

A: Log into the USDF website. Find a course you are interested and start the course online. Then at the end there is a little quiz for you to take based on what you just learned.


Q: What does it cost?


Pictured Below: Middle River Ranch located near Winterset, IA has completed a new indoor arena.



Regional Schooling Show Awards Program Rules

General Information:

- Program year is December 1 through November 30.
 Scores may be earned in any USDF region.
 Late nominations, applications and results submissions will not be accepted.

Rider Eligibility & Requirements:

- Rider must have a USDF Group Membership that is recorded by the Group Member Organization (GMO) at the time the scores are earned.
- 2. Riders affiliated with an International GMO must declare a USDF region.
- 3. Owner must have at least a USDF non-member number at the time the scores are earned.
- 4. Horse must have at least a USDF Horse Identification Number at the time the scores are earned
- 5. Rider must submit a one-time yearly online nomination and \$35 nomination fee for each horse/rider combination no later than 14 days after the last day of the first competition. The nomination fee must be paid annually.
- 6. Riders may change their division status during the program year. A rider's status will be determined at the end of the program year.7. Rider must submit scores to USDF online no later than 21 days after the last day of the
- competition
- Only USDF members in good standing are eligible to compete in the USDF Regional Schooling Show Awards Program and receive awards.

Award Divisions & Levels: 1. Four award divisions will be recognized per region:

- a. Open: from the beginning of the calendar year the rider reaches age 22, not a USEF Adult Amateur (AA), not a non-professional.
- b. Junior/Young Rider (Jr/YR): up until the end of the calendar year the rider reaches age 21
- c. AA: from the beginning of the calendar year the rider reaches age 22 and possess a current USEF AA card
- d. Non-Professional: from the beginning of the calendar year the rider reaches age 22, not a current USEF AA, not a professional.
- 2. Seven levels (freestyle, pas de deux and quadrille not included) will be recognized per division. Exception: only 6 levels are recognized in the open division: a. Introductory (only in Jr/YR, AA and non-professional divisions) b. Training

 - d. Second
 - e. Third f. Fourth

 - g. FEI combination of Prix St. Georges, Intermediate I, Intermediate II and Grand Prix scores.

- 3. Equivalencies listed in the current USDF Member Guide are eligible. Tests not listed as
- equivalencies will not be eligible.
- Preliminary standings will be ranked using a median of all eligible scores and will be available on the USDF website.
 Final awards standings will be based on the rider's region of primary residence in the USDF database as of November 30.

Score requirements:

- Introductory Level: a. Must have a minimum of five scores

 - b. From three different judgesc. From three different competitions
- Training through Fourth Levels (levels may not be combined to meet requirements):

 Must have a minimum of five scores
 From three different judges

 - c. From three different competitions
 d. At least one score must be earned from the highest test of the level
- FEI Level (levels may be combined to meet requirements):

 Must have a minimum of four scores
 From three different judges
 - - From three different competitions C.

- Prizes:

 Up to ten placings per division/level will be recognized.
 Ribbons will be mailed to the rider.
 Ribbons will be available online.
- <u>Competition Management Requirements:</u>

 Any non-USEF-licensed/non-USDF-recognized competition may participate.
 To participate, competition management must submit online application and \$25 participation fee to USDF at least 30 days prior to the start date of the competition.

 - The prize list must be submitted to USDF no later than 14 ways price sector.
 Competition judges must be one of the following:

 Current USDF L Graduate, with or without distinction (highly recommend USDF L Graduates with distinction), which has met USDF continuing education requirements
 Costs Sport training USDF L Graduates with distinction are eligible to judge FEI

 classes
 - b. USEF or FEI-licensed or retired dressage judge.
 - 5. FEI classes must be judged by USEF or FEI-licensed or retired dressage judges or USDF L Graduates with distinction
 - 6. Competition arenas must be in compliance with US Equestrian DR 126 for level 1
 - competitions. Competition results must be submitted to USDF via the USDF Electronic Results Submission Standard (ERSS) format (using the USEF Universal Spreadsheet Template) no later than 21 days from the end date of the competition.

Article Review: Betsy Steiner's Thirty Minute Warm-Up

It was adapted from The Total Thirty-Minute Warm-Up Practical Horseman, December 1995

How do you warm up your horse? Do you do something different for a casual ride, a lesson, or for a show? This article provides a consistent and thoughtful warm-up divided into two 15-minute segments that will work for all levels of training. If you are like me and tend to get distracted by almost anything during warm-up, this article will help get you more focused! It also includes reminders of those basic riding skills that sometimes get stuffed in the back of your head.

If you find this quick summary interesting, check out the full article (link above) that provides useful and easily understood details to help you organize and ride your thirty-minute warm-up.

Summary:

First 15 minutes: Supple and Stretch. Five minutes of walk and ten minutes of trot/canter

Steiner has the rider begin with a 20 meter circle using a "half-long" rein and followed by a regular, shorter rein length. Steiner gives tips on checking your position and listening to the responsiveness of the horse to your aids. Through a series of trot/canter transitions, Steiner instructs the rider to ask several questions to assess progress of the warm up. The goal of the first 15 minutes is to have a horse soft in the rein and moving from behind (in a relaxed way) through all the muscles over his back and neck...

Second 15 minutes: Balance and Move Him Together. Five minutes of walk and ten minutes of walk/trot

During this second part of the warm up, the focus turns to responsiveness to leg aids by increasing and decreasing circle size. The rider then asks the horse for more transitions and leg yields. Steiner gives you pointers on body position and ways to adjust the warm up if the horse becomes heavy or strong. The goal is to have the horse balanced, forward and responsive.


