





Does Function Follow Form?

A book review by Nena Denman

Horses have performed many functions for man over the millennium from plowing to pleasure. Have you ever wondered why some horses perform better at certain tasks than others? Deb Bennett, PhD, who worked for the Smithsonian Institution and found the Equine Studies Institute, provides answers to these and other questions in her book, <u>Principles of Conformation Analysis: Vol. I, II, & III</u>, as she analyzes how equine anatomy affects performance and harmony

Written over several years, each of the three volumes in the text focuses on different aspects of the biological principles of horse construction and action. Volume One presents information about conformation or bone structure and explains that movement is based on anatomy, not pedigree. Positive and negative structures are analyzed. Volume Two concentrates on different parts of the horse's anatomy (back, neck, forequarters, etc.) and how to evaluate them. The third volume is divided into two parts, hindquarters and head. In each volume, examples of differing qualities of each body segment are presented through pictures, descriptions, and performance analysis.

Dr. Bennett's guide will help riders, trainers, and buyers understand why some horses may be prone to injury while others excel at a certain discipline such as dressage, reining, running, or jumping. Although the text is very technical, the information provided will contribute to the knowledge base all horsemen and horsewomen can develop as they participate in the equine world.


As a past rider and trainer and current judge, I found this book to be helpful in analyzing both the horses I worked with and the horses I have been asked to evaluate. Since reading the information presented by the author, I am more able to communicate the basis for scores I give when judging both under-saddle performance and in-hand sport-horse classes. I highly recommend this text to anyone interested in learning more about how form affects function as pertaining to horses and riders.

Article Review: Show-Jumping Warm-Up Strategies That Work

The third phase of eventing, Show-Jumping, often decides the blue ribbon. After the precision of dressage and the thrill of cross country, it all comes down to your show-jumping round and confidence in your preparation is crucial. This article by U.S. eventer, Buck Davidson, and coach Silvio Mazzoni gives you tips on how to warm up for a successful show-jumping round.

Summary:

Prepare at home so you know your horse an can plan for variables you may encounter on the day of show jumping. For instance, does your horse tire easily, does weather affect his attitude, is she excited or exhausted after cross country day? Does your horse need 10 jumps or 20 jumps to be ready for the ring?

Buck describes warm up details and different strategies for three of his horses. This approach is helpful since there is likely a key point in this article that fits your horse.

The warm-ups address each horse's specific idiosyncrasies, weaknesses and/or strengths. One horse totally knows his job and doesn't need many jumps before he is ready for the ring, another needs to focus on straightness, and another is sensitive and needs little leg pressure. The article wraps up with some good advice for Novice and Training division rides.

The White Stallion of Lipizza

Thank you, Marguerite Henry!

Like so many other riders, since as far back as I can remember, I have always loved horses. I was raised, however, in an apartment in a Slavic neighborhood in Chicago, and my family was focused on dance, not horseback riding. My parents used to joke that I must have inherited a gene from a distant Cossack ancestor. The only contact I had with horses was on the pony ride at the zoo or when my father took me to a horseshow at the amphitheater. In order to learn more about horses, I read each book in every library near my home. Walter Farley (The Black Stallion), Clarence William Anderson (Billy and Blaze), Anna Sewell (Black Beauty), and Enid Bagnold (National Velvet) were my gurus. However, the author I learned the most from was Marguerite Henry. Not only did she explain many different aspects of the relationship between people and horses, she took me around the world at the same time. I traveled from the shores of the eastern seacoast in Misty of Chincoteague to the streets of Sienna, Italy, in Gaudenzia, Pride of the Palio, all while reading in the window seat of my apartment. Fortunately, I have been able to actually visit most of the locations of her different books (Morocco is on my Bucket List). However, of all her books, one of my favorites is White Stallion of Lipizza.

If you are looking for the perfect gift for a young rider, boy or girl, or want to escape from your day-to-day existence, this book is the answer. The story is set in Vienna, Austria. A young baker's son, Hans, works hard to fulfill his dream of becoming a Riding Master at the Spanish Riding School and executing airs above the ground. Diligence and effort are rewarded as he reaches his goal.

Not only does <u>White Stallion of Lipizza</u> contain an interesting story and setting, it focuses on the basis for our IaDCTA's reason for existence, dressage training. The progression of development for both horse and rider are explained. Readers are taken from the breeding farm in Piber to the halls of the riding school in the royal Hofburg Palace.

Terms, that are specific to dressage, are presented and described. The illustrations by Wesley Dennis, in both black and white and color, clarify understanding. Dressage is presented as a disciplined training method that results in stellar performance.


