

President's Corner

We Asked and You Answered: 2010 IaDCTA Board Priorities By Laird Nossuli, President

On behalf of the new 2010 IaDCTA board, I'd like to thank all of you who responded to the membership survey we sent through email in mid-January. You certainly provided us with plenty of invaluable feedback, which we discussed over a bunch of pizzas for nearly 4 hours at our first board meeting. The opinions, new ideas and concerns we gathered from your responses gave us exactly what we needed to establish our priorities for the coming year. We are excited about IaDCTA's plans for 2010 and we hope you will be, too.

As we reviewed all of the feedback from the surveys, some very common themes emerged. It was very clear that you thought we needed to improve in fulfilling these very integral parts of our mission: "to encourage and support interest in dressage and combined training by providing educational opportunities, competitions and information." When you read the summary of the survey, you will see that there were many great ideas about how to do that. Yet, as we all know from our own personal, professional and "horsey" lives, it is not always possible to implement every idea or fix every problem all at once. Thus, we determined that the following initiatives will be our top priorities for the coming year:

Developing a well-organized, comprehensive and affordable schooling show series that upholds the same training and horsemanship standards as the recognized shows. When you review the tentative calendar for this year's schooling show series, you'll see that we have chosen facilities with adequate parking, good footing, stabling, warm-up areas and regulation-size competition arenas for our shows. Although IaDCTA will still be managing a few of the schooling shows, including the "Warm-Up to the Classic" on May 8 at MLEC and a Championship show at the end of the season, we decided to partner with Canterbrook Equestrian Center, Maffitt Lake, Winds Reach, and Catalpa Corner to recognize their dressage shows and horse trials as part of our schooling show series. In addition, we are creating stricter guidelines for our schooling show judges, competitors and spectators that will reflect many of the same standards followed by the USDF, USEA and USEF.

Providing members more opportunities to learn about dressage and combined training through an established educational calendar, including clinics, lectures and symposia. The first lectures/discussions for the year will be about show preparation and etiquette, and a volunteer training session that will explain tasks and duties of various volunteer positions. Board member Vicki Gatter will be the chairperson of the Education Committee. She welcomes your ideas for potential topics and suggestions for clinicians.

Improving communication through our website and *The Collection*. We are in the process of creating a new website – www.iadcta.org – which will allow for more interaction from and between members, including a discussion forum, the ability to submit feedback electronically, and an online membership directory accessible only by members. The survey provided a wide range of interesting opinions about the content, design and delivery method of The Collection. We still plan to make it available in print, electronic and web-page editions. However, we are developing an editorial calendar and standardizing the format to make sure that the information (articles and photos) we're providing is relevant to our mission and our sport. We also intend to better utilize the Collection and the website for educational purposes, and to improve the timeliness of all of our communication, including the event calendar, news from the Board and results from shows.

Creating more opportunities for member involvement. One of the most positive themes revealed by the survey feedback was a strong desire among all members to have more opportunities to interact and support each other. To help build that camaraderie, we plan to provide more social opportunities and to focus on building an organized, knowledgeable team of volunteers that truly involves all of our members. Whether you are a boarder or own your own farm, want to show only at recognized shows or prefer to do your dressage training in your backyard, are new to the sport or have many years of experience, we want YOU to be involved.

You will learn more about the specifics of these initiatives as they continue to evolve throughout the year. In addition to these four broad initiatives, we are dedicated to making the 2010 Iowa Dressage Classics one of the best recognized shows in our region. As a board, we take our responsibility for leadership seriously. We asked your opinions and you answered. While we can't please everybody, we hope that these priorities reflect what the majority of you think and want for the future. Remember this: the only way that the club can continue to grow in the right direction is for you to stay involved – by giving us your feedback, by volunteering and by participating in our events. We are all members of IaDCTA because we love our horses and our sport. Let's build on that shared interest to make the most out of 2010.

Stabling fees need only be paid once. Rides may be scheduled from early morning through evening each day. Entries taken based on postmark and may close early if shows are full. Remaining entries received will be placed on a wait list based on postmark.

Refunds: Before closing date, all fees minus office charge. After closing date, entry fees only refunded if original veterinary or doctor certificate is received by the secretary prior to the start of the show. No refund of stabling or office fees after the closing date.

Awards: Ribbons to 6 places and prize for classes with 3 or more entries per division. **Divisions:** (JR/AA/Open) may be run concurrently as one class. Divisions will be pinned separately. No separate awards for Qualifying classes. Special awards such as breed and member will be given- proof of registration will be required. All awards will be given at the show. **Jackpot classes:** Jackpots will be offered for First Level Test 4 (112) on Saturday and Training Level Test 4 (208) on Sunday. Additional fee (see FEES) applies and requirements are as follows:

Enter and ride at least one other test of the level on either Saturday or Sunday.

Enter and ride in the designated test. Payback will be 100% of the fees collected. Jackpot divisions are JR/AA and Open. Highest score awarded 50%, 2nd highest 30%, 3rd highest 20%

Arena: Outdoor s and mix show arenas and warm up. Intro through Training 3 may be in the small arena (20m X 40m). Training 4 and higher will be in the large arena (20m X 60m). Schooling may be permitted in the competition arena weather permitting until approximately 9 PM Friday and Saturday evenings. Longing is allowed only in the designated longing area.

Directions: I35 to Exit 65 at Cumming/Norwalk. Head West on Cumming Road for 1 mile. Turn North on Woodland Ave. Drive 2 miles North to dead-end of Woodland, MLEC is on the corner of 105th and Woodland.

Policies: A negative Coggins (EIA) Report within 12 months is required for all horses on grounds. The state of Iowa mandates horses transported from another state must have a valid Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.

Dogs must be leashed at all times.

Trailer and vehicle parking in designated areas only – violators may be towed at their own expense.
