As of December 31st, our lodge has generated \$30,847 in men's and women's clothing, books, meals, athletic equipment, travel and lodging assistance, as well as miscellaneous (small travel size) toiletries for the Southern Arizona VA Health Care.

We report our collection results using our Elks April 1st through March 31st calendar year. The Veterans's committee has set a goal of \$50,000 in donations for the 2017 - 2018 year. With three months remaining we would like to ask our members to look through their closets for clothes that they no longer need/use and lets see if we can hit that \$50,000 goal! As a reminder, warm clothing is specially needed at this time of year. Backpacks, underwear and socks are always in demand.

Our next collection date is Wednesday, January 10th at 1 PM on the back patio.

In the back of the parking lot, close to the dumpster, you will see our Vets POD. You may drop off all your vet donations in that unit. There will not be a lock on the door so any time the lot is open you may easily roll the door up and down when making your donation. We would like to remind all of our holiday travelers, staying at motels while on their journeys, to bring in all their unused mini toiletries for our homeless veterans.

Janet Casacchia is the Arizona Elks Association First Lady and her project for the year is "Undies for the Veterans". Janet asked for all lodges to bring new underwear, socks, and t- shirts for our veterans to our October 2017 and May 2018 meetings. I'm happy to report that your lodge brought 235 undershorts as well as 9 t-shirts to our October meeting! Thank you to all who helped us in this very worthwhile clothing drive!

We will continue, throughout the remainder of our Elk year, to collect underwear, t-shirts and socks for our veterans for our May meeting.

I have to admit, our next contribution to a section of the Southern Arizona was a total unknown entity to me. Right in the middle of the Federal VA grounds the Arizona Veterans Home exists. The buildings are staffed by Arizona employees and one wing of the facility is sponsored by the Elks! Four of us, Jack, Gail, Joyce and Bob toured the buildings and we were thoroughly impressed with the facility and personal.


Catalina Mountain Sponsors Hoop Shoot






