked out.
