

Meeting called to Order @ 6:49 p.m. on April 21, 2011.

**Review of Minutes** from March. Motion to approve the March minutes was made by Gloria, seconded by Dawn, and all were in favor.

**Treasurer's Report:** Total Income - \$1,198.00; Total Expenses - \$2,032.49; Ending Working Balance - \$4,651.68; Total Reserves - \$6,795.97; Total Bank Balance - \$11,447.65. Motion to approve the report was made by Vicki, seconded by Sherie, and all were in favor.

President's Report: Will be covered under committee reports.

#### **Old & New Business By Committee:**

\*Education Committee – presented by Vicki Gatter: Show management training set for Saturday at 11:30. Eight attendees with some people coming from eastern Iowa. Need to bring flash drive for tests. Beth Spring of KCDS inquired as to our club hosting part III of the L program. This would involve a lot of arrangements being made for 10 participant riders. Benefit to club would be good visibility with USDF, but Board agreed they are not ready to host this type of event, especially with the Classics just around the corner. Vicki is thinking of having Dave Siemens give a lecture on horse anatomy.

#### \*Competition & Awards Committee:

Iowa Dressage Classics - presented by Laird Nossuli. Things are moving along smoothly. Planning on concierge tent and Sherie's trailer for awards. Show office will be for show secretary only. Judges' stands will be done for Classics but not Warm Up. Discussion regarding competitor's party. More of a service than a social outing. Possibility of doing a breakfast Saturday morning instead of dinner Saturday night. Gloria has a food cart to use to deliver breakfast to the stable area. Laird & Gloria will contact MLEC to try to work with their concessions regarding the breakfast.

Schooling Show Competitions for 2011—presented by Gloria — Warm Up: IaDCTA members will not pay vendor fees but will pay stall fee if want to sell items at May 7 show. Will have a concierge tent (10x10 tent w/table & 6 chairs) with year-end awards on display. Gates will open at noon on Friday, May 6. Stana is day-of show manager with Dawn day -of secretary. Stana says everything looks in order. Anne will do stall assignments and Stana will post on stalls. Need parking signs. Laird looked into black and white outdoor signs, and they are \$70/sign. Will be able to use at any location. Missy Fladland knows how to set up arena, and Missy, Marcia & Mona are practicing arena set up and will mark arena so it is easy to put together. Sherie is taking care of raffle for helmet for Coester grant. \$5/each or 5/\$20.

July 9 & 10 show: July 9 show at Middle River. Robin will do jump course. Melinda from MLEC will judge. July 10 at West Winds. There will be "valet" parking so we can fit as many trailers in Mona's parking lot as possible. Still working on a judge. Trying to get "r" or "R" before going with an "L". Will be offering horse portraits. Volunteers needed for concessions.

October show: Fun show with a ride 2 classes get the equitation class for free. Possibility of doing this in July too. Free equitation classes will count towards year-end awards for eq. classes. Will need volunteers for concessions.

Series Championship Show – presented by Rachel Wehrheim via e-mail and telephone. Everything moving along smoothly. Rachel will pursue The Tack Room regarding sponsorship.

Awards for 2011 — presented by Sherie & Heather. Discussion regarding if we pin high point for each division for the Classics. Board decided they will pin each division for high point. Will need to order ribbons for Classics. Good on regular ribbons at least through July. Possibility of offering money for jumping classes at championship show. Heather will try to put together a ribbon holder for Classics.

\*<u>Sponsorship & Fundraising Committee</u> – Presented by Laird & Marcia. Offering sponsorship package this year with two shows for the price of one. Needing names of businesses to solicit from members along with barns in the area.


formation on overall show fying different show attendees each ride. Recordkeeping, and prioritizing your duties according to each. Excellent customer service begins well before actual show day. The best preparation involves planning, organization, confirming and reconfirming. One recommendation is having a list of people you can call for help as situations arise.

After discussing show management, Anne covered the duties of Show Secretary. Again, duties begin before show day, continue while entry forms are received, proceed with scoring throughout show day, and finally wind down with reports after show's end. Fox Village Dressage software allows you to

track many different entities for each show – from horse to rider to class to scores for generation of pre-defined reports, and exporting data to Excel are just a few benefits of using the software.

We all benefited from Anne's willingness to share her knowledge and her manner, happy to answer any questions. The biggest benefit though, is that we get to claim Anne as a member! The next time you see her in the show office, be sure to thank her for doing such a great job for us!! It is always nice to be thanked!

