MINUTES - OCTOBER

The monthly board meeting for the lowa Dressage and Combined Training Association was called to order on October 14, 2014 at 6:33 p.m.

Members present were: Nena Denman, Sharon Malmberg, Chris Gutierrez, Danielle Baker, Barb Zukowski, PJ Koehler, and Katie Barrowcliff.

Members not present were: Tammy Llsi and Sherie Vermeer.

Motion to approve the agenda was made by Nena and seconded by Chris.

Motion to approve September's meeting minutes was made by Chris and seconded by Danielle.

Motion to approve September's treasurer's report was made by Danielle and seconded by Sharon.

The Championship show at the end of October was discussed. It was agreed upon that the concession stand would be open from 11:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. on both Saturday and Sunday. Saturday morning would be the Championship classes followed by the schooling show with the awards ceremony, games, and food that night. Sunday would be any over flow from the schooling show, with combined training and jumping to follow.

The March schooling show will be held March 20-22, 2015 at the lowa Equestrian Center as an adult day camp. A clinic will be held on Friday and Saturday, and the schooling show on Sunday. Matt McLaughlin has been confirmed as the clinician and judge for all 3 days. Various other demonstrations were discussed. Ideas brought up were Larry Bradley in the small warm up and experts on horse nutrition and chiropractic care, and rider fitness.

A clinic for Western Dressage was discussed to be held possibly in May. Clinicians for the event were discussed.

The annual meeting menu and prices will remain the same. The meeting is January 4, 2015 at the Des Moines Golf and Country Club.

Judges and dates for the Classics have been secured. Dates are: Jun 13-14, 2015; June 18-19 2016; and June 17-18, 2017. Pheasant Ridge Veterinary Clinic will donate their time to next year's show.

The club is exploring advertising ideas. Discussion was held to share ad space in the USDF Connection and Dressage Today magazine with Maffitt Lake, as well as a space with the Nebraska Horse Expo.

Maffitt Lake would like to have a recognized show series and wants to include the Classics show as part of their high point award. This would take place in 2015 season.

The website is back to Club Express.

New guidelines are being made for year end and championship awards to take effect in 2015. A notice will be put in the Collection to check the website for updates as they are made.

A packet will be sent out to members shortly. It will contain a survey, year-end banquet reservation form, membership form, absentee ballot, and proposed award guidelines.

Next meeting will be November 10, 2014 at 6:30 p.m. at Okoboji Bar and Grill in Newton.

Motion to adjourn was made by Barb and seconded by Nena. Meeting adjourned at 7:59 p.m.

IaDCTA Awards

The IaDCTA Awards program is designed to recognize achievement of those riders who consistently earn good scores and advances their riding level, and encourages a high standard of horsemanship in Dressage, Combined Training, and Western Dressage at IaDCTA-approved shows.

Guidelines for All Awards

- Only Scores from IaDCTA Recognized Dressage, Combined Training, and Western Dressage Shows will be counted towards IaDCTA Awards.
- Rider of the horse must be an IaDCTA member at the time qualifying scores are earned.
- Each Horse must be registered at the time qualifying scores are earned.
- A Rider may only qualify to win at two consecutive levels on the same horse, but Riders may qualify as many Horses as they wish.
- 5. If Riders share a Horse, the Horse will be limited to four rides per day at two consecutive levels, and only one Horse and Rider combination per level or class.
- A protective ASTM approved hard hat with chin harness must be worn when mounted regardless of rider's age or level of competency.
- A Rider is not allowed to enter more than 1 division. (i.e., cannot enter Open and AA.)
 Definitions of Rider Divisions:
 - A. Adult Amateur (AA): for Dressage, competitors shall compete as Adults from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach age 22 (USEF rules GR101).
 - Open division is for professionals as described by USEF rules GR1306.
 - C. Young Riders (JR/YR) are 21 and under.
 - D. Junior 14 (JR14) are 14 years and under.
- 8. Dressage and Western Dressage Scores must be equal to or greater than 58.000% to count towards IaDCTA Awards. Combined Training Results will be submitted as a placing for the class and awarded points towards a minimum point total to qualify for IaDCTA Awards.
- Complete one type of service per Rider. Volunteer hours can only be earned by IaDCTA members, and gifted to other IaDCTA members.
 - Complete 7 hours of volunteer time at IaDCTA Recognized events.
 - B. Recruit 4 new members to IaDCTA.
 - C. Donate \$200.00 cash to IaDCTA.
- 10. The IaDCTA Show Series Year runs from January $\mathbf{1}^{st}$ to October 31st. (2014 Championship Schooling Show results counts towards 2015 awards.)
- Championship rides (IaDCTA, Regional, or other Championships) do not count towards.
