Meeting called to Order @ 6:50 p.m. on February 2, 2012.

Treasurer's Report: Total Income \$6,312, Total Expenses \$3,411.61. Net Income for January \$2900.39. \$40 was moved from working balance to the Betsy Coester Grant fund. New Working Balance \$11,278.20, Reserve Balance \$7,130.97. Bank Balance is \$12,809.17, CD \$5,600. Total of all accounts \$18,409.17. Motion to approve the January Treasurer's report made by Heather McCauley, motion seconded by Stana, all in favor.

President's Report: <u>Handbooks</u> are no longer available for purchase for \$5 on the website due to cost prohibited to sell, but handbook is now available for download on the website. <u>Membership Update:</u> Rachel is working with Trudy to streamline the process of updating memberships and getting on the website. Trudy to send the report weekly. <u>Website Updates:</u> Everything is current on the website as of now.

Old Business

<u>Proposed new classes</u>. PJ Koehler presented ideas for new class to be offered at our shows.

- Sport horse in hand classes Judged on horse so breeders can bring their horses out to be evaluated.
- Under saddle classes a group class "suitable to be a dressage horse" and to split the dressage eq. classes into walk /trot and walk/trot/canter classes.
- Add a lower fence level fence to 12" for eventing/jumping classes.

A motion was passed to add the under saddle classes to the championship schooling show in October. The sport horse in had class was voted down due to the need to have a specialized judge for a recognized show and for schooling shows the breeders can show in the Handler in hand classes H.C. to get experience with their young horses in the arena. The 12" jump height was voted down due to lack of interest in that class.

Annual Banquet/Silent Auction

The awards banquet was a great time and the food was excellent, but despite Gloria's contacts and special deals we still lost money on the meals. To keep ticket prices down for the members board had agreed to cover the additional costs. A banquet committee has been established for the 2013 banquet. Committee volunteers include Heather, Sherie, and Dawn. Stana will assist in gathering information.

Silent auction brought in \$1195 towards awards. Many people volunteered to donate generously. THANK YOU!! We would like to continue having awards fundraisers such as calendars and clothing sales.

For the Classics, Sherie is considering purchasing Bridle Bags. For championships, possibly saddle pads and year end awards possibly coolers.

2012 awards

Scores will be submitted by October 6th for championship and year end awards. There will be on ongoing message in *The Collection* to improve wards preparedness.

Insurance

Insurance premium renewal quote was up to \$848 from \$666. We are working to shop for a cheaper price next year. We have been in contact with Rick Reger, a prominent sponsor of our classics and championship shows to assist us with our insurance needs.

<u>Money handling</u> We will be creating a form for collecting money at future events to make the treasurer's job easier in documenting the allocation of funds, especially when they are received in cash.

Education committee

- Currently we have 12 people registered for the Dr Freya Schafer Clinic.
- Volunteer training Anne Sushko offered to help with this training and we will get some hands on practice at the ride-a-test clinic on Saturday.
- Musical Freestyle clinic. Saturday night. Tammy Lisi will include choosing out music with horses there to see the music.
 Contact Tammy Lisi if you want to bring your horse. She will also cover rules and tests for freestyles and pas des deux.
 She is bringing copies of the test requirements and cover through training levels. Our club allows intro and training at schooling shows. These are not allowed at recognized shows. She will also cover tips for searching on line for music. If there is an interest in more musical freestyle information there will be a clinic at Tammy Lisi's barn for a more focused clinic.

Iowa Dressage Classics I &II

All contracts are signed except Jimmy and Anne's and they are on the way. Gloria to hire EMT, Farrier, and Vet. A checklist is being created to assist with future shows. Need to talk to Libby about the IaDCTA umbrella. No charge for the club members to vend under our umbrella. Show bills are approved.

Photographer is not yet hired.

Recognition fees have been received from MLEC, Winds Reach, and Tamarac Stables and will have their shows added to our show calendar.

Warm Up to the Classics

We will have Nena on standby for a second judge. Contract with MLEC is signed. We need a manger for this show.

Pre-Classic schooling show – Rebecca O'Bea will be coming to judge and is willing to come early if needed.

<u>March schooling show and ride a test</u>. Everything is on target for the show, but we need more vendors. Volunteer committee has filled the show for March. Stacey will log the volunteer hours.

Championship and schooling show in October. Contracts for judges are signed except Sarah H.

At all competitions and events, IaDCTA follows the following USDF Statement on Animal Welfare:

USDF Statement on Animal Welfare

The United States Dressage Federation, Inc. (USDF), a federation of 125 independent organizations throughout the United States with a membership in excess of 30,000 members, supports the concept of ethical treatment of animals.