#### MARI ZDUNIC CLINIC, BY STEPHANIE VISSER

Ari Monda Zdunic is owner and trainer of Shine-A-Bit farms in Michigan and South Dakota. Shine-A-Bit farms was founded by Mr. Chuck Grant in 1950. Mr. Grant began training horses in 1934 when he was stationed with the 122<sup>nd</sup> Field Artillery of the US Army. At that time, there were no civilians in dressage in America. Mr. Grant judged the first civilian dressage show held in the United States in 1948, in Morton Grove, Illinois.

In the 1950s he founded his farm in the Detroit area where he trained 17 horses to the Grand Prix level, a feat never accomplished by any other American. All of these horses were shown in recognized shows, and ten of them were shown in national trials. In addition, Mr. Grant was a founding member of the USDF. Throughout his life, he stressed the importance of teaching Americans to train American horses in hopes of one day fielding an American dressage team with American horses. Mari was an associate of Mr. Grant's for 14 years. Since Chuck Grant's death in 1990, she has continued his work at Shine-A-Bit Farm. Since then Mari has earned the USDF bronze, silver and gold rider medals, has ridden on three Olympic Sports Festival teams for the US, and won Bronze and Silver Team Medals, as well as winning numerous regional and national awards at all levels in dressage. She has trained 18 different breeds of horses and has earned 3 USDF Horse of the Year Awards. She has competed with 14 horses at the Grand Prix level. Mari also has shown the first Grand Prix Arabian, Appaloosa, Connemara and Paint horse in North America.

In 1987 I met Mr. Chuck Grant at the Andalusian/Lippizan National Champion Show that was held at the Kentucky Horse Park where I was working as a groom for dressage trainer, Lynne Williams. Lynne took a lesson with Mr. Grant on the Iberian mare that we had brought to the show. We were instantly hooked on his methods and ideas. I was excited to buy his books on American Dressage and Haute Ecole, which he inscribed to me. I have read and reread these books through the years excited to teach my Quarter Horses what I learned. Mr. Grant told me to "Study hard. Learn theory. Then ride as much as you can." Over the years I had lost track of Chuck Grant and Mari Monda Zdunic so imagine my excitement when I heard that she gives clinics at Wildwood Hills Ranch in St. Charles, Iowa. What? How did I not know this before last year?

My first introduction was at a clinic in March of 2009. PJ Koehler told me about her clinic, and I new I wanted to be there. I wasn't able to ride, but I could soak in a lot through auditing I knew. I came straight from a Saddlebred show at Jester Park. That was quite a change. The air at Jester Park was intense and fast paced. The air at Wildwood was like walking into a monastery in Tibet or a cathedral. All the horses were calm and happy and the riders were equally calm. Mari will train anyone to ride better. But the thing that really strikes me when listening to her teach is she is very funny.

I attended another clinic as an auditor, but then was able to ride my Andalusian pal, Cazador, with her in March of this year. I was so excited. My horse is 17 years old, which has concerned me. We purchased him in-utero, so he has become a lifelong friend. One of my main concerns with Caz is to keep him healthy and strong for

another 17 years. Mari has experience with several Andalusian horses and assured me that they live 30 plus years. So let us teach him and me to keep him supple and his joints working well. We worked on relaxation and walking.

We did most of our lessons in walk. She explained that at the walk we can really increase his strength and mine, especially over his back and underline by using what she calls "tai chi walk". This is a very slow, collected walk where the horse is lifting his back and his feet but the speed is very slow. We can only do this for a few minutes at a time or else the horse will get sore. We continued on to work on a very slow trot. My horse is all over slow work for 5 minutes and then stopping for a reward for a few minutes or even better, getting off the horses back. My biggest challenge with Caz is his anxiety, so practicing "horse yoga" is really great for him. I have used the "de -escalating" techniques that she helped me with, and Caz really responds to this.

After about 20 minutes we then started working on half pass at the walk and slow trot. We worked on slow easy canter departs from the walk, then threw in some pole bending. Throughout the lessons, she stops and shares antidotes from her life with horses and Chuck Grant. A great time was had by all. We are already anticipating her next trip in June and working on our homework that she gave us. I am dreaming of attending one of her clinics over the winter advertised as "Dressage at the Beach" in Texas. There we can "learn secrets of how to relax your horse to get a soft ride and suppleness as well as longevity of your horse. My unique combination of classical, haute ecole training techniques combined with the inspirational environment of South Padre Island will guarantee progress and growth of your skill level." Private lessons on the beach along with group tai chi and belly dancing. Wow. Ladies, can you say road trip?

Mari's unique approach to life and training horses might not be for everyone. But as for me and my equine partner, we are inspired.

