I would like to thank all of our members who have sent in their annual dues. I apologize for our flub on **not** sending out all of our annual renewal notices. At the present I believe the number of people who have not paid their dues is right around 60. For your convenience, our lodge is now set up to use credit cards to help you pay your dues. You may call Robin Danielson or Alane Asp at 520-825-0893 to make your payment over the phone if you wish.

In May I spent three days at our state Elks convention in Tempe, Arizona. Our new Arizona Elks Association President is Mike Murphy, out of

the Tempe lodge.

Our lodge contributed \$918 in the Exalted Ruler march for Major Projects. Between the march proceeds and other collections, made during the day, we collected over \$100,000 for Arizona Major Projects. Our association also presented a check for \$225,000 to Dr Ghishan, Director, UA Steel Children's Research Center. This represents the first half of our annual donation of \$450,000.

Our Arizona Elks Association selected, in 1992, the UA Steele Children's Research Center as beneficiary of Major Projects funding efforts. The State Elks Association reached a major milestone in 2017 of \$7 million in contributions and committed to funding the Arizona Elks Endowed Faculty Research for Technology & Innovation.

I'm happy to say Lisa Chavez has committed to be the chairman of our Major Projects Committee. I have had a few conversations with Lisa about her ideas on fundraising and she has some interesting ideas for our lodge.

June 14th is Flag Day and I'm happy to say Larry Meghan, and Jim Cox are planning something very interesting. Please come and join us at 10 AM on June 14th and see what these two have come up with.

Our lodge conducted its annual Youth Activities luncheon on May 6th. Gloria Cisneros, Lisa Chavez, Roger Mastro, Larry Wittenborn and Al Peterson presented certificates of recognition for all our winning recipients. A big thank you needs to go out to our volunteer support staff who helped make our luncheon a big success!

We conducted our annual Mother's Day ceremony on May 13th. Although attendance was down the ceremony was a wonderful tribute to those women who played such a big part in our lives.

Without straightening out our delayed membership renewals I'm not able to give you a report on our membership drive but I hope to be able to do so by July.

He worked hard just to get around, and just sat on the side and watched when the other children played. The teachers said he had survived Polio. Thanks to some great research by Jonas Salk, polio has been eliminated in the United States and 99% of the rest of the World. But there are still children who must sit on the side and watch because of medical issues.

At the UA Steele Children's Research Center Physicians and Researchers are working hard to eliminate Juvenile Diabetes, Pediatric Cancer, Crohns Disease and a host of other Autoimmune conditions that complicate and threaten the lives of children. How much longer will children have to wait, and watch. Research takes money. Office space, equipment, researchers, computers, the list is endless.

If every Elk in Arizona gave just \$10 per month, we could provide over \$2.5 million dollars every year. That would increase our annual gift by \$2 dollars million per year. 




