Review of Minutes: No board meeting last month due to members traveling. No minutes reviewed.

Treasurer's Report: Presented by Pat F. Total Income: \$1,380.00. Total Expenses: \$3,125.39. Ending Working Balance: \$7,169.23. Total Reserves: \$6,760.97. Total Bank Balance: \$13,930.20. Motion to Approve Treasurer's Report- PJ K.; 2nd by-Vicki G.; All in favor.

Old Business: *2010 Classics- Final Budget Review: Total Income - \$30,344.50; Total Expenses - \$27,404.02. Made \$2,940.48 on the Classics. Way to go us!

*2010 Schooling Show Series-

- -Championship Show: As of the 21st, there are 35 entries. Expecting close to 40 more. Might possibly need to add a second arena but would keep the championship classes in the indoor. Kirkwood has bought some really nice jumps. Sponsorship/ advertising: Rachel is going to be on a couple of radio stations. The program is about 26 pages. Everything is good and ready for the vendors. Still in need of a couple volunteers, including some key people on Sunday. Things are coming along really smoothly and thank you to Rachel who has gone above and beyond.
- -Year End Award Issues- The board has changed the percentage for the FEI tests. There has also been a clear up on the issue of what shows count for volunteer hours and what shows do not. The club will also really encourage new members and old members to renew and become members at the championship show.

New Business: *2011 Classics- definitely going to hire Anne Cizadlo and her husband, Jimmy, to run the Classics. They are giving the club a great deal and are very well known and well respected in the dressage community. The club is on track with the USDF Recognized Show Checklist. Going to have an IaDCTA Board Workday sometime in November to work on ways to get sponsors and how to present to businesses.

*Betsy Coester Grant Application- Alex Porter has requested a Betsy Coester Grant for her riding in a clinic given by Conrad Schumacher. Alex said any assistance would be appreciated. Each ride is \$250.00, and Alex is riding 2 days. Gloria 0. motioned that IaDCTA give Alex \$100 per ride, so a total of \$200. 2nd by Heather M. All in Favor. IaDCTA is really excited to support our young riders.

*2011 General Planning

- -Sponsorship/ Fundraising: New Approach Needed. Asking for package deal for the year to include the Classics, Championship Show, and Schooling Show Series. Possibly ask the other members at the annual meeting what they think would be a good approach. Start brainstorming ideas for the next meeting or at a work day. Create a product/service directory for laDCTA.
- -Schooling Show: Last weekend in March will be a schooling show/event at IEC to kick off the show series. Maybe include a volunteer clinic, show members what is required in each position at every show.
- -Work Day: Board decided that all things like, sponsorship/fundraising, 2011 schooling show series dates, volunteer recruitment and retention, and future member handbook items really need to all be worked out in a whole day. Looking at a date in November, either a Saturday or Sunday, for an IaDCTA Board work day.

Meeting adjourned at 8:58 p.m. Motion to adjourn meeting by PJ K.; 2nd by Vicki G.; All in Favor.




2010 ALLTECH WORLD EQUESTRIAN GAMES.

A SIMPLE STATEMENT

I ride. That seems like such a simple statement. However as many women who ride know, it is really a complicated matter. It has to do with power and empowerment. Being able to do things you might have once considered out of reach or ability. I have considered this as I shovel manure, fill water barrels in the cold rain, wait for the vet/farrier/electrician/hay delivery, change a tire on a horse trailer by the side of the freeway, or cool a gelding out before getting down to the business of drinking a cold beer after a long ride.

The time, the money, the effort it takes to ride calls for dedication. At least I call it dedication. Both my exhusbands call it 'the sickness'. It's a sickness I've had since I was a small girl bouncing my model horses and dreaming of the day I would ride a real horse. Most of the women I ride with understand the meaning of 'the sickness'. It's not a sport. It's not a hobby. It's what we do and, in some ways, who we are as women and human beings.

I ride. I hook up my trailer and load my gelding. I haul to some trailhead somewhere, unload, saddle, whistle up my dog and I ride. I breathe in the air, watch the sunlight filter through the trees and savor the movement of my horse. My shoulders relax. A smile rides my sunscreen smeared face. I pull my ball cap down and let the real world fade into the tracks my horse leaves in the dust.

Time slows. Flying insects buzz loudly, looking like fairies. My gelding flicks his ears and moves down the trail. I can smell his sweat and it is perfume to my senses. Time slows. The rhythm of the walk and the movement of the leaves become my focus. My saddle creaks and the leather rein in my hand softens with the warmth.

I consider the simple statement; I ride. I think of all I do because I ride. Climb granite slabs, wade into a freezing lake, race a friend through the manzanita all the while laughing and feeling my heart in my chest. Other days just the act of mounting and dismounting can be a real accomplishment. Still I ride, no matter how tired or how much my seat bones or any of the numerous horse related injuries hurt. I ride. And I feel better for doing so.

The beauty I've seen because I ride amazes me. I've ridden out to find lakes that remain for the most part, un-

seen. Caves, dark and cold beside rivers full and rolling are the scenes I see in my dreams. The Granite Stairway at Echo Summit, bald eagles on the wing and bobcats on the prowl add to the empowerment and joy in my heart. I think of the people, mostly women, I've met. I consider how competent they all are. Not a weenie amongst the bunch. We haul 40ft rigs, we back into tight spaces without clipping a tree. We set up camp. Tend the horses. We cook and keep safe. We understand and love our companions, the horse. We respect each other and those we encounter on the trail. We know that if you are out there riding, you also shovel, fill, wait and doctor. Your hands are a little rough and you travel without makeup or hair gel. You do without to afford the 'sickness' and probably, when you were a small girl, you bounced a model horse while you dreamed of riding a real one.

- Rider must include three scores from at least two different USDF Recognized shows and two different judges. At least one score must be from the highest test of the level.
- 3. It is the responsibility of the rider to submit the scores with a copy of the front page of the test showing the test % score. A printout of the official scores from the USDF website is acceptable.
- 4. Rider must be an IaDCTA member and the Rider and Horse must be nominated for scores to count.
- 5. Volunteer hours are required for each horse/rider combination.

GOLD • SILVER • BRONZE MEDAL Qualified Rider Award Application

- 1. May be earned over one or more years of competition.
- 2. Must include scores from at least two different IaDCTA-Recognized shows.
- 3. Will be awarded for the following achievements:
 - a. **Bronze Medal** for three (3) scores of 55% to 59.99% at a given level.
 - b. **Silver Medal** for three (3) scores of 60% to 64.99% at a given level.
 - c. **Gold Medal** for three (3) scores of 65% or better at a given level.
- 4. Scores may be earned on one or more horses.
- 5. After receiving the highest Rider Award at a given level, a rider is no longer eligible to earn a Medal at that level.
- 6. It is the responsibility of the rider to apply for a rider award by using this IaDCTA Qualified Rider Award Application form.
- 7. Rider must be an IaDCTA member and the Rider and Horse must be nominated for scores to count.
- 8. This Rider Awards program is effective starting January 1, 1998 and is not retroactive.
