Treasurer's Report: Presented by Laird N. Congratulations to the graduates of 2010 including Molly Foley. Ending working balance \$6,728.11. Total Reserves \$6,640.97. Total Bank Balance \$13,369.08.

President's Report: Presented by Laird N.

***Membership-** 106 active members as of May 4, 2010. The website is staying very active. Have had many inquiries about training and boarding farms in the area. The board would like to publish a list of names, addresses, phone numbers, and websites to give to individuals who ask about such places. Everyone is staying updated with the calendar. Show results are being published as fast as the club can get them.

Committee Reports:

***Education-** Reserved Dr. Christine Woodford for the 29th of October. The education seminar to go with the Championship show. Will touch the subjects of biomechanics, acupuncture, and chiropractics. Also talked to Susan Harris who does the "Visible Horse/Rider". She combines it with centered riding. Usually does a 2-day clinic with 20 riders per day. \$300 to reserve a date. Putting a survey together for the club to see who would be interested in such an event. Also talked about having a "Dinner with the Judge" educational event/get together. Watch videos with a judge, and they talk about what they are looking for and attendees can score along with them.

***Fundraising-** The committee has been in contact with other local breed organizations. Currently at about \$1,200.00 for fundraising. Marcia has been working very hard on getting new people but also using people from the past who have graciously donated. There are a few businesses and people who have said that they cannot help this year but to please contact them again next year. Idea of possible pickup truck donation (for the weekend) to have judges sit in them. Getting some canvas bags to fill with fun items for the Classic officials. Add biographies of the judges and other officials to add to the Classic show program.

Old Business:

***2010-2011 Classics Update-** Currently only have 8 entries. Many of the show secretaries are saying that competitors are waiting until the last minute to get entries in. Have gotten more breed awards. Ordered all the awards for the Classics. Idea to have an IaDCTA Club and Classic Competitor Party the Saturday night of the Classics. Many board members are looking into options. Really sent out the first call for volunteers. Will have two rings so need twice the amount of volunteers.

***2010 Schooling Show Series:**

***July Schooling Show-** The club will run a 2-phase schooling show at Middle River Ranch in Winterset on July 31st since the dressage schooling show will not be held at the Fantasy Series at Maffitt Lake Equestrian Center. The club is in need of someone to manage the schooling show held at MRR and some volunteers. If interested, please contact one of the board members.

***May 8th Wrap Up-** The club lost a little money due to the cost of renting the facility. Overall it was a well-run show, and even though the weather was not the best, the majority of the competitors left happy. It was brought up about possibly renting the other hunter ring to warm up in instead of the huge warm up arena to save costs on future schooling shows.

***Championship Show(s)-** Working on a budget and hoping to break even. Getting sponsors is difficult with the time of the show and also that the club has been asking for sponsors for the Classics, and, as soon as the Classics are over, the club will be out looking for sponsors for the championship shows. No alcohol allowed on the college campus. All the officials are from Iowa. The jumps are coming together along with a good start to volunteers. The Iowa Lipizzaner Association is planning on really helping with the whole event. They are local so it really helps. Hoping to have lots of vendors throughout the weekend because vending spots are very affordable. If interested in being a vendor, please contact Rachel Wehrheim. Also brought up the idea of having a time for people to bring their horses for sale into the arena for people to see. Maybe not this year but definitely a possibility for the future if the championship show works out like the club hopes.

***Herwig Radnetter Clinic-** There will be advertising in the Classics program for the clinic. The clinic is filling up so anyone who would like a spot needs to contact Rachel Wehrheim. Everything is coming along very smoothly.

New Business:

JUNIOR MEMBER NEWS

CONRAD SCHUMACHER CLINIC

I had the privilege of auditing the Conrad Schumacher clinic at Providence Farm in Palmyra, Nebraska.

Conrad Schumacher is like the Beethoven of classical dressage. When you listen to him you are inspired by his knowledge and how much his impact on the horse and rider is. His exercises are calculated and precise for the pair he is teaching.

Schumacher is not a person to let a little slip-up go. You do it until you do it correctly. If your horse is stiff in the neck, there is an exercise. If they are hard in the mouth, you volte. Whatever your small problem is, he will fix it. I have done some of his exercises with my trainer long before I ever saw him, and they work like a charm, but after seeing him teach I have a whole new vocabulary of exercises to help me with little glitches. The effect on the horses last long after Schumacher is gone. If you do the movements and think of what he said, you are bound for greatness.

Though I have not ridden with Conrad Schumacher, I have simply ridden better after I watched him. His catchy sayings, such as halt like a monument, and perfect logic stick in your head and inspire you to go above and beyond your expectations. 


The Iowa Lipizzan Association, Inc. and the Iowa Dressage & Combined Training Association are pleased to announce "The Return of Radnetter."