Yvonne has a way of making the rider and horse trust that all will go well, as long as you obey her instructions. Indeed all did go well! My sometimes fearful, sometimes social horse, rose to the



occasion. Yvonne helped me to ride every step and to remember to look at the big picture, to let my horse relax and to enjoy this time. She helped me work on exercises that would help me set up my horse for walk pirouettes and for accordion trot steps in leg yield.

After the ride on Saturday, Yvonne came by to invite me to come and train with her in Chicago at her dressage center. So I went to train with her all last week. It was an outstanding week in every way, and I felt especially welcomed by all the staff and the other boarders. The "take home"—*ride the hind leg and shoulder in with confidence and determination.*

### EDUCATION COMMITTEE NEWS

#### "L" IS FOR LEARNING-PART 3, BY LORI EMERY

Once again, I'd like to thank the KC Dressage Society for sponsoring the L program. What an opportunity it was to audit such an educational clinic. Of course, the demo riders were the real heroes of the weekend for allowing 20-30 people to candidly critique them and their horses. But, our instructor, Marilyn Heath, was outstanding. She took a mass amount of information regarding the least understood section of the test sheets and organized it into easy-to-follow lessons. As in the previous clinics, the participants were encouraged to approach judging from this point of view: your comments are intended to be *constructive* criticism that will guide the rider up the level, and it is of primary importance to recognize and reward what is well done in a test, not to just find the problems. With this in mind, the collective remarks are the judge's opportunity to send a message to the rider; it is the frame around the picture of the test.

The first three sections of the "collectives" are probably the most familiar. This year's tests changed, and gaits are no longer emphasized with a coefficient, thus not overly rewarding a horse's athletic ability. But, submission and impulsion are emphasized with a coefficient of 2. Briefly,

- Gaits: the freedom, regularity, and purity of the walk, trot, and canter;
- Impulsion: the willingness to go forward (or through) with the correct use of the topline and with thrust. (How far underneath do a horse's hind feet step? Are they uphill and light on the forehand, according to the purpose of the level?); and
- Submission: obedience and willingness. This includes: freedom from anxiety and tension, attention to rider, prompt response to aids, acceptance of the bridle.

What may be confusing to those headed for the show ring are the rider's scores: Rider position/seat, effect of the aides, and harmony. What do these mean?

- Rider's Position: How close does the rider's position and seat come to the ideal dressage position?
- Effect of the Aides: If rider is sitting pretty, how wonderful! But, is the rider getting the job done? How was the geometry? How was the bend? With what kind of precision was the test ridden?
- Harmony: Do the horse and rider make a good picture? Do they appear to cooperate as a team? Does the test flow with ease? *Continued on page 15.*

### EDUCATION COMMITTEE NEWS CONT.

The collectives are potentially linked. For instance, harmony and submission affect each other, e.g., without submission, no harmony exists.

But, the important lesson from Session C was that the *whole* test is interlinked. If your scores are all falling in the 5-6 range throughout the test, the collectives *must reflect* that, they can't be significantly higher or lower. Also, it is in the collectives that the judge may make a statement. In the scores, it may read as:

## Gaits 8; Impulsion 8; Submission 6; Rider 6, 6, 6

This could be interpreted as a good horse with regular paces and good impulsion but problems with rideability and understanding between horse and rider.



Or

#### Gaits 6; Impulsion 6; Submission 7; Rider 7, 7, 8

Which could be interpreted as a horse with limited paces but is very obedient, and the horse and rider did show a harmonious cooperation.

It is impossible in this humble article to include the vast amount of information we soaked up over the weekend. Obviously, regarding scoring a test, it is rather complicated. But, why would the L Level program have been great for every dressage enthusiast to attend show ring bound or not? Because as Marilyn Heath so aptly pointed out, the tests are intended to be a training tool to progress up the levels. To ride each test well with precision and harmony; with relaxation and energy; correctly and precisely, develops the horse and the rider classically. In dressage, to quote Marilyn, "We are always for the horse."

And, Thank You to all of you judges. I never appreciated your commitment or the difficult job you perform. Riders, in the future, consider participating in these opportunities. Without a doubt, I am a better trainer, instructor, and competitor after attending the "L" program.

### PRESIDENT'S CORNER

We elcome to May! As always, May is the time of year when we can (almost) say that we survived the Iowa winter. May marks the start of a very busy spring, summer and fall for IaDCTA. With the exception of the Nebraska Dressage Association schooling show that was held in early April, May is also marks the beginning of the IaDCTA-Recognized Show Series. On May 7, we will be hosting and managing the "Warm Up to the Classics" dressage schooling show at Maffitt Lake Equestrian Center.
