Pleasant Hill Hosts Spectrum Management, Speaker Sexton, Senator Bailey, and County Mayor Allen



Spectrum, part of Charter Communications, began offering high-speed internet to many homes and businesses in Pleasant Hill and the surrounding area. Most of these had not had such access before. To celebrate bringing true high-speed service to the area, Spectrum approached Town Hall about staging a celebration of what they have accomplished so far—installing 28 miles of cable. The project is part of the company's \$4.8 million federal Rural Digital Opportunity Fund grant, awarded in 2021 by the Federal Communications Commission. The program included up to \$16.4 billion in phase one and will include at least \$4.4 billion in the second phase. Speaker Cameron Sexton and Senator Paul Bailey helped ensure that internet improvement projects in Tennessee expanded broadband coverage instead of just funding improvements in urban areas. And of course, everyone in Cumberland County is grateful to County Mayor Allen Foster for making broadband extension a key campaign plank and his tireless work to help bring it about.

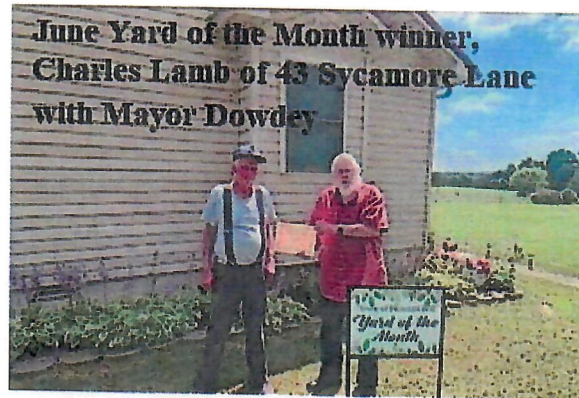
