



# **MINUTES - MAY**

Meeting was called to order at 6:38pm on May 12, 2014.

Motion approving April's board meeting minutes was made by Sherie and seconded by Sharon.

Motion to approve April's treasurer's report was made by Sherie and seconded by PJ.

Biosecurity for the 2014 Classics was discussed. Horses will be required to have a health certificate dated within 7 days of the show along with a Coggins. Any concerns about an ill horse will be checked out by the show vet at the owner's expense. Disinfectant and hand sanitizer will be available during the show.

A discussion was held about applying to be an affiliate of Stateline Tack. We would post their link on our website and any purchases made through our site would result in Stateline donating a percentage of the sale back to us.

A clarification was made concerning year end award eligibility. Effective immediately, members must either volunteer for 7 hours or bring in 4 new memberships or donate \$200 cash to go to the general fund to be eligible.

The schooling show at Tamarack Stables will be on August 10, not the 3rd.

There is still an opening for the Matt McLaughlin clinic. Auditors are still welcome.

Meeting was adjourned at 8:11pm.

The next meeting will be on June 30, 2014 at 6:30pm at the Okoboji Bar and Grill in Newton.

## From Molly Foley;

I had the opportunity to participate as a rider in the Matt McLaughlin Clinic put on by the IaDCTA and I had such a great experience. Matt was an awesome teacher and was a very easy to listen to and understand throughout both of my rides. He did a great job of explaining what he was asking of both the horse and rider and made sure we understood what he wanted us to accomplish in each of the exercises. His ability to connect the two lessons on Saturday and Sunday was also extremely helpful and really made a difference when it came to practicing at home after the clinic. His take-home messages were easy to remember and have already made an improvement to my riding as I prepare for recognized shows this summer. Thanks to Barb Zukowski and the IaDCTA for putting together a wonderful clinic with Matt McLaughlin. I hope to see him back in Iowa soon!

#### From PJ Koehler:

Only a paragraph to describe my experience riding with Matt McLaughlin in the May Clinic seems hardly enough as I think a book might hold what I learned. I was riding Scott Vissser's Nick who is a coming four year old Arab/Trakehner cross. My goal was to get Nick off my leg and carrying himself more. Matt helped me work on 'forward intent". We spent time repeating leg aid, voice aid (as in CLUCK) then whip aid until finally Nick would show his "forward intent" from the leg without waiting for the follow up aids. At the beginning of the first day I would be out of breath from just trotting a couple of 20 M circles – I was working harder than my horse. At the end of the second day Nick was doing the work and I was getting to enjoy the ride. We even got to cleaner up transitions to canter and more forward down transitions. Our last exercise was doing some work on a circle in the walk on two tracks with shoulders on the inside track to start helping Nick engage on his inside hind leg. I have homework for some ground work and lunging in side reins and feel extremely fortunate for having this opportunity to ride with Matt here in IA. And I am excited that I was able to sign up for another clinic with Matt in NE in July. I encourage the club to bring Matt back and anyone who didn't come in May you will not want to miss if there is another chance to ride with Matt.

## **And From Tammy Lisi:**

I am very picky about who I ride my "non-traditional" horses with. I knew that Matt would be a great person to ride with based on his background but he surpassed my expectations. Everyone who missed this clinic completely missed the boat.

Some topics Matt covered included: biomechanical differences between breeds, how to advance to the next level, tips on showing, and challenging every rider to do better. There were no platitudes at this clinic, you earned every "nicely done" you got. As I watched all the riders in the clinic progress in their work I couldn't help but be struck by the fact that he worked equally hard with everyone from the fearful beginner to the advanced rider.

My lesson focused on creating a better connection to allow my horse to swing through her back more. While the level of connection seemed acceptable for this mare I needed more. This improved my lateral work, as well as the lengthening of the gaits that the baroque breeds often struggle with. We also worked on further improving her canter as well as moving the Spanish walk into passage.

Thanks to Barb for implementing this great clinic, to Palisade's Equestrian Estates for hosting, and to IaDCTA for having a clinic of this caliber.

# **DINNER WITH MATT**

On May 16 - 18, 2014 the IaDCTA Education Committee hosted an educational opportunity for the club at Palisade's Equestrian Center in Prole, IA. This was a clinic and dinner with nationally renowned Clinician and Rider Matt McLaughlin. After a lovely custom catered meal Matt had the opportunity to speak with a small group consisting of the riders and the clinic organizer. Sadly no other club members were in attendance at this educational opportunity. I found the information from the dinner lecture especially interesting and valuable and am writing this article to share that information with others who did not attend.

Matt's topic of discussion was "When to Move up the Levels".