Dressage is a classical method of training horses, based upon the horse's natural responses, as carried out in a gradual, planned program during which the horse's athletic abilities are improved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable, and responsive in partnership with the rider without the use of force. Dressage competition at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired harmony between horse and rider has been achieved.

The rules pertaining to dressage competition prohibit the use of artificial appliances, training aids, and drugs, which would force the horse to submit. Instead, the emphasis is upon training and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or harshness displayed.

Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature state, dressage training is usually not seriously begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the horse's life.

While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc., also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.


As an educational organization, USDF has numerous programs, which teach people how to pursue the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the horse's welfare in pursuit of dressage training.



arrie walks out to the barn, grabs a halter and goes out to the pasture to catch Dobbin. He looks up when he sees her coming and allows himself to be caught. She gives him a cookie, and they go into the barn cheerfully together. She grooms him while he stands quietly. She picks up and cleans each of his feet, puts the saddle on and tightens up the girth, bridles him and heads to the riding arena for her lesson.

Carrie walks Dobbin into the ring. She likes her riding lessons, but she has to admit that it sometimes makes her a little nervous. She wants to impress her instructor and friends with her riding skill. Carrie and Dobbin start out well, but run into a few issues in the lesson – Dobbin goes a little too slow at times and Carrie would like him to stay on the rail more. After some struggle, she turns to her instructor and frustratedly exclaims, "He just doesn't want to work with me! He's just being a brat!"

Time out. Let's rewind, and experience the same scenario from the horse's perspective: Dobbin: I'm out in the pasture on a sunny day with a group of horses I like. I enjoy my time out here. I only get about 8 hours a day to roam in the pasture. The other 16 hours of the day I am in a box in the barn. At least at this barn I can see other horses from my box. At the other barn I lived in, the box walls went to the ceiling. I couldn't see other horses and I felt alone all night.

Oh, here comes Carrie. She always has a cookie and a kind word for me. Sure, put my halter on and let's go in. I hope I can get back out here before we all have to come in to the boxes. I like being groomed. I like how she thoughtfully sets the saddle on my back and gently but firmly tightens my girth.

When she puts my bridle on, she is careful not to bump my teeth and takes a moment to make sure the bridle straps are not over my eyes or squishing an ear. It still is kind of disconcerting to have metal in my mouth with straps attached to it and a person holding them able to pull on them any time.


Now we are going into the arena. Carrie is a little nervous now and I don't know why. Did I do something wrong? Now she is putting me through my paces and I am doing as I'm told. And that is all I get, commands. I am doing everything I know. I sure could use a "Good Man, Dobbin," here or there. Even a reassuring pat on the shoulder would help me know I am doing fine and that it isn't me that is making her nervous.

All the commands and no positive feedback make me want to just be done, so I go slowly and try to go to the center of the ring. Now she is talking to the lady in the middle of the ring and Carrie seems mad. I don't like this. I want to go away from here. I start to look around for my friends.

Carrie's and Dobbin's experiences of the same moments in time are quite different. While Carrie perceived that Dobbin had the power to be uncooperative for no reason, the fact of the matter is that if Dobbin wasn't fundamentally cooperative, she'd have never been able to halter him, lead him in, pick up his feet or saddle and bridle him. He let her put metal in his mouth, knowing full well she would pull on it. Finally, if he was truly uncooperative, she'd have been airborne off his back in less than 8 seconds if rodeo bronc riders are any indication.

Attitude is indeed everything. Though the details of our paths in learning to ride are unique to each of us, development of riding follows the same pattern, as shown in the Equitation Pyramid:



The rider's attitude toward the horse is the most fundamental level of the Equitation Pyramid. The rider's attitude toward the horse colors every interaction between the pair. Is the rider empathetic to the horse's mindset as a prey animal, and therefore mitigating tension, or is she fearful, tight and controlling because the horse could "bolt for no reason at any minute"? Does the rider strive to relax the horse or is the rider vested in attempting to dominate the horse? The dominating rider creates another thing for the horse to fear. The empathetic rider creates a safe haven for the horse to access in times of fear or uncertainty.

Would Carrie's horse have turned to her for confidence if a tractor suddenly drove into the arena during her lesson? Would a rider rather have herself or her horse make decisions about what is the best course of action when the chips are down? If horse and rider are communicating as a matter of course, continuing that communication connection when the chips are down is a natural development.

How does a rider create this safe haven of security for the horse, (which has the additional consequence of creating a safer rider)? The first step is the rider's attitude toward the horse - perceiving the relationship as a two-way partnership based on communication.

Our role as riders is to create a clear set of expectations for the horse and then to acknowledge good performance, while for the most part ignoring incorrect performance. Praise is gratitude in action, and for horses, attitude is everything.