First on the table was a discussion around the training pyramid. When asked about this those of us present were actually able to build a correct training pyramid with rhythm and relaxation on the bottom followed by connection, impulsion, straightness and finally at the top collection. So then Matt was able to lead us through a discussion of each layer of the pyramid and at which dressage level we begin to see the layers come into play. For example rhythm is inherent in all levels but when starting out we must have correct rhythm in order to have a solid foundation to build on. Within rhythm are sub-elements like tempo and pace. Tempo is the timing of the foot falls as in quick, slow, uneven and pace is within a gait such as medium, working, extended. Steady rhythm leads to relaxation and a rider can impact that by how they use their body for example slowing the posting rhythm can slow the tempo of the trot and thus help the horse become more relaxed. Connection is developing in training level when the horse begins to accept the contact and after accepting contact can begin to develop and improve impulsion.

While discussing straightness Matt gave us the three types of straightness which was not something I had heard put in these terms before. First is straight line which is most basic as seen in a change of rein across the diagonal this is simply traveling on a line from one point to the next. Second is straight spine which references the straightness of the horse's spine so is the horse straight...or are his haunches or shoulders somewhere else? Last is straight between the aids and this is important when we are not on a straight line but we need the horse to remain in balance as we travel a curved line or as we ask him to travel laterally. In all instances we as riders have to manage the straightness and using the base of the pyramid below us will help us to get to correct straightness.

At the top of the pyramid is collection which can only come by building the horse through all the other layers of the pyramid. Steady rhythm, relaxation, well connected, self-carriage and true straightness will lead easily to balanced collection. Sometimes one can slow the tempo then increase impulsion resulting in what is called amplitude or expression. It all comes down to the simple and true definition of dressage which is training.

Last but not at all least Matt discussed the tests. He asked us "what is the purpose of the test you are riding"? You know...that box at the top of EVERY dressage test that starts out "Purpose: ..."? Although some of us could somewhat paraphrase the purpose of the tests we were riding not one of us had it committed to memory. I can ride my test from memory but I can't tell you word for word the purpose of the test. Matt admonished us to commit to memory the purpose for each test we ride. Understanding the purpose is paramount in understanding the test. Purpose starts in the USDF Introductory Dressage tests where it reads:

**PURPOSE:** To introduce the rider and/or horse to the sport of dressage. To show understanding of riding the horse forward with a steady tempo into an elastic contact with independent, steady hands and a correctly balanced seat. To show proper geometry of figures in the arena with correct bend (corners and circles). And continues all the way through the USEF Levels for example Second Level reads:

**Purpose:** To confirm that the horse, having achieved the thrust required in First Level, now accepts more weight on the hindquarters (collection); moves with an uphill tendency, especially in the medium gaits; and is reliably on the bit. A greater degree of straightness, bending, suppleness, thoroughness, balance and self-carriage is required than at First Level.

So I encourage you all to go to read, learn and understand the purpose of your tests.

But that is not enough says Matt. You also need to understand the directives of the tests. Huh? What? Where? The directives are found in a column immediately to the right of the column your reader is calling out to you. The reader is telling you your "pattern" but your directives are telling you what the judge is looking for within the pattern you are riding. It also starts at Introductory and continues all the way through the levels. The directives are your clues on how to improve what your horse is doing. So in training test two it is not simply "A enter working trot, X halt, salute, proceed working trot"...it is also "Straightness on centerline and in halt; immobility; quality of trot; willing and balanced transitions". In addition to understanding and knowing your purpose for the test you also need to understand the directives and you can use this to improve the quality of your ride and thus your scores.

Also the movements of the tests throughout the levels are designed to help you develop your horse and thus move up the levels. You should be schooling at home at least a full level above what you are showing and you may even school some movements two or three levels above where you are showing. It should be easy for you and your horse at the show. Challenge yourself more at home and make the show a little easier and take off some of the pressure. If you are stuck on something within a level you may find that a movement from a higher level can ease you through that sticky item. A training level horse can use a little leg yield on a circle to develop better lateral suppleness to help with the changes of bend in the trot loops for training test 3. Shoulder in and smaller circles in the trot can help engage the inside hind and improve canter transitions.

So this is in a bit of a nut shell version of the after dinner talk with Matt McLaughlin on "When to Move up the Levels". Oh, it didn't actually tell you when. We learned how to use the pyramid to develop our horses and how to use the tests to create a good ride and further develop our horses. But it is up to each individual and their horse and using these tools to find the appropriate dressage level. Horses and riders are all individuals and the pieces of the puzzle don't all fit together the same for everyone. If you weren't there you missed a great discussion and I hope I have adequately imparted some of what we learned.


